TDs from Texas

Check this space each day for profiles of Texas-based ACBL Tournament Directors who are working here at the Dallas NABC.

(Editor's note: OK, we realize the title of this series is 'TDs from Texas' and that Guillermo Poplawsky is actually from Mexico which is, of course, not in Texas - although with the border situation these days, that point is rapidly becoming irrelevant. Anyway, just think of Guillermo as being from, well, **south** Texas.)



Guillermo Poplawsky remembers his first NABC very well. It took place in 1978 at the old Shamrock Hilton Hotel in Houston.

"They made me suffer," he recalls, referring to fellow tournament directors who had the habit of hazing the new guys.

In those days, directors posted results and matchpointed the sheets by hand. Poplawsky was given two sheets. "They put me between Roger Putnam and Julie Greenberg," he recalls ruefully, noting that those two are among the best ever at doing the sheets by hand.

"I was proud to finish posting my first section," he says, "until I saw that Roger and Julie already had both of theirs, posted and matchpointed, on the wall. I thought I was the worst tournament director ever."



Today, the Mexico City TD is considered one of the best and is a fixture at NABCs and the World Bridge Federation's tournaments. Besides his directing expertise, Poplawsky is attractive to

Kniest, Walker take Mixed Pairs crown

Pairing a 56.67% game in the first final session with a 63.91% effort in the second final, Tom Kniest and Karen Walker won the four-session Rockwell Mixed Pairs Wednesday evening.

Kniest, of the St. Louis MO area, and Walker, of Champaign IL, finished 52nd in Tuesday's qualifying game, and moved up to 12th after the first final.

"There were no disasters, no numbers, no giant screw-ups," said Walker, describing their win.

This is the first NABC championship for both players. The duo has been second on three previous occasions.

Walker teaches English and advertising online for a community college. She is known to many ACBL members as a regular contributor to the Bridge Bulletin with her "Bidding Matters" column.



Kniest is a semi-retired CPA.

The winners posted a final total of 2521.79, placing them about a half board ahead of the runners-up, Kitty and Steven Cooper of Albuquerque NM. The Coopers finished with 2491.00 (top was 77).

Oklahoma pair wins NABC 49er Pairs

Eric Sieg and Jim Thompson put together a huge game in the second session to win the NABC 49er Pairs. They had a modest 56% game in the afternoon and 66.67% in the evening.

Thompson, from Oklahoma City, is an accounting professor at Oklahoma City University. He began playing last summer while on teaching assignment at Washington State University. Sieg, of Norman OK, is a student at Oklahoma University. He saw a campus ad for a special 0-50 bridge game, went and played, and was hooked. Both began playing at the game held on the Oklahoma University campus and eventually became partners.

"It was hard to tell," said Sieg when asked if he knew they were winning. "We knew we had a good game going, and then had a monstrous last round."

Runners-up were Nadine Barker and Suzie Herman, both are from Forth Worth TX. They play regularly at home and are close friends as well as bridge partners.

The winners will have their names added to the Fifth Chair Trophy. The Fifth Chair Foundation is an international non-profit organization dedicated to promoting bridge on the Internet and attracting new players to the game.

In yesterday's round of 32, top seeds Nickell (#1), Welland (#3) and Robinson (#6) cruised to victory.

Hollman (original #24 seed) continued its march, walloping the Lynch squad (#8) by 70 IMPs. In the second quarter, Hollman dished out a 96-1 punishment of Lynch.

Grant Baze's team (#13) stopped Team Orange (original #36) 144-127.

Chang continues to impress, defeating #5 Schwartz 148-135.

Moss ousted higher-ranked O'Rourke 118-103, and Shugart (#18) handled giant-killer Jacob 145-94.

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In your face

Your left-hand opponent opens 3♠, partner overcalls 4♥ and your right-hand opponent ups the ante to 6♠. You hold:

♠Q ♥AQJ ♦AKJ843 ♣AK9.

