Kids learn bridge while their parents play

Donna Compton loves to play bridge, but she felt "incredibly guilty" about leaving her children with a nanny just so she could play. And she knew many other people who had the same kind of problem. She decided to do something about it.

What did she do? All you have to do to find out is to listen outside Room 360. You'll hear a multitude of little voices talking about aces and kings and hearts and spades.

Donna started a day care center for children of bridge players at the Birmingham NABC a year ago. The youngsters, ranging from three months to 11 years, have a wonderful time. They engage in all sorts of activities, but the one they most enjoy is playing bridge like their mothers and fathers.

Playing bridge? That's right. Night before last Donna had three full tables in play.

Four three-year-olds were learning about cards – the pictures and the numbers and the suit symbols. They already knew that the ace was the highest, and they could put the cards in the right order from the ace down to the deuce. "Find all your aces," they were told, and quickly one of the youngsters jumped up and showed everybody the ace of hearts.

Some five and six-year-olds were learning about tricks – how the high card wins the trick. They also were learning how to deal and lead. They knew you had to have a high card in the suit led to win a trick.

The seven-year-olds were actually playing cards. Donna had them playing whist because they haven't learned how to bid yet. The dealer was allowed to name the trump after he finished dealing. They were carefully trying to win tricks, but they were being equally

USBF has major role in future of bridge

The United States Bridge Federation has been in existence for less than a year, but already the organization is deeply involved in a movement that could have a major impact on the future of the ACBL and bridge.

At stake: inclusion of bridge as an official sport in the Olympic Games.

Says Mike Becker, president of the USBF: "The idea of bridge becoming an Olympic sport might be every player's dream and would be the greatest thing to happen to bridge since the game was born."

The USBF was created by the ACBL and the American Bridge Association in early 2001 to conform to Olympic rules that each sport in a nation must be governed by a national organization. Thus, U.S. citizens who are also members in good standing of the ACBL and the ABA are now members of the USBF. No additional dues are required, but those who wish to compete in team trials must achieve status as Active USBF members (see the form at the end of this article).

Active USBF membership costs \$50 per year. Other rights also inure to Active USBF members: voting and office-seeking privileges as well as eligibility for subsidies for training and international play.

Eric Greco and Geoff Hampson led the field of 534 pairs in yesterday's Blue Ribbon Pairs qualifying sessions. The duo posted a score of 2151.26. Other leaders:

Sidney Lazard and Bart Bramley were second with 2146.30. Californians Kou-Ping Cheng and Jeffrey Hu were third with 2128.80. In fourth place with 2114.51 were the red hot Rose Meltzer and Peter Weichsel, while Meltzer's Bermuda Bowl teammate Lew Stansby, playing with wife JoAnna, was fifth with 2110.83.

267 pairs advanced to today's semifinal round.

Four remain in Senior KO

The teams captained by Dick Budd (#1 seed), Mike Levine (#2), Richard Gabriel (#3) and Hamish Bennett (#4) will do battle in today's semifinal action in the Senior Knockouts. Budd defeated Charlie Weed's team 130–78, while the Levine squad came from behind to defeat the team led by John Onstott 123–113.

Gabriel upset the team captained by Ed Lazarus to become the #3 seed. Bennett easily handled Joe Harris' team, winning 153–51 in three quarters.

The opening lead is the ♣K. Not content to leave well enough alone, your loving partner gives you one little boost. Now you have to play at the three level to justify his confidence in you.

West continues with the ♣Q and the ♣J, East playing the 5, 4 and 3, in that order. At trick four West shifts to the inevitable low heart. Which heart do you play from dummy, and worse, why? Thanks to Eddie Kantar for the problem.

Approved defenses to Mid-Chart methods

Players who use methods allowed under the Mid-Chart (permitted in NABC+ events, unrestricted Flight A regionally rated and any bracket of a bracketed KO which contains no team with a bracket designator of less than 1000 masterpoints) are responsible for providing an approved defense from the online ACBL Defense database to those methods.

