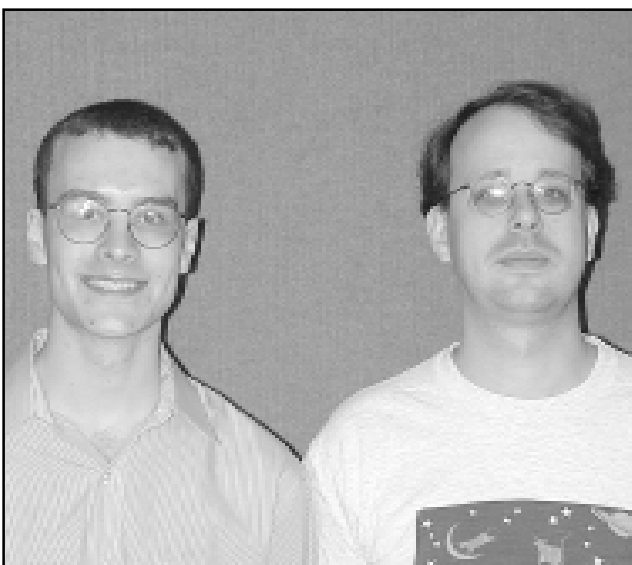

Welland, Meltzer, Jacobs, Robinson going strong

Two American teams will face two multi-national teams in today's Spingold Knockout Teams semifinals. The team captained by Roy Welland, which features two Swedes and a Canadian, will oppose the only remaining team captained by a woman – the Rose Meltzer sextet. In the other match, the George Jacobs squad, with four Italians on board, will take on the all-American Steve Robinson team.

Meltzer (Peter Weichsel, Alan Sontag, Chip Martel, Lew Stansby, Kyle Larsen) made a fantastic comeback to fight their way into the semifinal. They trailed the team captained by Rita Shugart (Andrew Robson, Tony Forrester, Geir Helgemo), 119-104, with two boards to go. On the next-to-last deal, Meltzer got to five clubs,

Willenken, Silverstein win NABC Fast Open

Chris Willenken and Aaron Silverstein topped the field in the inaugural NABC Fast Open Pairs. The duo had a huge game in the first final session (67.5%) to carry them to the win. They scored 972.59 matchpoints (including carryover, 650 average).

Willenken, 24, is an options trader, while Silverstein, 33, is a full-time player. Both live in New York City. They have been playing together seriously for more than a year.

This is the first NABC win for both Willenken and Silverstein. The NABC Fast Open Pairs is a four-session contest, with a two-session qualifier and a two-session final. The contest required that the participants play two-board rounds in 11 minutes. If a table exceeded its allotted time, penalties were assessed. The director would inquire whether one or both pairs were responsible for the delay and assign slow-play penalties accordingly. Sixty-four pairs played in the final.

In second was the Las Vegas-based pair of Paul and Linda Lewis, who scored 963.00 matchpoints.

Fifth graders take on I/N field

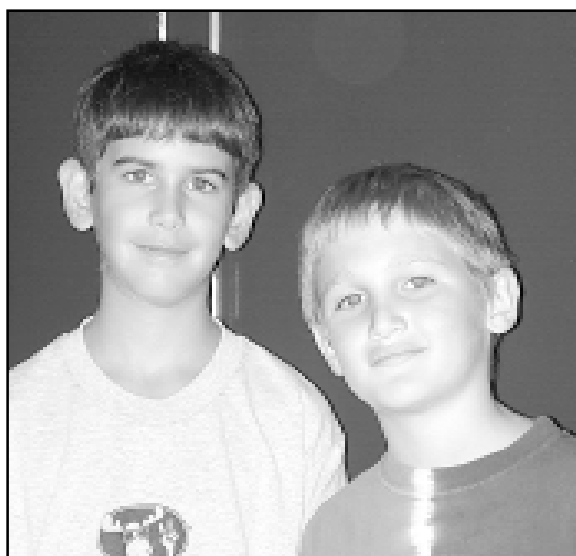

"Down Under" duo wins IMP Pairs

Stephen Burgess and Ashley Bach won the NABC IMP Pairs by the narrow margin of 1.92 IMPs. Burgess, of Australia, and Bach, of New Zealand, finished the contest with a score of plus 118.94 IMPs, to narrowly edge out the runner-up pair of Steve Beatty, of Destrehan LA, and George Steiner, of Seattle WA.