Naturally, you are vulnerable and the opponents are not. What do you bid?

The hand was played in the Wednesday Compact KO Teams. The player holding this hand decided to bid 7♥. When the opponents sacrificed in 7♠, he doubled. The declarer, Australian Sartaj Hans playing with Tony Nunn, managed to escape for minus 800. Here's the hand. Note that 7♥ doesn't make, since you are off an ace!

At the other table, the auction was not quite as lively and proceeded as above. 4NT was Roman Key Card Blackwood. Teammates Kieran Dyke and David Wiltshire bid unimpeded to the slam, making six for plus 1430. This was a 12-IMP pickup for the Australians.

Pair scores 80% in A.M. game

Eli and Cynthia Schneider of East Brunswick NJ turned in an 80.06% performance in the 10-table Wednesday morning side game.

With a 7 top, 84 average, the Schneider's scored 134.50 matchpoints to win easily.

With greed emblematic of a true matchpoint player, Eli said "Our score actually dropped a bit in the last round."

Devious defense

Dutch expert Jan Jansma, playing with fellow countryman Louk Verhees, hit upon a fiendish plan as a defender on this deal from the round of 64 of the Vanderbilt Knockout Teams.

Take the cards of the victim, declarer, first. You hold:

♠7 6 3 ♥K 8 2 ♦Q 7 4 2 ♣A 9 5

This is the auction, with your side only vulnerable:

Some, obviously, would prefer passing to bidding 3♣, but it's not a ridiculous choice.

West leads the ♠A, and this is what you see:

At trick two West continues with the ♠10 to East's jack, followed by another high spade. West follows and you ruff in dummy.

It looks as if the opponents would likely have made 2♠, giving your side minus 110. You'd like to hold the contract to down one, therefore, for minus 100 and a push. You'll need something good to happen in the minor suits, however, as you're looking at two spade losers, and probably two diamond losers and two club losers — one too many.

So let's say you begin by drawing three rounds of trump ending in dummy, noting that West began with three, East two. Since East bid spades and hearts, his likely pattern is 5-4-2-2. If this is true, you have a chance to hold your diamond losers to one if East has A-x.

So you play a low diamond from dummy. East plays the 8 and you put up the queen, which holds. Excellent! So it appears that East did start with the doubleton ♦A. You therefore play a low diamond toward dummy, inserting the 9 when West follows low . . . only to see East win the 10! What's going on? Here the full deal:

Here's the reason you're down two: West, Jansma, also knew his partner was likely 5-4-2-2 after the second round of trumps was played.

When you called for a low diamond from dummy at trick seven, Jansma noted that his partner played the 8. Since their carding is upside-down, that meant that East had started with the 10-8 doubleton. If Jansma had won the ♦Q with the ace, he knew that you would later capture his partner's ♦10 when you played the king. This would allow you to build a trick with your diamond intermediates — the 9 and the 7.

Jansma knew, too, that you're a good player who pays attention to the bidding and the opponents' distribution. You would no doubt play a second round of diamonds and duck, expecting the ace to drop.

JUST FOR NEW PLAYERS

How to improve your game

Someone defined insanity as doing the same thing over and over and expecting a different result. So you're hooked on bridge and have a burning desire to get better. There are a number



of ways to improve your game.

Bridge is an experiential game; the more experience, the better.

Experience comes in different forms. I devour the Bridge Bulletin every month. Sometimes the

bidding of the world-class players leaves me shaking my head. Some bid on absolutely nothing and still land on their feet. The Bridge Bulletin has numerous sections with hints to improve your game, and the world's best players and teachers are there to guide you.

Playing at home on the computer is a great way to practice counting. Reading and taking lessons are also excellent.

In the end, however, there is no substitute for playing. Remember, too, that the work begins after the game is over.