Since this regulation just recently went into effect, copies of the approved defenses may be available at the supply tables (while supplies last). In the future, players will be responsible for downloading these defenses prior to the events in which they are to be used.

If you want to play Mid-Chart methods, download the appropriate defenses in advance.

Smoking policy

This is Las Vegas, so smoking regulations are very lenient in hotels and casinos. But remember that once you cross into the convention area of the Hilton, you are in ACBL country and there is no smoking in the playing areas or pre-function areas. If you are playing in any Pavilion room or the Barron or Conrad rooms, the fastest smoking access is outside on the patio. Those playing in the ballroom may want to head toward the casino for a smoking break.

The ACBL Board of Directors established the USBF and appointed the directors: Becker, Bruce Reeve, who represents District 7 on the ACBL Board; Dan Morse, District 16 representative to the ACBL Board; the ACBL's chief executive officer (currently Wayne Hascall); Nick Nickell, Shawn Quinn and Alan Popkin, ACBL members, and Arnold Jones and Robert Friend of the ABA.

Becker says the USBF board will be elected by Active USBF members starting in 2003.

The USBF president says that while the World Bridge Federation is lobbying the International Olympic Committee for recognition of bridge as an official sport, the USBF has been attempting to persuade the United States Olympic Committee to recognize the game officially, as has been done in Canada thanks to the efforts of the Canadian Bridge Federation.

Becker says the first application to the USOC for status as a sport was turned down, but the USOC has begun a review to define what is an Olympic sport and may create a new membership class which could include bridge. That, Becker says, is a good sign. "We've got them thinking about something they hadn't thought about before."

An encouraging step in the WBF's campaign will occur just prior to the Winter Games in Salt Lake City in February, when the WBF will stage a series of exhibition matches to give Olympic Games officials a closer look at bridge. The event will be the fourth annual IOC Grand Prix, previously put on in Lausanne, Switzerland, where the IOC has headquarters.

Now that most of the organizational tasks of establishing the USBF are behind the group, Becker says, they can concentrate on some of their goals:

- Getting a USBF web site up and operational by early 2002.
- Organizing charity events to raise funds for the USBF.
- Finding a sponsor or benefactor for the team trials or for the teams representing the U.S. in international play.
- Paying off a \$50,000 loan from the ACBL that helped the USBF get started.

Becker says recognition of bridge as an Olympic sport would change the future of bridge overnight. "The benefits are unbelievably huge," he says. "Young people would start playing the game again, and people would be proud to play a game that is an Olympic sport. I wouldn't be surprised if our membership doubled. It's really worth the expense of forming this organization if there's a chance of that happening. If we didn't try, we'd always wonder what if."

Avoiding Disaster

By far the most interesting hand for me on the first day of the tournament was Board 1 of the evening session:

At three tables in the Life Master Pairs, East doubled North's 1NT opener and South redoubled, ending the auction. A comic opening lead of the ♠J (fourth best!) was enjoyed by three pairs: Annette and Sidney Caron of Northfield, IL; Richard Zillman and Jose Tharayil of Winnipeg, MB; and the partnership of Tanakorn Lavanakul, Dublin, CA, and Shelley Lapkoff, Berkeley, CA.

This somewhat standard redouble leads to many disasters. When 1NT redoubled goes down while small slams or grand slams could be made in two or three strains, something needs to be changed. Here's an approach I like:

When two-suited (or three-suited) run-outs are used over the double to show the lower or lowest suit, a pass is used to force opening bidder to reopen the bidding with a redouble (or 2♣ showing a five-card suit or 2♦ showing a six-card suit). Responder then can bid his single-suited hand. Using this type of run-out system, the bid of 2♠ over the double is an idle bid, which can be used as a general game force. Credit for this system goes to a former partner, the late Ron Andersen, who once exclaimed, "I'm tired of going down in 1NT redoubled when I can make slam in three suits!"

