Gail Greenberg

Greenberg was overwhelmed when her four children told about life with mother. "I'm moved beyond words," she said. "This is the most meaningful moment of my life."

Says Sophia Liu, 12: "It's fun to beat people."

Vivian Xu, 13, was also enjoying herself, noting that bridge "helps me with my math, and it's fun when I don't have anything to do."

Jones has been playing bridge about seven years. She learned the game at a public library in New York, moving into duplicate practically right away. "I'm still a baby bridge player," she says,

Donna was passionate about the game. She couldn't wait to try a new convention, although with Donna it was usually an unconventional application. She was an extraordinary woman who played bridge the way she lived: to the fullest, with

vigor, sensitivity, exuberance — and often by her own rules.

For those who knew her, she will be forever loved and missed. For those who did not have the privilege, it should be comforting to know that you are involved in a game that helped sustain the quality of life for a very special woman.

Snip, snip

David Berkowitz and Larry Cohen are great players, especially in pair games. As Jay Apfelbaum can tell you, however, they put their pants on one leg at a time just like the rest of us. The following deal from the second qualifying session of the Life Master Pairs is a case in point. Apfelbaum was playing with Ruth Grant.

Berkowitz started with the ♦K, switching to his singleton club at trick two. The plan, as you can see, was to win one of his high trumps, then put Cohen in with a heart so that he could ruff a club.

Apfelbaum correctly read the situation, however, and he made the only play to keep from going down: he played the ♦Q at trick two, tossing his ♥Q. Berkowitz won the ♦A, but after the Scissors Coup he had no way to reach Cohen's hand.

The club ruff went away and Apfelbaum ended up with plus 530 for making 3♠ doubled, curiously good for only 19 out of 25 matchpoints. Had Berkowitz and Cohen managed plus 100, that would have been worth 21 out of 25 matchpoints.

As you can see, an initial club lead by North would have been sufficient to defeat the contract. There would have been no Scissors Coup available to Apfelbaum.

Convention card reminder

Each player is required to have a convention card filled out legibly and on the table throughout a session. Both partnership cards must be identical. Both must include the first and last names of each member of the partnership.

If a director determines that neither player has a substantially completed card, the partnership may play only the Standard American Yellow Card and may use only standard carding. This restriction may be lifted only at the beginning of a subsequent round after convention cards have been properly prepared and approved by the director.

Further, the partnership will receive a 1/6 board matchpoint penalty for each board played, commencing with the next round and continuing until the restriction is lifted. In IMP team games, penalties shall be at the discretion of the director.

If the director determines the partnership has at least one substantially completed convention card but has not fully complied with ACBL regulations, the director may give warnings or assign such penalties as he deems appropriate under the circumstances.

The objective of these warnings and penalties is the encouragement of full compliance with ACBL regulations.

bridge,” said Jill Levin. “We played other card games, but not bridge. When I was skiing, they were looking for a fourth for bridge, and they knew my mother was a world champion. So they thought that meant I knew how to play. I agreed to play as long as long as I could ski for free.”

Once she asked her mother what she should do when her partner opened 4♦. “Should I bid five or six?”

“Neither,” said Gail. “That’s a weak bid.”

“Not the way we play,” said Jill. “So she finally taught me to play.”

“I’m the only one who listened to my mother,” said Penny Shane. “I became a lawyer instead of playing bridge. Mother told me to find something I love and then do it as much as possible – and that’s what I did.”

Penny said that her mother used bridge to help others – “she has helped them to extend the life of their minds.”

“My mother is a truly great teacher,” said Brad Moss. “She has the uncanny ability to make each student believe they are being taught one-on-one.” He said he often thinks, “How would Mom handle this?” when he faces a problem.

Andrew Moss told his mother a long-kept secret – sometimes the children played bridge in secret so their mother wouldn’t know what they were doing. “She’s done a great job raising four children while having a highly decorated career.”

Joan Gerard

Bobby Wolff told how Joan Gerard first brought her skills to her unit, then her district and then to the ACBL. “But she didn’t stop there – she went on to the World Bridge Federation where she became the only woman to be named to the Committee of Honor.” He told about her outstanding work with the Junior program. “She’s one of the hardest workers we ever had on the ACBL Board.”

Barbara Nudelman told about how the Three Witches came to be. “Joan, Jayne Thomas and I got started together in 1980 and we bonded. We worked together and played together. It’s been great.”

As she accepted her award, Joan offered this tidbit. “Alan Truscott wrote about my marriage to Ron Gerard, saying that a bridge player married a bridge administrator. My question for Alan was which is which?”

Leonard Harmon

Probably most of those present didn’t really know who Leonard Harmon is, but the old-timers remembered. He was one of the best in the Fifties and Sixties.

Ivar Stakgold, his regular partner in the old days, remembered the time he and Lennie stopped in 3NT in the Vanderbilt while Al Roth and Tobias Stone got to a slam that went down because of a bad trump break. When Harmon got the trophy, Roth asked if he could be the first to spit in it.

Stakgold also told how Lennie helped Edgar Kaplan and Freddy Sheinwold to perfect the Kaplan-Sheinwold bidding system. “It was such a good feeling when we won the Vanderbilt in 1958, defeating Edgar and Freddy in the final.”

