Jokester Treadwell combines laughs with expert bridge

When Dave Treadwell took up bridge, the game that ACBL members play today -- contract -- was virtually unknown. In fact, it had been invented only about two years earlier. Treadwell, a 15-year-old at the time, learned to play auction bridge, which long ago became obsolete.

Seventy years later, the 84-year-old Grand Life Master is known and loved by just about every regular at NABCs, as much for his bad jokes and the twinkle in his eye as for his expert card play.

The Wilmington DE resident is a two-time North American champion and No. 20 on the all-time list of masterpoint holders with more than 20,000. He is perennially on the *Barry Crane Top 500* list, and he hasn't missed an NABC since 1966. Count the big tournaments he attended before that and he's hit well over 100.

Not only that, he can go all night with the jokes. "For 30 years," Treadwell says, "my daughter has called me Corn for my corny jokes."

He doesn't mind. It's part and parcel of his character, and it's great fun to hear him tell one of his stories because he enjoys them so much. He laughs as hard as anyone.

Bridge Bucks rebates for Fast Pairs players

The Fast Pairs finished faster than usual, thanks to that errant lightning bolt. The second session was curtailed after only six boards had been played. As a result the overall standings were computed by combining the first session with the six boards played in the second.

This of course means that effectively the Fast Pairs players got only a little more than one session for their two-session entry fee. Therefore all players in that event now will be given 10 Bridge Bucks to use as they wish -- for a later event at this tournament or whatever.

The players should go to the Check Cashing Booth on the lower level of the Convention Center where they will be given their Bridge Bucks.

About those six boards. Within each section this would have amounted to a top of two on a board. What was done to make up for this is that the boards were scored across the field to make the results more meaningful.

Garner, Weinstein capture LM Pairs

Steve Garner and Howard Weinstein, dusting off a partnership that dates back more than a decade, put together two solid sessions in the final of the Life Master Pairs to win the event by nearly a full board.

In yet another close call in a major pair event, Geir Helgemo of Norway and Tony Forrester of Great Britain were second. They have been second or third in four straight North American pairs championships, dating back to the LM Pairs last year in Miami Beach.

Last year's winners, David Berkowitz and Larry Cohen, were third.

Garner, of Northbrook IL, and Weinstein, of Chicago, are options traders for the Chicago Board of Options.

The two have known each other since the Seventies. Both are originally from Minneapolis. Except for playing in this year's Cavendish Invitational tournament in Las Vegas, Garner and Weinstein haven't played for 10 or 15 years.

It was the first win for each in the LM Pairs. Weinstein was second two years running, in 1988 and 1989. He has also won the Vanderbilt Knockout Teams, the Grand National Teams and the Open Pairs I in Philadelphia last year.

Garner has two wins in the Grand National Teams and one in the North American Swiss Teams. He was also a member of the winning team in the International Team Trials in San Francisco last year. The squad represented the U.S. in the World Team Olympiad in Rhodes, Greece.

Garner and Weinstein took the lead after the first final session and posted a 59.97% game in the evening session to finish with 1268.14 to 1231.75 for the run-

Lightning bolt blackens area, shortens 2 games

Some folks were trapped in elevators. Some found themselves in pitch blackness in the walkway between the Doubletree and the Convention Center. Some were in the middle of the sixth board in the second session of the Fast Pairs. Some were getting ready to play their eighth match in the second session of the Senior Swiss Teams. Most had finished the afternoon session and were headed for dinner.

And then once again Mother Nature struck. A lightning bolt hit a major transformer and a two-square-mile area of downtown Albuquerque was suddenly without electricity. The bolt hit at about 5 o'clock, and there was no power in most of the area for the next two hours. Power was restored at the Convention Center at 6:55.

It's not the first time something like this has happened. We suffered a couple of reasonably strong earthquakes during the Anaheim NABC. There was a power failure that stranded many elevator passengers during one of the St. Louis NABCs. A bomb threat curtailed an evening session during a Pasadena NABC. Things happen.

One way or another, we always cope.

Several elevators at the Doubletree were stuck between floors. Beverly Aranda, Andrew Robinson and an engineer named Doug -- don't know his last name -- members of the Doubletree staff, immediately went to work. They opened the door to the elevator shafts, looked to see where the elevators were, then climbed the stairs. They pried open the doors and helped the passengers climb out -- it took less than 20 minutes.

