Five all-time greats were inducted into the Bridge Hall of Fame at last night's Hall of Fame dinner. Peter Weichsel made the grade in his first year of eligibility because of his amazing record. Jimmy Maier and Harold Harkavy, stars from many years ago, were recognized as the von Zedtwitz Award winners for their outstanding performances many decades ago. Amalya Kearsse and Jeff Rubens were honored with the Blackwood Award for their tremendous contributions to the game.

Also honored was Lynn Deas as the Sidney Lazard Jr. Sportsperson of the Year.

Zia Mahmood did a great job as master of ceremonies.

### Peter Weichsel

It was a family affair for Weichsel. On hand were his wife Marcia, his brother John and his two children, and his two stepsons, Craig and Reed. The family is going to grow by one tomorrow – brother John will marry Dee Stanton tomorrow.

Alan Sontag was due to be the introducer for Weichsel, but Zia preempted Sontag, saying, "Peter is a fighter – he has never given less than his best."

Then Sontag took over. "He's my favorite partner. We're like an old married couple – married, divorced and then married again. Peter is fierce, intractable and tough."

Sontag told about the time he and Weichsel helped Al and Rita Rand to get to the semifinals of the Spingold. Sontag thought sure there would be a

## New Yorkers going strong in Flight C

New York teams from Districts 3 and 24 are ready for their quarterfinal matches this afternoon in Flight C of the Grand Nationals. David Huber of Tarrytown NY, the District 3 captain, will lead his squad against District 19, the only Canadian team remaining. District 24, headed by Ryan Connors of Chester NJ, will oppose District 13, a team from the Chicago area. Connors is from New Jersey but his teammates are all New Yorkers.

It's East vs. West as District 7 (the Carolinas) takes on District 21 (central California). The other match pairs District 12 (Michigan) against District 25 (western Massachusetts).

## Semifinals for GNT, Flight A

Teams from Districts 12, 25, 8 and 6 will square off today in the semifinal round of the Grand National Teams, Flight A.

The squads, by captain, are Mark Leonard (District 12), James Rasmussen (25), Michael Halvorsen (8) and Marshall Kushner (6).

The pairings are Leonard versus Rasmussen and Halvorsen against Kushner. The event will conclude Saturday.

bonus and a good contract for their fine showing. "Not only was there no bonus – we got fired!"

Weichsel told about his mother, whom he described as the worst bridge player in history. "But she was smart. One time I had to play with her to fill out the movement, and she raised me every time I bid. She'd raise me with a doubleton, a singleton and even a void. But somehow it all worked out and we won! Mother was ecstatic, and I consider that to be my greatest achievement in bridge."

Weichsel said there's something magical about his partnership with Sontag. He also paid high tribute to Rose Meltzer, who has a world championship to her credit as a teammate of Weichsel.

### Amalya Kears

Jacqui Mitchell feels it's a feather in the cap for everyone because Kears has become a member of the Hall of Fame. "It's an honor that was long overdue."

Mitchell let us in on a couple of stories about Kears that weren't exactly judicial. "Did you know Amalya won the hula hoop contest when she was at Wellesley College? That's right. She swung those hips until she had it just right." That's not quite how it was. Actually Kears was rolling the hula hoop. "But not only did she win," said Jacqui. "She actually practiced!"

Then there was the time she was all hot and sweaty from a tennis match. "Is the match over?" someone asked her. "No way," she said, "he's ahead." Jacqui said that sounded OK until she discovered that the "he" was a 10-year-old cousin.

Kears says the best way to get known is to do something big outside your own field. "In the judicial world, I'm known as the judge who plays bridge."

She got into bridge writing because someone told her that "Bridge a la Une," a French book by Jose LeDentu, was perhaps the best book on bridge. She agreed when she read it, and she decided to translate it into English. Later she had the pleasure of meeting LeDentu, and they co-produced the book in English. "We corresponded in French, but we talked in English."

She believes bridge is the quintessence of the spirit of Olympic sport. "We can play together, so we should be able to work together," she said.

