# **Meet Your TDs**



This is part of a continuing series of profiles of tournament directors working at the NABCs.

Talk to Scott Campbell for a few minutes and you understand that this is a man who can commit.

Who else would have a job that

involved two years of literally living out of a suitcase while traveling around South America?

Who else would take a job (owning and operating a motel) that required more than 100 hours a week of work?

Who else would go to an NABC and play 39 sessions of bridge?

Fortunately for the ACBL, Campbell is now committed to duplicate. In fact, he says, "That's all I do."

The part-time ACBL TD from Sun City CA (Riverside County) directs at his own bridge club and travels to two others to direct and teach. "I play on Thursdays," he says.

The native of Sacramento worked for the Bank of America for 25 years and traveled the world for

a big part of that time, including stops in Colombia (where he met his wife, Rocio), the Dominican Republic, Africa and the Far East.

He eventually became a vice president of the bank, spending his final two years with the company in Los Angeles before he up and quit that job to become a motel owner. He bought the Downtowner Motor Inn in Carson City NV and worked himself to the bone. "It was 110 hours a week," he says. "I don't know if I owned it or it owned me."

Campbell sold the motel in 1998 and returned to Southern California, joining a company that made drafting equipment.

When that company downsized, Campbell found himself playing more and more bridge. He had learned to play during a brief interlude at Sacramento State University, and he played a lot during his travels while working for the bank.

His interest in tournament directing, he says, was prompted by his wife, who insisted that if he was going to be involved with the game so much, "I needed to make money at it."

Campbell says his travels for Bank of America taught him lessons he now uses as a TD. "You learn to be very tolerant because you meet lots of people in lots of situations."

Working in bridge, he says, "has lots of challenges, but that's what makes (being a TD) a good job."

# JUST FOR NEW PLAYERS

# Pairs or teams?

#### By Pat Harrington

If you take a look at the schedule of events for this tournament, you will see many choices. Whatever you choose, you will be playing in a pairs event or a team event. Believe it or not, the event you play in can affect how you play as declarer.

Most players who frequent bridge clubs are accustomed to playing pairs games that are scored by matchpoints.

Plan your play at matchpoints on the following deal after West leads the \$4\$ and East follows with the queen at trick one:

All Pass

3NT

Pass

It looks like you will make an overtrick in 3NT. Win the opening lead and, as long as you get a 3-2 split in diamonds, you can run the suit (starting with the queen) and then take the rest of your winners.

You are probably wondering how the form of scoring matters. If you played the same way in a team game, you would not be giving yourself every chance to make your contract. There will be times when diamonds split 4-1. Played as we have discussed, you will go down if East shows out on the second diamond (you can recover if West shows out – simply duck a diamond). Because the odds overwhelmingly favor a 3-2 diamond split, it would be losing *matchpoint* bridge to cater to a 4-1 split with

East holding the diamond length. Your plus 400 or plus 600, depending on vulnerability, will not hold up well to other declarers who are scoring plus 430 or plus 630. In fact, if everyone makes an overtrick and you don't, you might as well have gone down because you will score zero matchpoints about 83% of the time! And even when the diamonds split badly, your score will be average or close to it because every other declarer is likely to have taken the same line of play.

Now consider playing at teams, where your scores are converted to IMPs. The team accumulating the most IMPS over several boards wins the match. While a match might occasionally be won by only 1 or 2 IMPs, the margin is often a lot higher. If you make 3NT on the nose and lose the overtrick, you lose 1 IMP. If you go down in a game you could have made – a

game that your opponents make against your teammates – you lose 10 or 12 IMPs depending on the vulnerability. Do you want to risk a loss of that many IMPs even 17% of the time? I sure don't. In team games, we are not as concerned about making overtricks. We'll take them when they are there to take safely, but our primary concern is to guarantee the safety of our contract and you can play more safely if you duck a diamond early. That ensures you an entry to cash four diamond tricks even when East holds a singleton diamond.