One of the best things you can do is analyze your results. After the results are posted, go over to the recap sheet. You can see all your scores the matchpoints each of them earned for you and your partner. The pair numbers go across the sheet and the board numbers run up and down. Copy the number of matchpoints you

won on each board to your convention card. On the recap sheet it will tell you what score is a top on a board. Half that number will be an average score.

Now get a copy of the hand record (every game at the NABCs has hand records, as do most tournaments). Look carefully at hands you did not score well and those you did. Are there any common themes to your bad scores? Do you frequently underbid or overbid? Do you do well at trump contracts and poorly at notrump contracts?

In trump contracts, the first thing you do is count your losers (ex-spouses aren't included) and decide whether to draw trumps. There are times when you must delay drawing trumps. If you need dummy's trumps for ruffing or for transportation to a long side suit, don't draw trumps until you ruff your losers or set up dummy's suit. If you have too many losers and don't have control of the trump suit (even if you hold KQJ1098 in trumps, you do not have control of the suit because of the outstanding ace) delay drawing trumps until you've gotten rid of one of your losers.

Are notrump contracts the problem? Do you know the rule of seven? Notrump is a race between declarer and the defenders to set up their long suits. The rule of seven tells you how many times to hold up (not win) if you have only one stopper in a suit.

Say dummy has the 7-6 and you hold A-5-2 of the suit that's led. Add the number of cards you have in dummy to the number in your hand and subtract from seven. In this case, two in dummy and three in your hand is five, subtracted from seven, so you know to hold up twice and win the third round. This cuts communication between defenders. If the leader held five cards in his suit, your right-hand opponent will have three and will



be unable to return the suit if he gets the lead later (you will try to make sure that if you must lose the lead it's to RHO). When do you not use the rule of seven? If you have a weaker suit the defenders may switch to, ignore the rule of seven.

Is defense the problem? Play attention to partner's signals. Do you have agreements about leads and discards? If not, discuss them and pay attention. Eventually, every card should have a meaning. One important caveat: never give partner information that will be more helpful to declarer than partner.

Opening lead: ♦A.

Bidding commentary: At "favorable" vulnerability (not vul versus vul), West should try to muddy the waters with a 3♦ bid. The normal way to deal with three-level interference after a INT opener is to play that "double" is strength-showing with Stayman overtones. It is

not a penalty double per se. Of course, with length and strength in the opponents' suit, partner can pass the double knowing you have a good hand. South, with a four-card major, elects to bid it. North raises.

Defensive commentary. West cashes a second diamond and East discards a low spade. At trick three, West plays the ♦J, the highest diamond he can afford, for East to ruff, a suit-preference play if there ever was one. East and returns a spade (if he wants the partnership to endure). Down one.

When giving partner a ruff with a known long suit (diamonds), the card you return is suit preference. If you want the higher ranking of the two side suits returned (spades), return the highest card you can afford. If you want the lower ranking suit of the two side suits returned, (clubs), exit with your lowest diamond. If you have no preference, return a middle card and watch partner suffer trying to figure out what whether it is a high one or a low one.

Jokes aside, when giving partner a ruff with no preference for either side-suit return, ask for the suit that is least likely to cost a trick - the safer of the two suits, if you will.

No generation gap

Joanne Mott needed a partner and went to the partnership desk. Before she could fill out a request card, she heard a voice say, "Do you want to play?" and a new partnership was born. Mott is from New York City. Her new partner, Greg Myerson, is from Sherman Oaks, CA.

Myerson, who is 11 years old, is here with his parents and has played duplicate for over a year, mostly with his father. Mott had previously played party bridge, but took up duplicate only last Saturday.

"The bid boxes and all the different procedures at duplicate took a little getting used to," Mott said. "I am going to the free classes and I really appreciate them."

"I like the free candy," said Myerson.

Bamboozled

A ruse by any other name is still — well, a ruse. Considering how often players haul this particular one out, it’s surprising how often it works, as it did for Wafik Abdou in a Vanderbilt Knockout Teams match earlier in the tournament.