Burgess has represented both New Zealand and Australia in international play. He has lived in Australia for the past 20 years, and will represent "Oz" at the Olympiad in Maastricht playing with fellow Australian international Paul Marston.

Bach, of Auckland, New Zealand, is breaking into the international scene, having recently won the Butler Pair Trials in Australia.

The IMP Pairs was the first NABC victory for both players.

The contest is a four-session event (two qualifying and two final sessions). 156 players qualified for the final.

Guess I should'a stayed in bed

Sometimes it is not worth getting out of bed, as Carolyn Steiner and Marinesa Letizia discovered. Down 38 IMPs at the half in their Wagar Women's Knockout match, Steiner picked up:

She passed in second seat at unfavorable vulnerability. She heard a Multi 2♦ on her left, pass from partner, 2♠ (heart fit) on her right, and 2NT on her left, showing hearts. Partner doubled to show an unbalanced good hand, and righty jumped to 4♥, passed back to partner. Letizia doubled again to show an even better hand. This was the auction so far:

Steiner decided to try for a minor suit game with 4NT, and Letizia jumped to 6♦, which made Steiner put down her dummy rather apologetically. Not to worry - Marinesa had her covered with a 23 count and all the aces. This way the full story:

Alas, the diamonds were 3-1 with both honors offside. That was one down - especially galling when her teammates had escaped for minus 300 with the East-West cards!

Creating a defensive entry

Steve Castellino, of Fremont CA, found a neat play on defense on this deal from the first final session of the Red Ribbon Pairs. Castellino was playing with partner Karen Manfield.

Castellino led the ♠8: 9, 2 10. Declarer played the ♣4 to dummy's queen and when that held, he ran the ♦9 to North's jack. Castellino persisted with a spade: 7, 3, queen. Declarer now played a heart, and inserted dummy's jack when North played low. The ♦6 was then passed to North's king.

Castellino knew his partner needed two entries to establish and run the spades. The ♦A was one entry but how to get him in a second time? Castellino then hit on the idea that partner might hold the ♥10, so he exited with the ♥Q. Declarer won the king and played a club to the 9 and North's 10. Castellino now underled the ♥A. South won and played a spade. Eventually regained the lead with the ♦A to defeat the contract one trick. Plus 50 was a great score.

High-level Grosvenor

You've heard of the Grosvenor Coup. It happens when a player takes an action that gives the opposition an extra trick, but with a catch. The play making the extra trick possible looks so absurd that the player refuses to take that line. Instead he does what looks sensible and ends up with the same tricks he originally had. Usually everyone gets a good laugh because the player was fooled by a Grosvenor.

There's no question about it - Dave Treadwell has been around in bridge. But he got caught on this deal during a Spingold match.

Treadwell rose with dummy's ace on the club opening lead and pulled four rounds of trumps. When he led a spade, West went up with the ace and led another club, ruffed. Treadwell led a spade to the king and gave up a spade to West's queen. He ruffed the club return with his last trump.

Treadwell cashed his good spade and West threw the good ♠J! The ♣J! That clarified the picture - if West had the ♦A she would have kept the ♠J and scored the last two tricks. So it was clear to Treadwell that she did not have the ♦A - she was holding onto the doubleton ♦Q. So Treadwell led a diamond to the jack and was astounded when East produced the queen - down one.

"Is it a violation of Zero Tolerance for your partner to fall off his chair laughing at you?" Dave wants to know. Michael Huston, his partner, thought it was the most hilarious incident in his life.