Here is the layout that will kill you at teams if you don't play it safe:

At the table today, plan your play as every good declarer does, but add a new dimension to that plan. Is it teams, where you should make your contract as safely as possible ,or is it pairs, where you will go for overtricks when the odds favor that play?

# Thinking bridge By Eddie Kantar

Bidding commentary: South, with stoppers in the unbids, decides 3NT is a more descriptive rebid than 3. After all, how can partner be expected to rebid 3NT lacking a minor-suit stopper? North clearly has enough to raise to 6NT facing a likely 17-18 high-card points (or more). The six near-solid spades make up for the lack of HCP. In any case, that is what South is planning to tell North if anything goes wrong!

**Play commentary:** As South, count your tricks! You have six likely spades, at least three hearts and three clubs for a grand total of 12. Am

I good to you or what? Any problems? Yes, spades are blocked! A good declarer (you!) notices blocked suits. A suit is considered blocked if it cannot be run uninterruptedly. In this case, spades cannot be run uninterruptedly unless the AJ is overtaken and the suit breaks 3-3 (36%). Don't hold your breath. What South needs is an outside entry to the spades. That entry is the AK. The first club must be won in

dummy (key play), the &J cashed, the closed hand entered via the &K and the spades, hearts and the remaining club are all high for at least 12 tricks.

When a suit is blocked, conserving an

When a suit is blocked, conserving an outside entry to that suit is critical. If no side suit entry exists, a risky overtake is the default solution.

Don't have a partner or teammates? No problem. The Intermediate-Newcomer area has its own partnership desk, located just outside the



# Where's the Excedrin?

This deal from the first qualifying session of the Nail Life Master Open Pairs gave a great many declarers some headaches.



Against 4 by North, East might be tempted to lead a diamond. Declarer wins in hand and then has to guess whether to pass the Q or play a spade to the ace and another to try to avoid a trump promotion. The first line works – the second does not.

If East can keep his fingers off the diamond lead, a heart to the ace forces West to cash the ♣A and continue the suit. That shortens dummy and defeats the game. Declarer plays low on the club continuation, ruffs in dummy, crosses to the ◆K and leads the ♠Q, on which East must play low. If East covers the ♠Q, declarer ruffs a diamond to hand, cashes the ♥K and ruffs a heart, ruffs a diamond, ruffs a club to dummy and leads the fifth diamond to pitch his last club. If East ruffs any of dummy's diamonds, the ♠9 ins the entry to dummy.

But if West plays the ♣A at trick two and shifts back to a heart, declarer wins the king, pitching a diamond. Now he unblocks the ♦K, passes the ♠Q, which East does best to cover, then leads the ♦A and pitches his last heart. Now East can ruff but declarer can take a heart ruff in hand then draw the last trump. He has preserved the entry to dummy to allow him to set up diamonds.

# Putt putt

In golf, they say *Drive for show, putt for dough*. In bridge, even if you don't get the auction right you can find a lot of gold in the dross by picking up the extra trick.

Jon Wittes and Ross Grabel sat North-South on this deal from the first qualifying session of the Nail Life Master Open Pairs. Grabel as South opened 1♠ and heard his partner bid 4♠ over West's 4♥.

It was tempting to bid on, but with no outside controls, Grabel passed. When dummy came down after the lead of the ♥K, Grabel could see that slam was entirely playable. How should he handle the trumps?

A 2-2 trump split was highly unlikely on the auction. With a 3-1 split the direct and delayed finesses are 50-50. If trumps were 4-0, you gain from the immediate finesse, so Grabel won the heart lead in dummy and played a spade to the 8, shortly thereafter wrapping up 13 tricks.

Plus 680 would have been a 25% board. Plus 710 was comfortably above average.



Teaching players to play is what brings fresh blood to bridge. But who teaches the teachers? The Teacher Accreditation Program, called TAP, is a training program to develop new teachers. # Subtle inference

Sometimes it can be easier to defend against a strong declarer than a weak one, because you can rely on a strong declarer to have followed a sensible line of play. Two deals prior to this defensive problem, the same declarer had been seen to turn a slam that required only a 4-1 or better trump break into one that needed a 3-2 split.