Tournament Director Roger Putnam was lucky -- his elevator had just stopped at the 10th floor to pick up

Nickell team goes for fifth Spingold

The only six-man team ever to win the Spingold Knockout Teams four years running will try to make it five in a row here at the Summer NABC.

Trying for the record-breaking achievement will be Nick Nickell, Raleigh NC; Richard Freeman, Atlanta; Jeff Meckstroth, Tampa; Eric Rodwell, Naperville IL, and Bob Hamman and Bobby Wolff, Dallas.

They won the Spingold in Washington DC in 1993, San Diego in 1994, New Orleans in 1995 and Miami Beach last summer.

1995 was a banner year for the team as they scored their third straight victories in the Spingold and the Reisinger and also won the Bermuda Bowl in Beijing, China.

NICKELL is the only six-man squad to win back-to-back Spingolds, according to the *Official Encyclopedia of Bridge*.

The only four-man team to accomplish this feat -- Canada's all-time greats Eric Murray, Sami Kehela, Bruce Elliott and Percy Sheardown -- won in Toronto in 1964 and Chicago in 1965.

C.C. Wei's original Precision Team came close in 1970-71. Tom Smith, Steve Altman, Joel Stuart and Peter Weichsel won with David Strasberg in Boston in 1970. With Gene Neiger replacing Strasberg, they took

Like all competitive games, bridge is a game where expert players will take full advantage of opponents' errors. Here's an interesting example from Board 16 of the Saturday evening pairs.

South's splinter of 4♦ was obviously an overbid, and it suffered dire consequences. It not only propelled North-South to the five level needlessly, but it gave West (Jim Bachelder of Columbus OH) the opportunity to double, showing diamond strength.

Now it was easy for Eddie Rose of Laguna Niguel CA, East, to find the killing underlead of the ♦A-Q. Jim's return of the ♣J set the contract for virtually all the matchpoints.

Note that South has several options over 2♦, but it appears that 4♥ is the only safe harbor. Any bid under 4♥ enables East to make a Rosenkranz-type double or a double of a cuebid showing a high diamond honor. In the absence of such information, the best East-West can do is to cash their minor-suit aces. If East makes a passive trump lead instead -- or if he leads a spade -- North-South will take 12 tricks, as was the case at many tables.

Computers seek human challengers

The organizers of the Baron Barclay World Computer Bridge Challenge are looking for humans to play for scrip and prizes. Sign up in the main playing area at the Convention Center for a session at 9 a.m. today or Wednesday.

On Wednesday between sessions, one player will have a chance to win an airline ticket donated by Liberty Travel and World Bridge Productions.

The Bridge Challenge, a weeklong series of computer matches and demonstrations, will kick off with two special IMP pairs game pitting humans against computers. Applicants should have 100-1000 masterpoints. There is no entry fee and masterpoints are available. The top several programs from the IMP Pairs game will enter a computer vs. computer challenge match beginning Thursday. The Championship Challenge Match may be seen on vugraph Friday evening.

Throughout the week there will be a Computer Fair between sessions. The latest in bridge software will be available for player inspection.

The Computer Fair will feature two computer contests -- the ACBL Computer Bidding Contest and the ACBL Computer Play Contest. Each event will allow the various software packages to showcase their skills for a variety of prizes. Kibitzers are welcome.



A pair of winkles

Adam Wildavsky, playing with Ralph Cohen, had the opportunity to execute two winkles in one session - and he got below average on both of them! The hands are boards 11 and 16 respectively from the first semifinal session of the Life Master Pairs. First Board 11.

That 3♣ bid is one of the strongest weak jump overcalls we've ever seen. West led the ♣A followed by the queen, ruffed. Wildavsky led to the ♦A and finessed the trump queen successfully. When he then crossed to the ♦Q, he learned a lot about the distribution -- not only did West not have any more diamonds -- he also didn't have any trumps since he didn't ruff. Declarer ruffed the last club and cashed the trump ace before leading a low diamond to ruff in dummy.

He put East in with the trump king, and East shifted to the ♥6, covered by the queen and king and won with the ace. When Wildavsky then led the ♥7 and East put up the 10, West was winkled. If he played low, East would be endplayed in diamonds. If he overtook, that would promote dummy's ♥9 to trick level.