Queen of Clubs tells a tall tale

Arnie Malasky (playing with his wife Ronnie) and Dick Wegman (playing with his wife Alice) achieved a truly remarkable feat on this deal.

In one room E-W for the Malasky team reached 4♥ doubled by East after South had opened 3♦. The opening lead was the ♣Q, and declarer had a blind spot – he accidentally ducked in both hands! That led to an 800-point penalty.

In the other room South passed and East-West bid to 3♣ by West. The opening lead was a low trump, declarer ducked in dummy . . . you guessed it – when South produced the ♣Q, declarer pulled the wrong card and let the queen hold!

Have you ever seen both tables let a singleton queen score through ducking by accident? Although this second accident let 3♣ be defeated, it still meant that the Malasky team lost IMPs on the deal. They trailed by 42 at the halfway break in their bracket 4 knockout match. They got it all back and more in the second half. Wegman's fine defense helped.

Arnie Malasky played 4♠ after an unopposed auction. He got a spade lead to the ace and a heart shift. The defense cashed the first three tricks and exited with a trump. When the ♠10 fell Malasky saw that he could combine his minor suit chances by playing three rounds of diamonds. If they split he was home; if not, he still had the chance to test the clubs (yes, if West has falsecarded from ♠A-10-8, he deserves to beat you!)

In the other room West overcalled 2♥ and North made a negative double, leading to 4♠ played by South.

Dick Wegman led a heart and Alice cashed the queen and ace, then shifted to a trump. Dick took his ♠A and played a third heart, giving a “useless” ruff and sluff, but one that forced declarer into a premature decision. When he ruffed in dummy, he could still survive by drawing one more round of trumps and using dummy's ♠9 as an entry to the diamonds. But when he played on clubs before diamonds, the ♠10 scored the setting trick.

Silence is golden

G.S. Jade Barrett and his team were down 6 IMPs going into the last board of their Morning Knockout match. This was the last board:

Barrett, sitting South, thought there was a good chance the opponents would go for notrump if left alone since he had a somewhat balanced hand. He felt his side needed some kind of swing, so he took a position and didn't overcall on a hand where the world would overcall. He maintained his tight lip after the second round of bidding as well, and sure enough, East-West got to 3NT, with Barrett on lead.

He quickly cashed his six tricks to score plus 200. His teammates played 3♣ making four at the other table, so the gain on the board was 8 IMPs, enough to pull out the victory by 2 IMPs.

Barrett's right-hand opponent asked to see Barrett's hand. He was perplexed. “How could you pass with a hand like that?”

Brogeland finds a neat solution

Boye Brogeland, the young editor of the Norwegian bridge magazine, is a fine player, as he shows in the following hand from the Spingold

2♥ showed a good diamond raise.

Andrew Robson started with the ♥A, but Rita Shugart played a discouraging 10. So Robson shifted to a trump as Shugart discarded a heart. It looks at this point as if the only hope for Brogeland is to find the ♣A onside, but he wasn't happy with that. He decided to run all six diamonds and three spades, hoping to set up a favorable end position. He hoped that whoever had the ♣A also had the ♥Q and would have to come down to these cards in the end position. Since Shugart discarded another heart, Brogeland was quite sure Robson had the ♥Q.

Of course Brogeland was going down several if the person with the ♣A did not have the ♥Q. Nevertheless he went ahead with his plan.

Well, Robson was acutely aware of what was going on, so he attempted to avoid the endplay by pitching his ♣A – he hoped his partner had the king. So Brogeland made his 5 contract even though the ♣A was over his king.

California Winkle

I played this deal in the second round of the Thursday-Friday KOs. I was playing with my dad, Henry.