Investigation of the frequency chart below reveals 21 different results on this board! There were many spade sacrifices at the three, four, five, six and seven levels. There's a stripe-tailed ape double of 4♥. One South was passed out in what he thought was a forcing 2♥. Another South was passed out in 4♣ in what he thought was Gerber. A leap to a 4♣ Exclusion Blackwood was also passed out for minus 250. And two Norths pushed on to 7NT after South cuebid spades and East had sacrificed in 7♠ over 7♥.

At our table, East passed over partner's 1NT, and I bid 2NT showing a club bust or a strong three-suiter. After partner bid the required 3♣, East then bid a belated 3♠! I pondered why East had not bid 2♠ or 3♣ directly over 1NT. Apparently he had a solid seven-card suit and was prepared to lead it over 1NT. If East had 10 high-card points from solid spade honors, then North had the remaining 15 points and we could make a grand slam in some suit. A cuebid of 4♣ showed my short suit and partner bid 5♥, preferring the major suit over the minor. 7♥ was probably cold, but I feared that East had an automatic 7♠ sacrifice for only -800,

since I expected the ♥s to be 3-1. So I tried to maximize our matchpoints by bidding the small slam. If East then saved at 6♦, I planned on taking the "reluctant" push to 7♥, hoping that East would not save against that bidding sequence.

The following chart shows the contracts and a matchpointing across the entire field of 260 pairs along with the frequency of the results:

careful not to waste a trump or a high card when it looked as if their partner could win the trick. The match came out even – each pair won two hands.

One of the youngsters looked at his hand, then walked around the table and whispered to his partner, "I've got the ace of spades. That's a good card."

Yesterday Donna noticed Jackie Pettis, Beth Palmer's seven-year-old daughter, talking to three-year-old Jennifer Molson, daughter of Janice Seamon-Molson. She asked Jackie what she was doing. "I'm teaching Jennifer to play bridge," Jackie answered.

The advanced foursome consisted of Kevin Rosenberg playing with Sean Tamlyn and Andrew Boyer partnered by Morgan Compton, Donna's daughter.

The youngsters don't play cards all the time – Donna ships 15 boxes of toys to each tournament. They go on field trips and they frequently get to play outdoors. They love to dress up, and they love to have parties. In fact they're going to have a pizza party tomorrow night. And they had a special Thanksgiving dinner last night.

The ACBL Board provides a room for child care at each tournament. They okayed the child-care idea when Donna explained that more mothers would attend and play and more kids would get to love the game instead of hating it because their parents were always playing bridge and talking about bridge.

"I see this as an opportunity to show kids the wonders of cards, the wonders of bridge," said Donna. "The card games really get the children's attention. The kids come to us shortly after noon and they stay until their parents pick them up about midnight. That's a problem sometimes – the kids don't want to go – they went to keep on playing cards."

Even the baby sitters are getting interested in bridge. They find the kids' enthusiasm infectious.

There were 17 youngsters there yesterday, and there will be as many as 25 over the weekend. Two are only six months old – "I'm going to get cards in their hands as soon as I can," said Donna. Lots of parents are enjoying playing bridge here without any guilt feelings.

(1) East dropped the ♠A on the table.

The Facts: 5♦ made five, +400 for East-West. The opening lead was the ♥A. The Director was called when the ♠A was dropped on the table and West was required to pass (penalty) for one round (Law 24B). North-South complained that the ♠A made it easier for West to bid game. The Director ruled that with the diamond raise and 4♣ "game try," bidding only 4♦ was not a logical alternative for West and that the unauthorized information that East held the ♠A was irrelevant. The table result was allowed to stand (Law 16A).

The Appeal: North-South appealed the Director's ruling. North did not attend the hearing. North-South believed that knowledge of the ♠A made it easier for West to bid 5♦ since the combination of the ♠A and club values were a fantastic fit. East-West were a new partnership. They had not discussed actions over two-suited interference. West believed her hand evaluated to 17-18 points with diamonds as trump so after her partner's game try bidding was automatic.

