Kantar's bridge focus changed, but he's still keen

There was one stretch in Eddie Kantar's career — from the late Sixties to the early Nineties — during which he went to 100 straight NABCs. Back then, he played bridge seriously. He was on the top teams in the major events.

It's all different today, so when Kantar shows up at one of ACBL's big tournaments, it's a treat for his fans and his friends.

"I go to places where I can see the city," says Kantar, who was joined on the trip by Yvonne Synder-Kantar, his wife of eight years. Also in town are Judy Seger and Roy Bagdasarian, another married couple. They are the Judy and Roy of the "Home Game" — the light-hearted series of articles Kantar has been writing for the ACBL *Bridge Bulletin* for years.

Kantar is still a major figure in bridge — he is a member of the ACBL Bridge Hall of Fame, he was a member of two Bermuda Bowl championship teams, and he has won 13 North American championships, the latest one in 1988 (the

#23 Ames survives in Senior KOs

The team captained by Tony Ames of Minnetonka MN, originally the No. 23 seed in the NABC Senior Knockouts, eliminated another tough opponent yesterday — the squad headed by John Onstott. They had to come from behind to do it — they trailed by 8 going into the final 16 boards. But they collected 37 IMPs while holding Onstott to just 23 to win, 131-125.

Ames' teammates are John Koch, St. Cloud MN, and Rod Beery and Mary Egan of Lincoln NE. They will play the team captained by George Rosenkranz of Mexico today. On the Rosenkranz squad are Miguel Reygadas, Mexico; Roger Bates, Mesa AZ; Bruce Ferguson, Boise ID; Neil Chambers, Schenectady NY, and John Schermer, Seattle WA.

Kathy Whidden

"I need to get away for a while," said Kathy Whidden of Winders GA. She lost her husband Chuck last year, and it was a major loss. She plans to spend time with some personal friends who have problems. On a happier note, she is also looking forward to taking care of her soon-to-be-born grandchild.

Whidden has worked several jobs over the years, but none has compared with being a tournament director. "The camaraderie and support of my fellow directors is phenomenal. I'm really going to miss all my friends, both directors and players."

When Whidden first started playing bridge in Columbus GA, the club director saw her promise immediately and said, "You ought to be a director."

Ames has been caddying from the outset.

When he and Hughes found out they won, said Ames, "I made sure everyone knew about it."

Asked for his secret of success, Ames said dryly: "Don't screw up as much as they do."

Ames said he keeps coming to NABCs "because of Jackie. It's like an extended family. She's the reason we come."

So she became a club director. Then she volunteered to help with the IN sections at an Atlanta tournament. Edith McMullin was impressed and she asked Whidden, "Want to be a tournament director?"

Whidden's answer was a resounding "Yes!" and that's how her tournament directing began.

Her parents played a lot of bridge and she was intrigued as she watched them play. That's how she learned the game – by watching.

Carey Snider

This is the last National for Carey Snider of Atlanta. She plans to get together with Carol Matthews, her bridge partner from 20 years ago, to reinstall their partnership. And she'll play with her husband Bill as well. But she's going to miss being a tournament director.

"I loved every day of my directing career," she said. "I like the people and I love the directing staff. The camaraderie among directors is such a wonderful feeling. I also love the challenge of making tournaments work right. I'll be leaving behind a host of good friends."

Her husband was in the military back in the Seventies, and he suggested that she learn bridge to better socialize with other military wives. "He's regretted that move ever since," she said.

Her directing career began in 1973 when she started working at a club. Betty Perkins had noticed her and asked her if she'd run the game for her when she was away. Then in 1985, Perkins said to her, "This is silly! Why don't you really direct?" So Snider asked for a chance and she got it.

"PJ (Pat Jackson), Patty Johnson and Kojak (Bill Schoder) were terrific – they helped me so much along the way. Kojak was the one who put me on full-time."

Snider still has a few tournaments ahead, but she'll she put "finis" to her career in January.

Marty Chaitt

"I'm getting ready to make many more mistakes as a player" is the way Marty Chaitt looks at his retirement from tournament directing. This is his last NABC, but he still has one regional and two sectionals to go before calling it a day.

Calling it 46 years is more like it. Chaitt began his directing career way back in 1958. Of today's active directors, only Stan Tench has been pacing the playing floor longer.

Chaitt had two reasons for ending his playing career and taking up directing. The first had to do with his playing ability.