Notice that I had stayed out of the laydown contract of 3NT to play 4♠. A trump lead will beat me off the top but since East's bid guaranteed one of the top three heart honors, West felt safe leading the ♥K. Seeing the dummy, he switched to a spade, trying to stop heart ruffs. I won and exited the ♥Q. East did best by returning the ♠Q (any other return allows me to make five). Now I had a problem --- after losing two hearts I still had a diamond and a heart loser. Having read about all sorts of squeezes that rely on running all the trumps I figured running a few rounds might be useful. So I cashed four more spades to come to this position:

Here, I missed a neat line. If I had cashed the last spade, West would pitch a club, and I would also pitch one from dummy. Now East feels the squeeze. East can't pitch a heart, so he must pitch a diamond and I could have then played ♦A and another diamond. If West ducks, East will win and I'll score two hearts tricks, but if he takes the king he becomes the stepping-stone to the dummy for the last two tricks.

Defenses to 1NT

At this NABC, in General Convention Chart events, the Board of Directors has voted to allow constructive defenses to 1NT openings, even when those defenses do not contain a known suit.

Since these are Mid-Chart conventions, it is the responsibility of the pair playing these methods to pre-Alert the opponents and to provide a suggested defense.

In order to help players counter these methods successfully, the tournament is making available copies of an article on the subject, written by Marinesa Letizia, that appeared previously in the ACBL *Bridge Bulletin*. Look for “Counter-Defense to Interference vs. 1NT Opener” in the rooms where General Convention Chart events are played.

The Facts: 2♠ doubled made two, plus 470 for E/W. The opening lead was a small diamond. The Director was called after the 2♠ bid and before South doubled. N/S alleged there had been a break in tempo by East over 1NT; E/W did not notice one. The Director ruled that passing 1NT was a logical alternative for West. Balancing was made more attractive by the break in tempo. The contract was changed to 1NT down one, plus 50 for E/W.

The Appeal: E/W appealed the Director's ruling. East said that he paused for perhaps 10 seconds to consider his action over 1NT. West said that he did not notice any break in tempo and that he thought his action was justified, both vulnerable at matchpoints. North and South both stated that they noticed an unmistakable break in tempo.

The Committee Decision: The Committee judged that a hesitation had likely occurred, based on the statements of three of the four players. The Committee believed that pass was a logical alternative to double since in theory East could have held a 4-4-2-3 five count and the break in tempo demonstrably suggested action on West's part. Whether the break in tempo was based on extra high cards or extra distribution, West's double was more attractive with that knowledge. The Committee therefore canceled West's double and reverted the contract to 1NT. In 1NT with the likely spade lead, the play was projected as follows: spade ducked to West's king, low diamond to North's 10, ♠9 ducked all around, club to the king, ♠Q to the ace, spade cashed, club finesse, ♣A. Different variations were possible but seven tricks seemed both probable and likely. The Committee considered whether N/S's defense to 2♠ doubled had been egregious, in which case N/S would have failed to take advantage of the opportunity for a better score than was available in 1NT. This was not judged to be the case since the ♣K shift at trick three, although a favorite to succeed, was not clear. The contract was changed to 1NT made one, plus 90 for N/S.

The Facts: 1NT made one, plus 90 for E/W. The Director was called at the end of play. South had not been told that E/W open 1♣ with any strong notrump hand. South stated he might have bid 1NT rather than double had he received a proper explanation of the 1♣ bid. The Director ruled that there had been no damage and allowed the result to stand.

The Appeal: N/S appealed the Director's ruling. Only South attended the hearing. South stated that upon receiving the explanation "could be short" he assumed that it was the normal 4-4-3-2 distribution. Had he known that it could have been a strong notrump, possibly with longer diamonds, he would have overcalled 1NT, leading to the possible N/S results of 2♥ down one or E/W contracts of 2♠ or 2NT down one. South said that beating the opponents to 1NT at neither vulnerable would have been clear if he knew East could have had a strong notrump.