Bill Eisenberg, who was a regular partner of Harmon’s until he joined the Aces, was present also but did not speak because of time pressures.

Alan Truscott

Have you ever been around Alan Truscott when he is relaxed and feels like singing? Phillip Alder wondered how Alan ever remembered so many words and verses. Alan is capable of going on forever with these ditties, all of which are richly humorous.

Alan has been a major force in New York bridge over the years, but not just because of his position as bridge editor of the *New York Times*. He has worked hard for the New York unit, come up with great ideas like the Battle of the Sexes, and conceived and worked up many other promotions.

Phillip told about Alan’s adjectival bidding system. “You are allowed one adjective with each bid. So you could open with one marginal 1♥ and hear an opponent overcall one strong 1♠. Sounds interesting.”

Celebrate Goodwill throughout ACBL

Aileen Osofsky, chairman of the Goodwill Committee, wants to have Goodwill Day celebrated throughout the ACBL, not just at NABCs. She suggested the idea yesterday at the Goodwill reception.

They can teach, but they can play, too

Our team consisted of four bridge teachers who came to town for the American Bridge Teachers Association conference. They'll be telling their students how they gained 18 IMPs on a single deal when they go home. The deal is from the Saturday evening Swiss Teams.

I was playing with Joyce Penn of Columbus OH. At favorable vulnerability North preempted 3♣. Joyce felt she was strong enough to overcall, and I had no trouble going to game with my singleton ♣A, good diamonds and good hearts.

South cashed the ♠A, and Joyce ruffed the second spade. She cashed the trump ace, crossed to the ♣A and took the marked trump finesse. The hearts broke so declarer didn't even have to ruff her fourth heart. Making six for plus 950.

Brenda Simpson was North and Kris Motoyoski was South.

Is this the same hand? Brenda didn't preempt. East reopened with a double, but West thought that five trumps might give declarer some problems. As they say in Jamaica, no problem.

West cashed the ♣A and switched to a diamond, but South ruffed East's ace. She drew trumps and took dummy's ♣K and ran the club suit -12 tricks. That was plus 870 and 18 IMPs.

Monitoring

At this and future North American Championships, ACBL will be monitoring NABC+ events with visible, real-time cameras. The images will be recorded and will be available for later official inspection and review.

By general monitoring of the session and participants' behavior, ACBL has another source of information that may be useful in determining facts and settling issues arising from some types of ethical and behavioral complaints or actions. This procedure is intended to assure everyone that the playing field is level and that misbehavior will not be tolerated.

Turn 'em off

Cell phones, audible pagers or any similar communication equipment may not be operated or operable in the playing area during a session of play at NABCs except for health-related equipment or by permission of the director-in-charge of the tournament or event.

Notice to players

Each player must have an ACBL convention card filled out and on the table. Other types of convention cards, such as the WBF convention card or homemade cards that do not sufficiently resemble the ACBL convention card, are not acceptable substitutes.

"but I love the game."

All her talk about bridge made her students at Middle School 158 take notice, and she now conducts bridge classes for them after school for four hours a week in her regular classroom.

"They're having a great time," Jones says.

The youngsters back her up on that.

"I like bridge because it's like a hobby, and it helps me in logic," says Julie Kim, 13.

Angel Yim, 12, shows wisdom beyond her years in pronouncing: "It's mostly about partnership, and it's fun to work together - plus, it's cool to win."

Michael Zhang, 13, adds: "It helps my memory and it's really fun." Zhang, attending his first tournament, notes: "It's really exciting."

Besides teaching bridge, Jones is also involved in bridge administration. She is a member of the Nassau Suffolk Bridge Association board of directors. She sells bridge whenever she can.

"The game," she says, "allows you to be in control. When you are bidding and playing, your mind can't be anywhere else."

In her bridge classes, she notes, "all of life's lessons are learned there."

The Law of Symmetry

I know several top players who believe that when you have a big fit in one suit, combined with a shortage elsewhere, it is likely that the deal will contain other shortages.

Take a look at this:

East led the ♣K and declarer won and played a diamond to the 9 and queen. East tried to cash the ♣Q and declarer, noting the fall of West's ♣J, paused to take stock.

East's opening bid, combined with West's pass, suggested that diamonds were at least 4-5. Clubs were clearly 5-2. So, was East dealt two spades or one?

If you believe in the Law of Symmetry, you will ruff a diamond, play a spade to the jack, ruff your last diamond and claim.

Well, are you a believer?

teams has grown significantly.

Says Soloway: "It's tougher to win the Spingold than the Bermuda Bowl."

A major factor in the change, most observers agree, is the influx of top players from overseas. Stars from around the world are regular attendees at the NABCs. Among them are the members of the very strong team from Italy that nearly won the Bermuda Bowl last fall in Monte Carlo. There are also top players from Europe, Australia and the Far East. Most NABCs, says Soloway, will feature 75 to 80 of the top 100 players in the world.

The winning Spingold team last year, in fact, included two Polish stars: Cezary Balicki and Adam Zmudzinski.