West led the  $\blacktriangle J$ . Declarer won the  $\blacktriangle A$  and played the  $\blacktriangledown 3$  to the 10, queen and ace. West returned the  $\blacktriangledown 2$  to the 9 (!) and king. You switch to the  $\spadesuit 2$  to the 4, queen and king. Declarer plays a spade to the king (10 from West), and back to the queen ( $\spadesuit 3$  from partner – reverse remainder count). She cashes the  $\blacktriangledown J$  and you discard the  $\clubsuit 2$ , then she ruffs the last heart – and you throw. . .?

Partner's diamond discard showed that he started with three or five cards – in either case he could see that his diamonds were useless. Declarer could be 4=3=2=4, in which case you must discard

a diamond, else declarer can play the A and another club to establish an extra trick – or she can be 4=3=4=2, in which case you must discard a club, else a diamond ruff sets up a 10th trick in that suit.

Which is it to be?

At the table a strong professional player discarded a club – and gave away the contract as this was the full deal:

The ending is not a guess if West is a strong player. True, he could afford a diamond from either a three- or five-card holding, but he should discard a club from four cards, not a useless diamond. After your switch to the  $\blacklozenge 2$ , partner would know with his own 2=4=3=4 hand that he did not need the fourth club, so he should discard it to solve your discarding problem.

That's a slightly subtle inference. East plays more than 95% of her bridge with weaker players. Subtle inferences regarding things that do not happen in defense or bidding are not reliable in such partnerships, and it is hard to switch back on to looking for and trusting them when you occasionally get to play with another expert.

# LM Women's Pairs honors Smith

Play ends today in the four-session Life Master Women's Pairs with the Helen Sobel Smith Trophy going to the winners.

At the Fall NABC in 2005, Jill Levin and Malle Andrade emerged as the victors.

The Smith Trophy recognizes Helen Sobel Smith, the first woman elected to the Bridge Hall of Fame. Smith was an outstanding player and is universally considered the best woman player of all time.

She won 35 North American titles -- the Vanderbilt twice, the Spingold five times and the Reisinger four times -- and the McKenney Trophy (now the Barry Crane Top 500) three times: in 1941, 1942 and 1944.

# Nail LM Pairs has rich history

Play concludes today in this four-session event, restricted to Life Masters and played over two qualifying sessions and two final sessions.

The winners of the 2005 Nail LM Open Pairs were Zia Mahmood and Jill Meyers. It was the third time Zia had won the event, and the second for Meyers.

Before 1963, the event was restricted to National Masters and players of higher rank. It was a men's event until 1990, when it became an open event. Meyers's victory in 2005 marked the fourth time a woman has won the event since it became an open contest in 1990.

At stake is the Bobby Nail Trophy, designated by the ACBL Board of Directors to honor the diminutive Texan (1925-95) who won this event in 1974 with longtime friend and partner Gerald Michaud.

Nail, inducted into the Bridge Hall of Fame at the 2001 Summer NABC in Toronto, won four other North American championships and represented North America twice in the Bermuda Bowl. His team was second in 1963.

# Mervin Key

Mervin Key, one of the top players in the Southwest in the Sixties, died Oct. 21 at a Houston hospital after a short battle with lung cancer. He was 77.

Founder of the Bridge Studio of Houston, Key represented the U.S. in the Bermuda Bowl in 1962. He won the Chicago (now Reisinger) Board-a-Match Teams in 1964 and was second in North American championships three times.

# **Zero Tolerance**

The ACBL Board of Directors — citing a commitment to "improving acceptable player behavior at all times" — adopted Zero Tolerance as ACBL policy in 1998.

Unacceptable behavior has decreased — the goal, however, is to eliminate unacceptable behavior as much as possible.

Please report conduct that is unacceptable while keeping in mind that we must be tolerant of other people in general —- and bridge players in particular. Also report conduct that is outstanding or refreshing.