### Jeff Rubens

"Some young boys grow up with 'Playboy,' but I grew up with 'The Bridge World,'" said Larry Cohen as he introduced Rubens. "His writings on bridge are mind-boggling. His footprint is on everything that gets into his magazine."

"But he's very stingy with exclamation points. I almost have to sign my life away to get him to let me put an exclamation point after a bid."

"Jeff ended his playing career too soon. He was a fine player – he even played in the Bermuda Bowl in 1973 with B. Jay Becker."

When Rubens took the mike, he told of interesting experiences he has had all his life with partners, teammates, opponents, acquaintances, editors, co-authors, contributors, business associates and correspondents. "We all have one thing in common – the love of the game," he said.

Bob Mosher, who used to play with Rubens

long ago, was on hand to congratulate Rubens. "It's the first time I've seen Jeff in 40 years."

### Jimmy Maier

"The greats often die young," said Alan Truscott as he told about Maier.

"Maier was great at anything he tried to do. He was a fine scholar and he was a tennis star when he was only 19. His bridge was so good that he was asked to join the Four Aces when Michael Gottlieb resigned from the team in 1936.

"They were headed for the first world championship tournament back in 1937, but Ely Culbertson got into it. He insisted that the team be called representatives of the Culbertson System. That was too much, so the Four Aces refused to go."

Maier suffered a heart ailment in 1941 and died two months later at the age of 33.

Arthur Maier, his cousin, represented the family at last night's festivities. He was accompanied by his wife Susan.

### Harold Harkavy

"I never saw Harry Harkavy make a mistake," said Richard Freeman about his old friend. "I remember the time everyone in the North-South field was playing one notrump and making either 90 or 120. But Harry made plus 600. What's so unusual about that? Harold was sitting East-West!"

Harkavy had many triumphs to his credit when he developed pancreatitis at the age of 50. He died a short time later. His best year was 1963 when he won both the Vanderbilt and the Spingold. He also triumphed in the Chicago (now the Reisinger) in 1952, and he was a victor in the Master Mixed Teams four times. He had a reputation for being particularly deadly when it came to opening leads.

### Lynn Deas

Beth Palmer and Deas began their partnership 24 years ago. "Lynn is a very strong person," said Palmer. "She has consistently shown courage and valor. She has shown just how competitive she is by the way she has overcome the adversity her health has given her."

She told about the time during the 1989 Venice Cup in Australia when the Americans were down 86 IMPs against the Dutch. "Some of the players were discouraged," said Palmer, "but not Lynn."

"We can get it back," she said – and we did."

Deas expressed thanks for the award, but she gave all the credit to her partners and teammates.

## Membership meeting during BOG session

The annual ACBL Membership Meeting, originally scheduled for 11:30 a.m. Sunday, will occur during the Board of Governors Meeting, starting at 9:30 a.m. Sunday. The Membership Meeting will begin at approximately 9:45 a.m. The meetings will take place in the Grand Ballroom.

## Entries

For all North American championships with no upper masterpoint limit, the entry fee is \$16.50 per session. All other North American championships will be \$15 per session. Only ACBL members are eligible to play in these events.

The fee for members in regionals events is \$14, but non-members must pay \$16.

All other events are \$13 for members, \$15 for non-members.

ACBL members are invited to submit names for consideration for nomination to the ACBL Bridge Hall of Fame. Send e-mails to halloffame@acbl.org.

Proposals will be accepted July 1 through Sept. 30. You may also e-mail to the same address if you have questions or would like to know the criteria for induction into the Hall of Fame.

## Monitoring

At this and future North American Championships, ACBL will be monitoring NABC+ events with visible, real-time cameras. The images will be recorded and will be available for later official inspection and review.

By general monitoring of the session and participants' behavior, ACBL has another source of information that may be useful in determining facts and settling issues arising from some types of ethical and behavioral complaints or actions. This procedure is intended to assure everyone that the playing field is level and that misbehavior will not be tolerated.