But that was down one, and lots of North-Souths were getting pluses by beating 5♣. So Wildavsky and Cohen had to be satisfied with 21 matchpoints on a 90 top.

West led a club, ducked to the queen, and West won the club return and cleared the suit. Wildavsky led the ♥J, ducked, and followed with a heart to the queen. He noted the fall of the 10 and went after spades, leading the jack. West rose with the ace and cashed his good club. Then he got out with a spade.

At this point Wildavsky had his contract -- two spades, three hearts, a club and a diamond -- but he wanted more. He cashed his other spade and crossed to the ♦A. Then he led a diamond. If West had ducked, East, who had been forced to discard a diamond earlier, would have been endplayed into leading a heart away from his king. But West saw the position and rose with the king, swallowing East's queen like a crocodile. He cashed his spade, then was forced to give up a diamond, but that held Wildavsky to just his seven tricks. Many other defenders were not as astute, so Wildavsky and Cohen had to be satisfied with 20.5 matchpoints on a 90 top.

Smoking rules

If you wish to smoke, there is only one area inside the Albuquerque Convention Center that you may do so -- in the Northwest Exhibit Hall on the ground level. Otherwise you must go outside the Convention Center to smoke. By city ordinance, *smoking is not allowed in any other part of the Convention Center.*

Tough decision

You're playing in the Flight A Knockout Teams and you're faced with this dilemma:

Quite a bid, that 1♠ -- apparently West liked his distribution.

Maybe you wouldn't have jumped to 4NT on your first turn, but clearly the bid stands out -- you must take away as much room as possible from the opponents who almost certainly have a good fit in at least one of the majors.

Can the opponents make 5♥? It's just about impossible to tell -- you could easily have three defensive tricks. If you can't beat 5♥, then you might have a good save in one of the minors, despite the vulnerability. But then again what if the opponents can make six and your further bid drives them to a slam they wouldn't otherwise bid? So what do you do -- pass, double or bid 6♣? Perhaps the situation would have been clearer for South if North had been able to bid 5♦, but West's 5♥ blocked that avenue neatly.

At the table Ellen Siebert's team passed and weren't happy when 11 tricks came home for the opponents. Of course they immediately saw that they would go down only one at 6♦. But there's a happy ending for this was the auction at the other table:

When this was scored up, Siebert's team had gained 5 IMPs because the final contract was doubled.

Richard Schwartz of course tried the notrump game after the preempt, and he won the second spade. His first move was to cash a high diamond, and the fall of the queen added one trick to his total. But that total at this point was only six, plus a probable club trick or two.

Schwartz cashed his top diamonds and threw West in with the 10. A 10 doesn't seem all that rich, but it was here. West got out with a club, and Schwartz won with the king. He crossed to the ♥A and led a second club, won with the queen when West ducked. Now he had eight tricks.

Once again he led the suit where West had tricks -- a club. West was able to cash two clubs, but then was forced to lead away from his ♥Q. Schwartz ran this to his jack for his ninth trick and 86 matchpoints on a 90 top.

Fooled you!

George Rosenkranz got quite a kick out of Board 6 in the second semifinal session of the Life Master Pairs.

the championship in Chicago in 1971.

Jimmy Cayne, Chuck Burger, Hamman, Wolff, Mark Lair and Mike Passell won the Spingold in Chicago in 1989 and defended their title successfully in Boston in 1990, with Lew Stansby and Chip Martel replacing Lair-Passell.

Spingold trivia

- Louis H. Watson (*Watson's Play of the Hand at Contract Bridge*) was a member of the winning Spingold teams in 1932 and 1935.

- B. Jay Becker and son Michael are the only father-son combination to win the Spingold. Their victory came in 1972.

- Edith Freilich and Billy Seamon are the only sister and brother to win the Spingold. Their 1963 team included Russ Arnold, Harold Harkavy, Al Roth and Cliff Russell.

- Bob Hamman, Bobby Wolff and Howard Schenken won the Spingold 10 times. Hamman and Wolff will be shooting for a record 11th win here in Albuquerque.

- Helen Sobel won the Spingold five times, the first time in 1944 and the last time in 1960.