Commendable behavior includes (but is not limited to):

- Being a good "host" or "guest" at the table.
- Greeting others in a friendly manner.
- Praising the bidding and/or play of the opponents.
- Having two clearly completed convention cards readily available to the opponents. This is also a regulation.

Unacceptable behavior includes (but is not limited to):

- Badgering, rudeness, insinuations, intimidation, profanity, threats or violence.
- Negative comments concerning opponents' or partner's play or bidding.
- Gloating over good results.
- Constant and gratuitous lessons and analyses at the table.
- Loud and disruptive arguing with a director's ruling.

If you experience someone exhibiting discourteous behavior or being other than civil, please call a tournament director immediately. If you feel that there was a very serious breech of discipline, in addition to the resolution by the tournament director at the table, please discuss the problem directly with the Director-in-Charge of the tournament.

Should it become necessary to call a tournament director, you may simply state: "This player is interfering with my enjoyment of the game."

The director will then attempt to determine the facts. If he establishes there was unacceptable behavior, an immediate 1/4-board disciplinary penalty (3 IMPs in team games) shall be assigned to all offenders.

This may involve any one or all four players at the table, regardless of who initiated the unacceptable behavior. If both members of a partnership are guilty, the penalties are cumulative (1/4 board each = 1/2 board or 3 IMPs each = 6

# Jack LaNoue

Grand Life Master Jack LaNoue died at Ochsner Foundation Hospital in New Orleans Sept. 6 of a staph infection that developed from a broken leg. He was 66.

LaNoue won the North American Open Pairs with Sidney Lazard in 1990 and was one of the most successful players in the Southeast. The longtime resident of the New Orleans area lived in Houston for about a year, leaving just ahead of Hurricane Katrina last year, but had returned to his home in Metairie not long before his death.

Friends Tom and Carolyn Peters of Grapeland TX said of LaNoue: "Jack will be missed by all who knew him — not only for his ability at the table but also for his great sense of humor and wonderful singing voice."

If it is determined that a second offense has occurred in the same event, the offender(s) shall be ejected from future competition in that event.

An offender removed from an event shall be deemed not to have played in the event, no masterpoints will be awarded and no refunds will be made.

In the case of a serious offense and in the case of multiple offenses (three) during a tournament, a disciplinary committee may determine whether the offender(s) should be allowed to play in other events at the tournament and/or whether additional sanctions may be appropriate.

While the director may issue a warning, directors are strongly encouraged to give penalties and a warning should be given only when there is no clear violation, where the facts cannot be clearly determined or there are mitigating circumstances. Offenders should receive an immediate penalty. Regardless of who may have initiated unacceptable behavior, all offenses are punishable. Retaliatory behavior is a punishable offense. Frivolous accusations will also be considered as offenses under this policy.

# Notice to players

Each player must have an ACBL convention card filled out and on the table. Please note that other types of convention cards,

such as the WBF convention card or homemade cards that do not sufficiently resemble the ACBL convention card, are not acceptable substitutes.

This procedure is intended to assure everyone that the playing field is level and that misbehavior will not be tolerated.

# New smoking policy

As of the first day of this tournament, a new law in Hawaii prohibits smoking in all enclosed or partially enclosed areas open to the public, including (but not limited to) restrooms, lobbies, reception areas, hallways, bars, hotel and motel rooms, lanais, restaurants, retail service establishments and retail stores.

This is the smoking policy for the Hilton Hawaiian Village, host to the Fall NABC:

As of Nov. 16, smoking will be prohibited in all Hilton Hawaiian Village guest rooms with the exception of Diamond Head Tower, floors 12 (Ewa only), 13 (Ewa only), 16 and 17, where smoking on lanais will be permitted.

# **Entry fees**

Players *must* be ACBL members whose service fees or dues are current in order to compete in any of the following nationally ranked events: Nail Life Master Open Pairs, Smith Life Master Women's Pairs, Reisinger Board-a-Match Teams, Keohane North American Swiss Teams, Kaplan Blue Ribbon Pairs, Mitchell Open Board-a-Match Teams, Marsha May Sternberg Women's Board-a-Match Teams and the Senior Knockouts. The entry fees for these contests are \$18 per player per session.