West led the ♠5, taken by Abdou (South) with the 8 when East inserted the 7. Abdou could see eight tricks and could have simply fired a spade back toward the queen in dummy, but he was reasonably sure that West would win the ace and find the killing diamond shift.

Abdou therefore played his ♥7 to dummy’s ace and advanced the ♦Q, looking like a man trying to build some tricks in that suit. Luckily for Abdou, East did not have the ♦10 to go with his A-K. East won the ♦K and, apparently convinced South had three diamonds to the 10, exited with a low diamond, conceding the trick he thought he had to but maintaining communication with West so that if West got in again, another diamond play would beat the contract.

Abdou, delighted that playing on his worst suit had produced trick No. 9, ran home with the vulnerable game, a 13-IMP gain. At the other table, South had no chance to be deceptive, having been greeted with the opening lead of the ♦8. When the smoke cleared, Abdou’s teammates had taken five diamonds and the ♠A for plus 200.

Play in a world championship

Your chance to play in a world championship without having to win a trials event is just around the corner — the 8th World Bridge Championships in Verona, Italy, this June.

Play begins June 10 with the Mixed Pairs and continues with a full slate of events, concluding June 24. Besides the Mixed Pairs, there are the Rosenblum and McConnell teams (open and women’s respectively), Senior Teams, Open, Women’s, Senior and IMP pairs.

All events are transnational — teams or pairs may be made up of players from any countries. There are no quotas or restrictions, but you must register for the tournament before May 8 through

Fred Hamilton declared 6♦ on this deal (rotated) from the Tuesday Stratified Open Pairs:

As you can see, 12 tricks are surely going to be easy on a non-trump lead. Declarer gets a major-suit winner established or ruffs out the clubs.

Unlikely! West led a diamond. Undaunted, Hamilton won the ♦K, led the ♥J to the ace and ran trumps reaching this position:

On the penultimate trump, West pitched a club, as did dummy. East threw a spade. Declarer then led a club to the ace and ruffed a club, forcing West down to two hearts and two spades. (If West pitches a heart he is endplayed with a heart. Whether he exits with a high or low spade, declarer can table the next three tricks.) Now declarer led the ♠A K 8 for three of the last four tricks.

Do you see the defense? East must hold on to three of his spades, and now in the four-card ending when West comes down to a doubleton ♠Q, West controls the third round of the suit.

NABC IMP Pairs begins today

The four-session Lebhar IMP Pairs — two qualifying sessions followed by two final sessions — gets underway today with the Lebhar Trophy at stake.



The trophy was donated by Bertram Lebhar Jr. in 1948 in memory of his wife, Evelyn. The trophy was previously given to winners of the Mixed Teams but re-designated for the IMP Pairs by the ACBL Board of Directors.

Lebhar (1907-1972), under the name of Bert Lee, earned a national reputation as a sportscaster and later as a bridge player and administrator. In private life, he owned radio and television stations in Florida.

Lebhar was one of the founders of the Greater New York Bridge Association and was elected its first president in 1948.

Lebhar was also a player: he won the Spingold in 1940 and the Master Mixed Teams in 1946. His team was his wife Evelyn along with Samuel Katz and Alicia Kemper.

Women's Pairs compete for Whitehead Trophy

Play begins today in the Whitehead Women's Pairs with two qualifying sessions, followed by two final sessions tomorrow.

This is the 77th Women's Pairs. At stake is the Whitehead Trophy, donated in 1930 by Wilbur C. Whitehead of New York, a great bridge authority and a member of the team that won the Vanderbilt Cup in 1928, the first year it was in play.

Whitehead (1866-1931) was president of the Simplex Automobile Company, but bridge held such a fascination for him that he retired from business in 1910 to devote his life to bridge.

He was the inventor of many bidding and play conventions, the quick-trick table of card values, the Whitehead system of requirements for original bids and responses and the Whitehead table of preferential leads.