## Pre-Alert forms

If your partnership plays special overcalls, you must fill out a pre-Alert/disclosure form and make it available to your opponents when you play in events that allow Mid-Chart and Super-Chart conventions.

This applies to NABC+, regional or higher knockouts and Flight A Swiss games. Look for the light blue forms on the table where convention cards are available.

## Turn 'em off

Cell phones, audible pagers or any similar communication equipment may not be operated or operable in the playing area during a session of play at NABCs except for health-related equipment or by permission of the director-in-charge of the tournament or event.

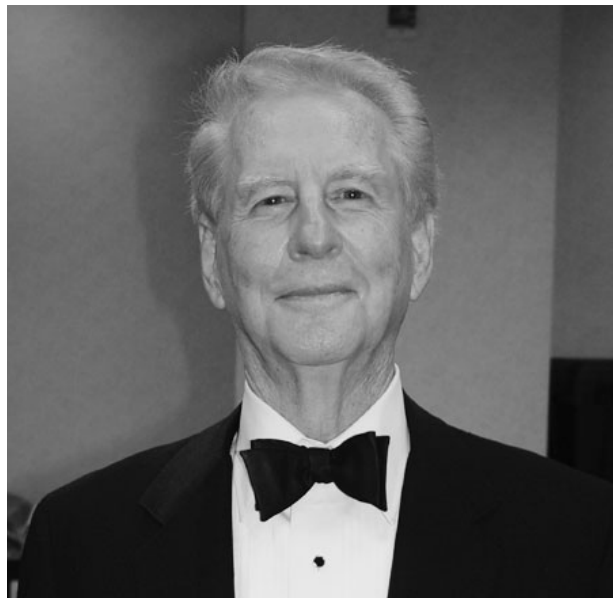

## Beauty and the Beast

By George Retek

Are you playing bridge to enjoy the beauty of the game or to prove that you are always right?

During the recent Canadian National Team Championships, this hand provided several interesting elements.

You are South on lead with this hand

♠K J 10 8 ♥9 7 ♦5 3 ♣10 8 6 5 2

after this auction

West	North	East	South
		1NT	Pass
2♣	Pass	3♠	(1)Pass
3NT	All Pass		

(1) Maximum with five spades and three hearts.

It sounds like a club lead is called for. Would you lead your third-, fourth- or fifth-best (depending on partnership style), or second highest, hoping that partner will switch to another suit (spades?) when he gets in?

At the table where a low club was led, partner played the ♣K at trick one and later was eager to try to establish the suit by returning it each time he got in, even to the extent of ignoring a standard defensive play of ducking on the first lead of a key suit.

The lead was duplicated at the other table, but the opening leader, using the Smith echo, indicated he was not really crazy about his opening lead, making it easier for partner to find the key ducking play. The effect of leading the ♣8 would have been the same, of course.

Now to the post mortem discussion. Is it beneficial to start by saying: "How could we lose 12 IMPs when the contract was ice cold?" Or: "Do you think I am a moron to go down in a solid contract?"

Having respect for feelings of our teammates is more important in the long run than proving that one is right in the technical aspects of our game that we love to analyze so dearly.

A question for the bridge connoisseur: can declarer succeed even if North ducks the ♦J at trick two and switches to a spade later?

## Convention card reminder

Each player is required to have a convention card filled out legibly and on the table throughout a session. Both partnership cards must be identical. Both must include the first and last names of each member of the partnership.

If a director determines that neither player has a substantially completed card, the partnership may play only the Standard American Yellow Card and may use only standard carding. This restriction may be lifted only at the beginning of a subsequent round after convention cards have been properly prepared and approved by the director.

Further, the partnership will receive a 1/6 board matchpoint penalty for each board played, commencing with the next round and continuing until the restriction is lifted. In IMP team games, penalties shall be at the discretion of the director.

If the director determines the partnership has at least one substantially completed convention card but has not fully complied with ACBL regulations, the director may give warnings or assign such penalties as he deems appropriate under the circumstances.

The objective of these warnings and penalties is the encouragement of full compliance with ACBL regulations.