The opening lead is the ♣K. West continues with the ♣Q and the ♣J, East playing the 5, 4 and 3, in that order. At trick four West shifts to a low heart. Which heart do you play from dummy, and why?

Here's Kantar's answer:

You have to make one assumption before you play any card from the dummy — you must assume the ♠K is on sides or else the contract is, for practical purposes, unmakeable. Therefore, place the ♠K in the West hand. If that is the case, then East must have the ♥A, as West would have opened the bidding had he that card.

Consequently, the proper play from dummy is the ♥J. You think and play so beautifully.

The Committee Decision: The first issue the Committee discussed was whether the exposed card was unauthorized information to West. Law 24 (Card Exposed or Led During Auction Period) avoids the issue for the side that eventually declares. However, Law 16 states "Players are authorized to base their calls and plays on information from legal calls and or plays...To base a call or play on other extraneous information may be an infraction." The Committee then turned to the question of whether the unauthorized information directly suggested that 5♦ would be more successful than bidding 4♦ and decided that it would. However, the Committee also decided that bidding only 4♦ with the West cards and without unauthorized information would not be seriously considered by West's peers. Therefore, 4♦ was not deemed to be a logical alternative. The table result was allowed to stand.

The Facts: 4♣ made four, +420 for East-West. The opening lead was the ♣7. The Director was called after the 3♣ bid. North believed it took West 25 seconds to pass; East-West believed it took 5 seconds. The Director ruled there had been a break in tempo. The contract was changed to 3♦ made four, +130 for North-South.

The Appeal: East-West appealed the Director's ruling. North's 1NT was Alerted; then the Alert was withdrawn as South commented: "I guess there is no Alert since he is a passed hand." South bid 3♦ and a questioning period began by West, which also included an explanation by North that the 3♦ bid was weak. West finally passed. There was a dispute as to the length of time between the completion of questioning and the pass. East-West stated that the table Director never asked them to quantify the alleged break in tempo but had just said to proceed with the auction and call again if there was a problem. (The Committee made every effort to reach the table Director and was unable to do so. The Committee chair requested that the table Director provide more detailed information on the appeal form than was provided here if he will not be available at the hearing if needed.) East said that a preemptive bid on his left and a passed hand on his right made bidding 3♣ the only alternative. East-West were playing support doubles.

The Committee Decision: The Committee found that there was a high probability that a hesitation had occurred and that the questioning in and of itself also conveyed information. South's 3♦ bid facing a passed hand was merely bidding to the desired level he was willing to play. The Committee thought that an East who did not choose to call over 1NT (double, 2♣ or 2♠) might not bid at the three level without the unauthorized information. Therefore pass was a logical alternative. The Committee next addressed the Director ruling that ten tricks would be the result in 3♦ with a spade lead. The Committee determined that the most logical lead was a low club, resulting in a heart shift and only nine tricks for declarer. Therefore, the contract was changed to 3♦ made three, +110 for North-South. This appeal was determined to have substantial merit since the Committee had changed the result on the board and there had been confusion over the withdrawn Alert.

The Facts: 4♣ went down two, +100 for East-West. The opening lead was the ♥J. The Director was called at the end of the auction when North explained that there had been a failure to Alert the transfer. West did not change her final call. East said he would have doubled 4♣ with the correct information. The Director allowed the table result to stand since a second double also seemed clear also at the time of the 4♣ bid (double of 4♥ was value showing).

The Appeal: East-West appealed the Director's ruling and were the only players that attended the hearing. East-West had discussed methods for actions after a transfer. Without the Alert, East believed that there could be confusion of the meaning of a double of 4♣ where there would not have been had he been properly Alerted. Without a double by partner, West was unsure that she could defeat 4♣ or that her side could bid successfully at the five level.