- The last woman in a Spingold final was Luella Slaner in 1983.

History of the Spingold

The Spingold Master Knockout Teams, first known as the Challenge Knockout Teams, was contested for the Asbury Park Trophy in the early days.

The runner-up team in the regularly scheduled portion of the event had the right to challenge the winners to a playoff. This right was never utilized.

In 1934, 1936 and 1937, the Masters Teams-of-Four and the Asbury Park Trophy were separate events, providing two sets of winners.

In 1938 the event became the Spingold Master Knockout Teams and a part of the Summer NABC.

At one time, the Spingold was a double elimination event usually lasting nine or 10 sessions. It was scored by International Match Points and was restricted to players with 100 or more masterpoints.

In 1965, the double elimination method was replaced by three qualifying sessions (subsequently reduced to two), followed by single elimination knockout matches. The preliminary qualifying sessions were dropped in 1970.

The Spingold Trophy, donated by Nathan Spingold in 1934, and the Vanderbilt Trophy, awarded to the winners of the Vanderbilt Knockout Teams at the Spring NABC, are ACBL's most highly prized trophies.

Spingold, a New York publicist, motion picture executive and patron of the arts, was one of the most influential men in bridge administration from 1937 to 1943.

He was instrumental in effecting a peaceful merger between the American Bridge League and the United States Bridge Association in 1937 and became president of the newly formed American Contract Bridge League the following year.

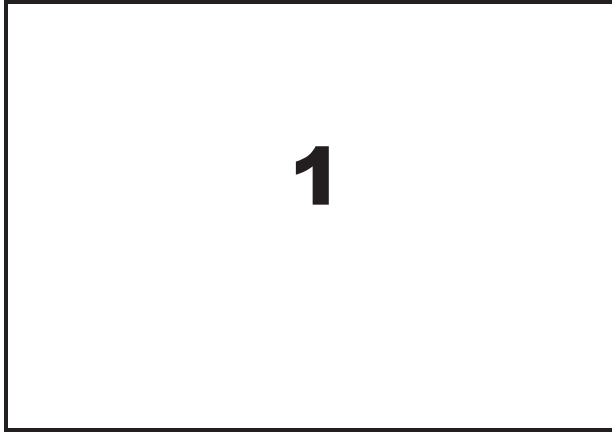

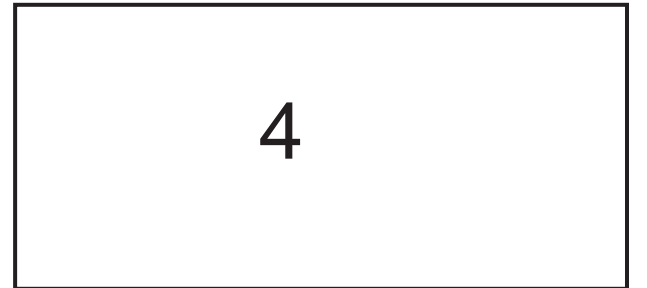

- Repeat winners in 1960 and 1961 were Roberta Erde, Sally Johnson, Barbara Kachmar and Bee Schenken.

The Wagar Trophy

The Wagar Trophy was designated by the ACBL Board of Directors in 1995 and honors Margaret Wagar of Atlanta (1902-1990), one of the all-time great women players.

Wagar became Life Master #37 in 1943, the fifth woman to earn the ranking. She and Kay Rhodes share one of the most remarkable achievements in ACBL history -- they won the Women's Pairs four consecutive years: 1955, 1956, 1957 and 1958.

Wagar and Rhodes share another record, one of frustration. They were second in the Women's Teams for seven consecutive years, 1952-1958.

Wagar's impressive record spans three decades and includes wins in women's and open competition:

- Women's Teams -- 1940, 1943, 1944, 1945, 1946, 1964 and 1965.

- Chicago (now the Reisinger) -- 1941.

- Spingold -- 1946 and 1948.

- Women's Pairs -- the "four-peat" with Rhodes plus 1944.

- Master Mixed Teams -- 1942, 1945, 1948, 1954 and 1964.

- Open Pairs -- 1947 and 1948.

- Mixed Pairs -- 1948 and 1949.

- Life Master Women's Pairs -- 1962.