Whitehead was instrumental in standardizing procedures in auction bridge and later in contract bridge.

Bid Box Alerts and Announcements

When using bid boxes, ACBL requires that players tap the Alert strip and say "Alert" at the same time.

When making an Announcement, use the Announcement word — such as "transfer" — and tap the Alert strip at the same time.

A player who Alerts or Announces a bid should make sure his opponents are aware that an Alert or Announcement has been made.

Mistaken Bid or Mistaken Explanation?

One of the most vexing problems that directors face is determining what is going on when the hand held by a player does not match the explanation that has been given by his partner or what is marked on his convention card. Following are some guidelines for players and directors alike to follow when dealing with this situation.

If the agreement explained to the opponents is in fact the partnership agreement, and the bidder has simply forgotten what he is playing, there has been no infraction, and there can be no penalty regardless of damage. In determining this to be the case, the director should accept as proof that the explanation is the actual agreement when both members of the partnership have identically-filled out convention cards reflecting the agreement or they have system notes reflecting the agreement. If the evidence of the agreement is less compelling, the director should rule that there has been a mistaken explanation rather than a mistaken bid.

If the player who made the call in question has forgotten his agreement, but his partner has given an accurate explanation of the agreement, then the player who made the bid is under no obligation to his opponents to disclose that he has made a mistaken bid.

If the player who made the call in question made a bid that reflected his partnership agreement and his partner has given a mistaken explanation, then the player who made the bid must correct his partner's explanation at the earliest legal moment. If his side declares, that

moment is at the end of the auction and prior to the opening lead being faced. If his side defends, he must wait until the end of play. In either case, the director must be summoned to protect everybody's rights.

When partner makes a mistaken explanation of our call or when his Alert or explanation alerts us to the fact that we have made a mistaken bid, it creates information for us which is unauthorized, and we must be careful not to make a call which could be based on an inference drawn from the Alert or explanation when we have a logical alternative. What we must do is continue the auction as though partner had made an explanation that corresponds to the hand that we actually hold. Here is an example from a recent tournament. I was the offender. The auction proceeded 2♥ by my RHO, pass by me, pass by my LHO, 2NT by my partner. RHO passed, and I bid 3♥ holding a 4-1-3-5 distribution and believing that my bid was Stayman. My partner announced a transfer, however, and I now remembered that we had agreed to play "systems on" in this situation. She now bid 3♠ and it went pass to me. By law, I am obliged to continue the auction as though she had responded 3♠ to my Stayman inquiry, so since I had enough points to bid game, I was compelled to bid 4♠ even though I knew from her Announcement that she might not have more than two spades. Virtue was rewarded when she turned up with four spades to match mine, but any other call by me would have been a violation of law.

In much the same way, we must continue to follow the regulations of the ACBL when partner's Alert awakens us to a problem that we are not on the same wavelength. Say that I respond 2NT to partner's 1♠ opening, thinking that we are playing Jacoby forcing raises. There is no Alert, and, when asked partner states that I am showing a balanced minimum opening bid. He now proceeds to bid 3♦. If our agreement is that this rebid over Jacoby 2NT shows a singleton or void in diamonds, I must Alert and if asked, explain our agreement even though I may suspect that my partner and I are having a misunderstanding. Our side cannot profit from this action since my Alert and explanation and partner's failure to Alert all have created unauthorized information for us.

In most of the situations listed above, the director will need to be called. He should be called as soon as it becomes apparent that there is a problem in order to ensure that the rights of all the players are protected.

Parking

Pre-Alert/Disclosure forms

If your partnership plays special overcalls, you must fill out a pre-Alert/Disclosure form and make it available to your opponents when you play in events that allow Mid-Chart and Super-Chart conventions.