Players must also be current ACBL members to play in the Mini-Blue Ribbon Pairs, Miles Non-Life Master Pairs or National 99er Pairs. The entry fee is \$16.50 per player per session.

Regional championships are \$15.50 per player per session for ACBL members, \$17.50 for non-members.

All other events are \$14.50 per player per session for ACBL members, \$16.50 for non-members.

# Convention card reminder

Each player is required to have a convention card filled out legibly and on the table throughout a session. Both cards of a partnership must be identical and include the first and last names of each member of the partnership.

If a director determines that neither player has a substantially completed card, the partnership may play only the Standard American Yellow Card and may use only standard carding. This restriction may be lifted only at the beginning of a subsequent round after convention cards have been properly prepared and approved by the director. Further, the partnership will receive a 1/6 board matchpoint penalty for each board played, commencing with the next round and continuing until the restriction is lifted. In IMP team games, penalties shall be at the discretion of the director.

If the director determines the partnership has at least one substantially completed convention card but has not fully complied with ACBL regulations, the director may give warnings or assign such penalties as he deems to be appropriate under the circumstances.

The objective of these warnings and penalties is the encouragement of full compliance with ACBL regulations.

# **Tournament Terminology 101**

If you're confused by the terms used to describe the different types of bridge events played at clubs and tournaments, you're not alone. Here's a list of common bridge events with explanations.

Knockout Teams: an event in which a team (of four, five or six players -- with four playing at a time) plays another team. The losers are eliminated or "knocked out" while the winners play other winners until only one winning team remains.

The length of a KO match may vary from a single session to a full day (the Vanderbilt and Spingold) to a multi-day event (the Bermuda Bowl).

**Bracketed Knockout Teams**: a KO event in which teams are divided into groups -- usually of 8, 16 or 32 teams -- based on their masterpoint holdings. The top group -- Bracket I -- and all other groups compete in a separate event with their own set of winners.

**Compact Knockout Teams:** a shorter version of Bracketed KO teams.

**Swiss Teams:** an event in which a team (of four, five or six players -- with four playing at a time) plays other teams in seven-, eight- or nine-board matches. Team A sits North-South at Table 1 and East-West at Table 2 while Team B sits East-West at Table 1 and North-South at Table 2. The results are compared and scored by International Match Points (IMPs).

Pairings for the first round are random. Pairings for succeeding rounds are determined by a team's win-loss record or Victory Point total.

International Match Points (IMPs): the most common method of scoring Swiss Team matches. Scoring example: if Team A scores plus 620 for bidding and making 4\*S\* on a particular deal and Team B scores only plus 170 (they didn't bid the

game), the difference is 450 -- which converts to 10 IMPs. The IMP chart is shown on the inside of your convention card.

Victory Points (VPs): a method of scoring Swiss Team matches. After the scores are compared and converted to IMPs, the IMP total is converted to Victory Points. A team's VP total may be used to determine its next opponents and its final standing.

**Side Game Series:** a series of single-session pair games that pay red points. These series include at least three sessions and may have as many as six. You may play in as many sessions as you like, but only pairs who play in at least two sessions are eligible for overall gold points. Your best two sessions are used for determining overall winners

**Flighted pairs:** When flighting is used, the field is divided by expertise or experience or both into several separate games. Flight A -- "unlimited masterpoints" -- will be open to all players while the remaining flights will be limited. Flight B might be 0-500 MPs or 0-1000 MPs while Flight C might be 0-300 or 0-500.

Each flight is scored individually, and masterpoint awards are made for each flight.

The masterpoint holdings of the players determine their flight. If one player is quite expert while his partner is new to the game, the pair must compete in Flight A.

In flighted events, you may play up but not down. That means you may play in Flight A or Flight B even if your masterpoint holding qualifies you for Flight C. Conversely, you may not play in Flight B or Flight C if you are a Flight A player.

**Stratified Pairs:** The idea is to compete against everyone but to be ranked only with your peers.

Each pair is assigned a stratum or "strat" based on the masterpoint holding of the partner with more masterpoints.