Wagar served on the ACBL Board of Directors from 1960 to 1972 and was named *ACBL Honorary Member* in 1979. She was non-playing captain of the U.S. World Women's Teams in 1968 and 1972.

Winners and runners-up

Until 1976 the Women's Teams was a four-session event scored by Board-a-Match. It was contested as a three-session championship until 1972 and in 1975.

The Women's Teams was held at the Fall NABC until 1963. In 1976 the event became a Women's KO with Swiss qualifying.

Kibitzers, players: observe rules

The Spingold and Women's Knockout teams are the bridge equivalents of the Masters and LPGA golf tournaments -- and there are special rules for kibitzers and players alike.

When a round of the Spingold or Women's KO is played in one area, the room will be closed approximately 30 minutes after the segment begins. Kibitzers who leave will be permitted to re-enter at the start of the next segment.

When a round is played in two areas, there will be one room in which kibitzing is permitted and another to which entry is restricted to press and tournament officials.

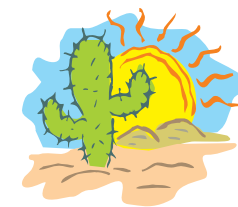
In either case, any kibitzer must select a table and remain at that table until the next segment starts. The exception is if that kibitzer acts as a player's escort.

Players are expected to:

1. Refrain from wandering about the playing room.
2. Leave the room only when escorted by an opponent, neutral kibitzer or tournament official.

Everyone is expected to be civil, courteous and cooperative at all times.

The result of all this is that the evening games started ON TIME -- and almost nobody was late!

There was the one about Lenny the Lobster and Sammy the Clam. They were great friends and had a lot of great times together. One day, Sammy died and Lenny was sad beyond words. In fact, he died shortly thereafter of a broken heart.

When Lenny arrived at the pearly gates, he asked about Sammy.

"He's down below," came the answer.

"I want to see him," said Lenny.

"Okay," Lenny is told, "here's a 24-hour pass and a harp, which you will need for re-admission. But remember, you've got only 24 hours."

Down below, Lenny walks the streets with his harp and encounters Sammy. They embrace and Lenny asks how things are going.

"Fine," says Sammy. "I've opened a disco. Come and have a drink."

At the disco, Lenny and Sammy reminisce and Lenny loses track of time. All of a sudden, he notices that he's about to be late for heaven, so he jumps up and rushes out.

Back at the pearly gates, he finds that he's just under the wire.

Then comes the question: "Where is your harp?"

Lenny gasps and says, "I left my harp at Sam's Clam Disco."

Treadwell was born in Belleville NJ, outside Newark, and he grew up in Arlington, also in the Newark area. As a teenager, he spent summers in Lexington MA with his aunt and uncle, who liked card games.

When he was 15, Treadwell was recruited as a fourth for an auction bridge game, and he was immediately smitten. By the time he enrolled at MIT in Cambridge MA in 1929, contract bridge had taken off, and Treadwell liked it even better than auction bridge.

"I avidly read the Culbertson Blue Book on bidding," Treadwell says. "I knew it by heart."

Although Treadwell played all through college -- he was studying chemical engineering -- he completed his studies and graduated.

One day, he read a bridge column in a Boston newspaper about a duplicate game at the Boston Chess Club. The first time he played, he and his partner came in second. "This is an easy game," Treadwell recalls thinking. The next few times he played, Treadwell wasn't average, but his enthusiasm wasn't dampened in the least.

America was in the middle of the Great Depression when Treadwell graduated from college in 1933, and he considered himself lucky to find a job at a silk dying plant in Paterson and later at the Dupont plant in Arlington, where the company was still experimenting with uses for Teflon. Treadwell worked nearly his entire career with Dupont, retiring in 1977.

As he became better and better at bridge, Treadwell found himself at the same bridge clubs as some of the other future stars of the game, including Billy Seamon and his sister Edith (now Freilich) and Sidney Silodor.

Treadwell started traveling to tournaments, and he recalls one incident that taught him something about partnership relations. He and his partner were playing in the Goldman Pairs at the Eastern States Regional, driving from Arlington to New York City and taking a subway to the tournament. The qualifying sessions in the game were on consecutive nights during the week.

About the third night, Treadwell and his partner fouled up the very first board. Each was angry at the other but very determined not to say a word during the session.