In the amazing run of the Nickell team from 1993 through 1999 - the team won six of seven Spingolds in that period - their only loss came at the hands of a squad captained by Grant Baze that included Balicki, Zmudzinski and two other Polish players.

But, says Soloway, it's not just the tough foreign players that make things tougher - the homegrown players are much more polished than they used to be.

"It used to be if you bid well and took your tricks you could win every match," says Soloway. "Now everyone bids well and the systems are good."

"The fields are deeper now," says Chip Martel, who won the 2001 Bermuda Bowl playing on the Rose Meltzer team. "The rounds of 64 and 32 (in the Spingold and Vanderbilt) used to be pretty routine, but now there are many days when more than one top team is upset."

Says Bobby Wolff, an 11-time world champion: "The Spingold and the Vanderbilt have both gotten a lot tougher. The average-plus players now can beat you because they don't beat themselves as much as they used to."

By the round of 16, Soloway says, "there are no weak teams."

He notes that in the round of 16 in the Vanderbilt this spring in Reno, the Nickell team found themselves facing a squad that included Claudio Nunes and Fulvio Fantoni, reigning World Open Pairs champions - and a Swedish star as well. The Nickell team won, but Soloway notes that the top foreign players can be very difficult to play against. Nunes and Fantoni, for example, have defensive carding agreements that make them extremely tough opponents.

Advances in bidding, Soloway notes, have helped many players elevate their games.

"When I started there weren't even splinter bids," Soloway says. He recalls a team trials in San Francisco in 1965 in which half the field bid a grand slam missing five trumps to the king-jack. He remembers that Eddie Kantar and Marshall Miles had a special convention - a leap to 5♣ - that helped them stay out of slam.

Soloway's regular partner these days is Bob Hamman, the world's No. 1-ranked bridge player since 1985. Soloway acknowledges that while he and Hamman are better players than they were a few years ago, they now have to pace themselves as age becomes more of a factor (both players are in their 60s).

"We have to slow down and work harder," says Soloway.

While it may be tougher to win the coveted titles, Soloway says, he doesn't regret it. In fact, Soloway likes the change: "It's exciting to play all these good teams."

Making 12 tricks was easy – the opening lead was a club. However, with a less helpful lead he could try to find the ♥A onside. Failing that, he would have had to guess the position of the ♣Q.

If North leads three rounds of diamonds, declarer ruffs and draws trumps. This reduces the deal to a six-card ending where East has two spades and four clubs, and South is squeezed.

However, at Rosenbloom's table, North cashed two diamonds and shifted to a spade. Rosenbloom now had only one chance for his contract. He took the spade (otherwise he suffers a ruff), drew trumps and led a club, ducking when North played the queen. When North was forced to exit with a diamond, Rosenbloom ruffed and ran his trumps to squeeze South. Of course Rosenbloom was lucky to find the singleton queen with North, but had North held any other singleton, declarer would have won in dummy and then ducked a diamond! Again North had to win and return a diamond, letting the squeeze bite once again.

We misbid the hand to 3NT (though reaching 4♥ is far from easy). On a spade to the jack and king, South returned the ♠8, covered all around. North exited with a low spade and my partner, Eric Leong, alertly ducked the ♠7. Now the spade suit was dead, so Leong emerged with plus 400 for an average result. Note that if North decides to play a third spade, it costs nothing to lead the ♠9, scooping up partner's ♠7 and retaining the lead to clear spades.

Zia made the partnership with Elahmady after his team was knocked out of the top flight of the Grand National Teams. It was only the second time they had played together, the first being in Jamaica in the Eighties.

Said Elahmady of Zia: "He's a great player and a great partner."

Change of plans

The first plan failed, but the second worked on this deal from Bracket 1 of the Friday night Bracketed Knockouts.

I opened 1♠ as West, and North overcalled 3♠, asking partner to bid 3NT if he had a stopper in spades. South complied, and it was up to me to find an opening lead. I didn't want to give declarer a trick with his presumed ♠K, so I tried a low diamond, hoping partner had the ♦J. I didn't like it when partner played the 9, but I felt a lot better when declarer couldn't beat the 9.

My partner, Nathan Glasser, duly returned a spade, and I won with the jack. Next I began to unblock my diamonds by playing the king. Declarer took it with dummy's ace and ran some clubs as I unblocked my ♦Q. Eventually declarer had to try the heart finesse, but partner didn't have a second spade to lead. It didn't matter, though - partner had enough diamonds to set the contract.

Yes, the opening lead of the ♦K would have defeated the contract more directly, but what kind of a story would that make?

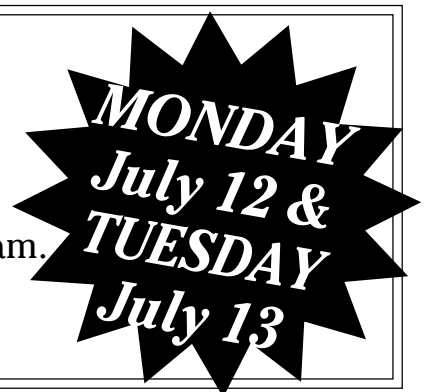