Example: A = 1000 + masterpoints; B = 300 - 1000; C = 0 - 300.

Thus, the most experienced players are placed in Strat A, intermediate players in Strat B and less experienced players in Strat C. Masterpoints are awarded for placings in all strats but gold points are awarded only in A and B.

The game proceeds normally -- the difference comes when the scores are tabulated and ranked.

In a three-strat game, the scores are ranked three times. The first ranking is done as in a regular open game. These are the Strat A results.

If a B or C pair does well in this ranking, they receive full credit for that performance. It is not all that uncommon for a Strat C pair to place first overall, and they receive the full masterpoint award for that game.

Note: A pair is eligible for only one set of masterpoint awards and automatically receives the highest award.

The second ranking compares the scores of only the B and C pairs -- the scores of the Strat A pairs are eliminated. Once again, if a C pair does well, they receive points for their finishing position in the Strat B results.

The third and final ranking compares the scores of only the C pairs -- all the scores of the Strat A and B pairs are eliminated.

Strati-flighted Pairs: The top group plays in a game of their own -- Flight A. The rest of the field in divided into strats and plays as in a regular stratified pairs.

There can even be stratification within Flight A. Flight A may be listed as 3000+ MPs while Flight X may be listed as 0-3000 MPs.

# NAP/GNT conditions of contest

The North American Pairs and Grand National Teams were created initially with the expectation that players would play in and represent the districts in which they lived. They were to be "grass roots" events.

Over the past several years, implementation of this original intent has become increasingly difficult. This is especially true in the top flight of the GNT as expert partnerships are established over increasingly large geographical distances.

Partnerships in all flights were also affected mostly where districts abut one another.

In an effort to restore the integrity of the original intent to these two great events, the ACBL Board of Directors, after lengthy and extended deliberations over two years, has approved for implementation the following

Effective July 1, 2006 for the GNT 2006/2007

Effective April 1, 2007 for the NAP 2007/2008 event.

**GNT:** A member's principal physical residence as of Sept. 1 of the year prior to the National Final shall establish the district in which said member is eligible to participate beyond the club qualifying stage, if any.

**NAP:** A member's principal residence as of June 1 of the year prior to the National Final shall establish the district in which the member is eligible to participate beyond the club level, if any.

In order to ensure that each participant at the unit or district level understands that a participant is affirming his or her eligibility, entry forms for unit and district finals should include the

following statement: "By entering this event, I hereby certify, subject to penalties provided in the Conditions of Contest for the event and the ACBL Code of Disciplinary Regulations, that I am eligible to play in this event in this district."

It is expected that there will be virtually no exceptions to the residence requirements for participants in this event. A player seeking an exception must obtain permission in writing from the ACBL District Director representing the district in which the member has a principal residence and from the ACBL District Director representing the district in which the member wishes to play.

Both District Directors must approve the request for the exception to be granted. The player must begin this process by April 1 of the year prior to the National Final for the NAP and by July 1 of the year prior to the National Final for the GNT.

An ACBL Credentials Committee (CC), composed of ACBL Board members, has been established to clarify in which district a player is allowed to participate when said player's eligibility is in question. When a challenge to one's eligibility from a unit final stage or later stage has been made, the CC may request documentary evidence from the member whose eligibility is in question. If a member is unable to verify to the CC's satisfaction that he or she is playing in the district of principal residence, the CC shall automatically disqualify the member and his or her partner and teammates (if the event is the GNT).

When a member is disqualified by the CC, the CC may refer the matter to the ACBL President. Upon such referral, the ACBL President may make charges to the ACBL Disciplinary Committee in accordance with section 2.2.3 (d) of the ACBL Code of Disciplinary Regulations.

The ACBL recognizes that implementation of these measures may inconvenience some members who were granted exceptions for previous events. The general consensus, however, is that implementation and strict interpretation of these measures is necessary to restore the initial intention ("grass roots") and, therefore, integrity of application of the conditions of these events.