The Committee Decision: The Committee believed that South had not done enough to explore the implications of East's explanation. For example, when asked what E/W's notrump range was, South said he did not know at the time but now knew it to be, "11 to 14, or maybe 10 to 12." Because knowledge of E/W's notrump range was critical to South's decision, failure to inform himself of that fact was in no small way responsible for South's dilemma. Also, relying on the opponents to have specifically a 4-4-3-2 weak notrump in the finals of the Life Master Pairs was an inference that South took at his own risk. Finally, it was possible that South would have been worse off had he overcalled 1NT since E/W scores of plus 100 (2♥ doubled) or plus 110 (in 3♦ after doubling North's transfer response) were reasonably likely. The Committee allowed the table result to stand since South had not sufficiently demonstrated damage solely from the opponents' actions. E/W were assessed a five matchpoint procedural penalty for failure to disclose their agreement adequately.

West cashed the three high clubs and switched to a spade. East won and continued with a spade, promoting West's ♦8 for the defenders' fifth and final trick. The result, plus 760, was instrumental in the Sincoff team's advance to the next round.

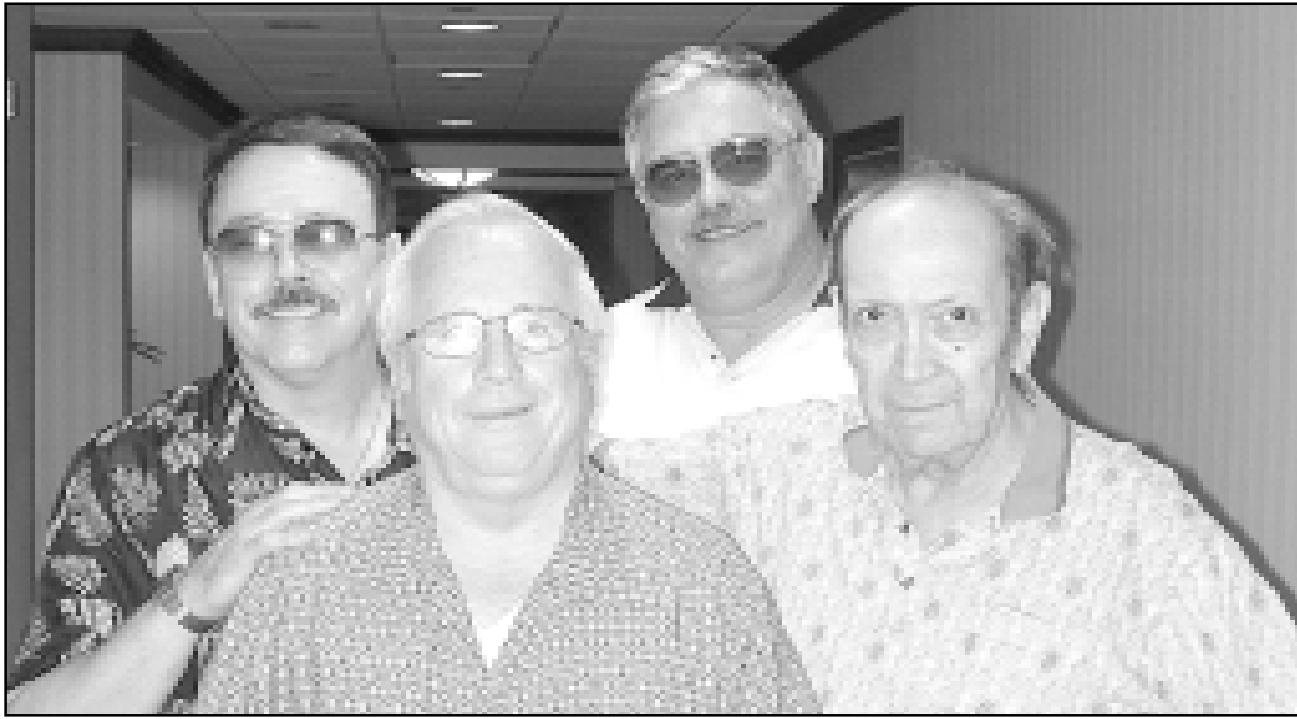