The Committee Decision: The Committee could not find a legal basis for protecting pairs whose methods depend on proper Alerts by the opponents. Therefore, the table result was allowed to stand. The North-South pair, however clearly violated proper procedure by failing to Alert 4♥. Since the Committee believed strongly that players should be held to a very high stan-

Declarer exited with a club. East won the king, cashed the ♠10 (West pitching a diamond) and exited with a diamond. West ruffed with the jack, overruffed by declarer who now exited with the ♠8. East won the 9, but declarer scored the last two tricks with the A-10 of spades over West's Q-6. Plus 140.

The result, however, was a tie. The defense at the other table played another heart at trick two allowing declarer to establish the diamonds for a club pitch.

Overkill

Sometimes board-a-match produces overkill when both tables produce spectacularly good (or bad) results. A little list of system discussions sometimes yields worthwhile results. Look at this board for example:

JoAnna Stansby and I had agreed that redouble would be "rescue" here. 2♦ suggested five good diamonds or better, and the pass of 2♦ doubled suggested tolerance.

North led a top club, then guessed reasonably to lead the ♦A and another diamond. Now I had only one trump loser, but with six potential losers I needed to do something with the spades. Since South had not shown much in the way of high cards, he figured to have the ♠K. So I led the ♠Q from dummy and that set up the ♠10 8 for my eighth trick eventually. Plus 180 looked decent enough.

In the other room, however, their Michaels decision did not go as far as ours. The bidding went 1♣—2♣—Dbl—All Pass. For some reason the 3-1 fit didn't play nearly as well as the 6-2 diamond fit — down 1700! A huge win at both tables.

Declarer, Zia, went up with ace and passed the ♦8! Ferguson took the 10 and led the ♠9. Zia rose with the king and finessed to the ♠Q. Ferguson won and led a club for partner to take two tricks in the suit. Down two. It seemed like a fine result, but

At the other table, the opening lead was the ♣9. Declarer Rick Whitworth won in dummy with the ace and took a finesse to the ♦Q, which won. He got back to dummy with the ♠A and finessed in diamonds again, but this time West, David Berkowitz, won the king. Now declarer was down three — he took only two diamonds, two clubs, a heart and a spade.

What made the difference? Zia's finesse of the ♦8. This enabled him to take three diamonds to go with two clubs and one each in the majors. Nice play — the sort you expect from Zia.



Jacobs goes for 2nd Herman Trophy

George Jacobs was the 2000 winner of the Herman Trophy, awarded to the ACBL member who earns the most masterpoints at the Fall NABC. Jacobs tallied 365.22 points at the Birmingham NABC, slightly outscoring regular partner Ralph Katz.

Jacobs was a member of the winning team in the Reisinger Board-a-Match Teams, earned 225 masterpoints. He was third in the Open Board-a-Match Teams (78.75 points), 14th in the Edgar Kaplan Blue Ribbon Pairs (49.57 points) and 37th in the Life Master Open Pairs (11.90 points).

Norwegian expert Geir Helgemo holds the Herman Trophy record: 449.37 masterpoints won at the 1999 Fall NABC in Boston. Helgemo won two nationally rated events (the Open Board-a-Match Teams and the Reisinger Board-a-Match Teams, both with partner Tony Forrester and teammates Rita Shugart and Andrew Robson) and finished well in a third (sixth in the Blue Ribbon Pairs with Richard Freeman).

With his performance, Helgemo broke the record set by Michael Rosenberg who won 445.77 points at the Fall NABC in San Francisco in 1996. Zia won 412.75 points at the same tournament and was second.

Jeff Meckstroth was the first player to score 400 or more points at an NABC, racking up 407.77 points at the 1995 Fall NABC in Atlanta. That record lasted only one year.

The Herman trophy was donated in 1951 by Sally Lipton, formerly Mrs. Lou Herman, in memory of Lou Herman (1908-1950), a Houston jeweler who was Life Master #218. Mrs. Lipton was a member of the ACBL office staff in New York and an ACBL tournament director.