This applies to NABC+, regional or higher knockout and Flight A Swiss games. Look for the light blue forms on the table where convention cards are available

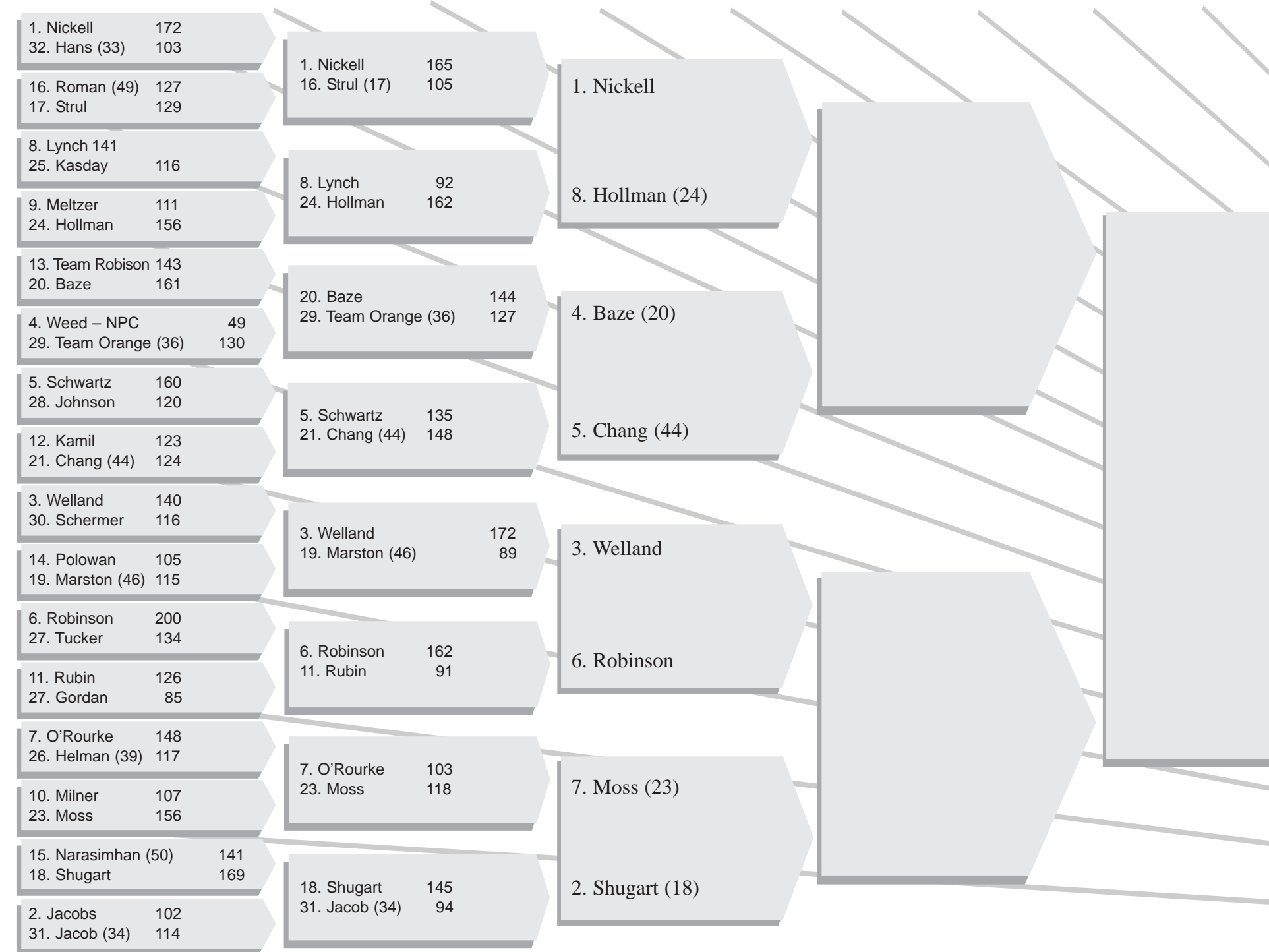

the WBF because he is fluent in two languages - English and Spanish - and is competent in German, Italian and Portuguese.