"The instant the last card was played, we started chewing each other out about the first board," Treadwell remembers, "and we kept it up as we made our way back to the subway or our way home." The two were so intent on their argument that they didn't notice -- until it was too late -- that they had gotten on the subway going in the wrong direction.

Treadwell traveled the country in his job with Dupont, including stops in Parkersburg WV -- where he started the first duplicate bridge club in town -- St. Paul MN and Hanford WA.

The latter stop was most interesting. Treadwell worked at a plant that was part of the Manhattan Project during World War II, and the legendary physicist Enrico Fermi was among the staffers.

Treadwell wants to tell about his young friend who went to a monastery in France to gather information for his doctoral thesis.

When the friend returned, Treadwell asked how the

young man liked the sojourn.

It was fine, the young man said, but he added that there was a custom that drove him crazy. Each morning he had to assemble with others in the courtyard. The abbot would come out and chant, "Good morning, good morning, good morning." Everyone was supposed to respond, "Good morning, good morning, good morning."

One day, related the young man, he defied the abbot, chanting instead, "Good evening, good evening, good evening."

The abbot was angered, and he held out his hands for silence, saying, "Someone chanted evening. It must be the stranger."

Naturally competitive, Treadwell always plays in the top event for which he is eligible. He likes the mental stimulation.

"Bridge has helped me as much as anything in maintaining my mental faculties," he says. That includes the capacity for remembering -- and sometimes creating -- jokes.

He vividly recalls many incidents from his past, including one involving Charles Goren from the Fifties. Goren had agreed to play with one of Treadwell's favorite partners, Marion-Louise Reich, at a sectional in Parkersburg.

On the Sunday of the tournament, Reich, her husband, Treadwell and Goren tied for first in the board-a-match teams with four women. First prize was four silver trophies. Second was four bottles of liquor.

"We all wanted the liquor," Treadwell recalls, "and Goren said, 'Leave it to me.'"

Putting on all his charm, Goren approached the women and magnanimously offered them their choice of prizes.

Recalls Treadwell: "They took the liquor."

One of Treadwell's biggest thrills came in a game against the legendary Oswald Jacoby. Early on in one deal, Treadwell bared a king behind Jacoby, who didn't believe the unknown Treadwell was good enough to do it. When Jacoby took the finesse and went down, he was furious.

"I was just a squirt," recalls Treadwell, "but that's the thrill of bridge. Any player can get a good board against an expert."

Treadwell has given a lot back to bridge, serving as chairman of the ACBL Board of Governors and as co-chairman of the national Appeals Committee. He still serves on appeals committees at NABCs.

When he's not playing bridge, Treadwell spends his time playing blackjack and working on the "magic rectangle" -- a figure composed entirely of squares of different sizes. The minimum number of squares is nine, with only one possibility. With 10 squares, there are more possibilities, and so on. Treadwell has developed magic rectangles with up to 15 squares -- about 2500 -- using a computer and a mathematical formula.

Treadwell allows that he doesn't have the stamina he used to -- he doesn't play three sessions a day so often now -- but he still attends about 15 regionals a year and all the NABCs plus sectionals in Philadelphia and Wilmington.

Of course, there's the never-ending supply of jokes, which he is never too tired to tell. He can catch you unawares even if you know his propensities. Does he have an all-time favorite? You bet.

I have a friend with a very unusual hobby -- he collects tea, and he's always looking for new varieties. Not long ago, my friend was in London at a tea importing business, and the proprietor asked if the man had ever had any tea made from koala bears. "It's made by the Mercy Tea Co. in Sydney, Australia."

My friend was intrigued and asked if he could sample some. "No," said the tea importer, "because the Australian government has very strict laws about the exporting of koala tea. But I will give you a letter of introduction if you want to look into it yourself."

My friend took the next plane to Sydney, where he visited the Mercy Tea Co. and asked if he could take a sample of the tea with him.

"No," said the director of research, "but I could make some for you here."

With that, the man got a live koala bear and put it in a blender with warm water. Minutes later, he was pouring a rather distasteful looking brew from the blender.

Aghast, my friend said, "Why don't you at least filter out the skin and bones?"

"Sir," said the Australian, "the koala tea of Mercy is not strained."