Poplawsky was born in Mexico City to parents who had emigrated from Poland. Their original destination was the U.S., but there was a long wait so they chose Mexico, where one of Poplawsky's uncles had already established residence.

Poplawsky was trained as a civil engineer and enjoyed that career from 1960 to the late Eighties. He built factories, office buildings, homes and even a synagogue.

His introduction to bridge came through his first wife, Arlene, who taught him to play. They and friends played social bridge until they heard about a bridge club in Mexico City. Poplawsky's first foray into the duplicate world was exciting. He and his partner "did everything wrong but it turned out right and we came in first. I thought I had it all down." The next few times they played, however, Poplawsky and his partner were last.

Directing came into Poplawsky's life when the man who ran the American Bridge Club in Mexico City asked him to help out with a game. As an engineer, Poplawsky was good with a pencil, so he agreed to give it a try.

In 1977, the ACBL decided to recruit TDs from Mexico, and Poplawsky was on the list. He took a test at the Mexico City Regional and passed easily. His first U.S. tournament was the NABC in Houston.

Poplawsky has been a full-time TD since 1988, at which point he cut back on his engineering work.

One of the main attractions of the TD job for Poplawsky is the way the directing staff makes order out of chaos at big tournaments: "I enjoy the pressure of being part of a team where there are 350 tables in a knockout, all the people are standing in front of you waiting for the game to start and two minutes later they are all sitting down and playing."

These days, Poplawsky - a club owner himself - also spends time working with club directors, teaching them about rulings and how to use ACBLscore. He is proud to note that his club in Mexico City was the first to use computer scoring for games, employing a program written by an Italian engineer living in Mexico at the time.

In his spare time, Poplawsky and his wife, Emma, spend time at the home he built in Cuernavaca, Mexico, not far from their apartment in Mexico City. Poplawsky is a good cook who specializes in ethnic cuisines.

At present, Poplawsky is planning to retire from the tournament world at the end of next year. If he does, he will look back on an interesting, fulfilling career. "I've really enjoyed the directors I work with," he says, "and I have met many nice people."

Red Ribbon Pairs begins today

The Red Ribbon Pairs, an ACBL event with national rating open to players with fewer than 2000 masterpoints, gets underway today.

Players earn qualification by placing first or second overall in regionally rated events of at least Flight B status. Neither member of a qualifying pair may hold more than 2000 masterpoints at the time of qualification.

The four-session event began in 1986 and winners have their names inscribed on the Percy X. Bean Trophy.

Bean Trophy

The trophy was designated by the ACBL Board of Directors in 1996 to honor Bean, ACBL president in 1972 and chairman of the Board in 1973.

Bean (1916-1992) represented District 19 on the Board from 1964 until 1988 and served as president of the ACBL Charity Foundation from 1974 until 1981. He was a member of the National Goodwill Committee and the National Board of Governors and general chairman of arrangements for the World Team Olympiad in Seattle in 1984.



Bean and his wife, Anne, were named ACBL Honorary Members for 1992, the first time that honor was

bestowed on a husband-wife combination.

Bean was the editor of *Mad, Mad World of Bridge*, a publication that strongly championed players of less than expert class.

4♠ looks like a very healthy contract, but West had overcalled hearts, and led the ♣9. Things looked bleak, but Tarek covered with the ♣J and East won the queen and shifted to a heart.

Tarek took the ♥A, drew trumps and stripped out the diamonds, then crossed to the ♠Q to lead a heart to the 10 and jack.

West led the ♥K and Tarek threw a club from dummy! Now, his only remaining chance came through – West had no club to lead, so had to give a ruff and discard. At the other table, three rounds of clubs saw the defense collect a heart in the endgame for down one.