"When my youngest was born in 1958, I couldn't get out to play, so I kibitzed once in a while. One night I was kibitzing Al Roth, and I watched him make a contract that I thought couldn't be made. When I got home I went over this hand in my mind for 35 minutes, and I finally figured out what Roth worked out in a matter of seconds. That's when I realized that I wasn't cut out to be a champion player."

The other reason was money. Chaitt had been playing rubber bridge, and he won five times in a row. The sixth time out he lost it all. He asked Dick Freeman, a tournament director at the time, how he could make bridge pay off, moneywise. "Direct," said Freeman.

Chaitt asked how he could go about that. "Come to Richmond next weekend for the regional and we'll use you for three days." That Labor Day regional in Richmond was the beginning of a new life.

And now Chaitt is starting another new life – bridge player and golfer. His partner in bridge will be his partner in life – Ellasue, his wife for the past 29 years. "I'm not much of a golfer," he said. "There are two things I rarely miss – putts and trees."



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Down 5 sound good? It wasn't this time

This deal came up in the first qualifying session of the Blue Ribbon Pairs.

Board 7 ♠ A Q 4 3 2
Dlr: South ♥ —
Vul: Both ♦ 10 6 5 4
 ♣ Q J 6 2

The auction was very brief – South's 2♥ opening was the final bid. South, when sorting her hand, thought the ♦K was the ♥K, making the heart suit worth the preempt.

West led his club singleton to partner's king, and East switched to the ♦2. West won the queen and ace (East discarding a spade). East ruffed the diamond continuation with the 3. Now it was West's turn for a ruff. East cashed the ♣A (West discarding the ♠10) and led a club for partner to ruff. When West returned still another diamond, East ruffed with the 10 and declarer took her first trick by overruffing with the ace. This was the position at this point:

South tried to cut down on the crossruff by leading a trump. I was all ready, ruffing low and prepared to exit with the ♠K so that I could ruff either black-suit return and exit with a diamond to score all my trumps for down five and plus 500. What a surprise! My partner won with the queen! He returned a club and we collected our 500 – declarer eventually took a long trump.

Could we have done better? Yes! After the hand was over, I realized what I could have done, and I would have known it would work.

Look back to the trick where declarer overruffed my partner's 10 with the ace. Why would she waste the ace if she had the queen? She wouldn't, of course. It could have been a mechanical slip, but that wasn't very likely.

If partner started with ♥Q-10-3, the right play on the trump lead was the king, a crocodile coup! When the king smothers the queen, West can draw all the outstanding trumps and score the fifth diamond for down six and plus 600.

In practice, 500 and 600 scored the same in our section – 14 out of a possible 25 matchpoints. Why so few points? Well, a number of pairs bid and made 4♥ for plus 620! Sometimes they were doubled, and one was even redoubled!

Goodwill message

I'd like to issue an invitation – and a challenge – to all of you. Join me and other members of the National Goodwill Committee in promoting better bridge.

Improved behavior toward partner and opponents can produce better results and a more enjoyable game for everyone. Let's all give it a try.

A different view

The following deal was written up by Matthew Granovetter on Tuesday. My partner, Mark Dahl of Richmond VA, had a different idea on bidding his hand (it came from the second qualifying session of the Open Board-a-Match Teams).

My partner's 3♠ bid asked me to bid 3NT with a spade stopper. South tried a low club, which gave me 11 tricks, and the run of the eight red winners put unbearable pressure on South. This was the position when I played the last heart winner:

North's plays are immaterial. When I played dummy's last heart, discarding the ♠6 from hand, South was dead. If he pitches the ♠Q, I put him in with his blank ♠A to lead into the club tenace. If he discards a club, his queen will drop and I'll take three club tricks. It was a satisfying plus 690, but it turned out to be overkill, since our teammates bought the contact for 4♠, making for plus 620.



Bad trump split

Players in the Blue Ribbon Pairs don't often find themselves in 1-1 trump fits — and it's doubly annoying when the outstanding trumps split 8-3 — but that's what happened to Geoff Hampson in the first qualifying session of the Blue Ribbon Pairs. Despite a silly result, Hampson and Eric Greco ended the day leading the field.

They played the deal in question against Steve and Kerri Sanborn.

With her own solid eight-bagger, Kerri figured she would pass and come in later. Greco, looking at a singleton spade, figured that was his partner's suit, and he wasn't disposed to jacking up the level of the bidding by trying to find out what he thought he already knew.

Steve, looking at honors in the other three suits — South's suit was supposed to be "solid" — also figured South's suit was spades, and Steve didn't see where his side might be going in the auction, so he passed as well.

Kerri started off with the ♠Q, then cashed another high trump before switching to the ♣10. Hampson went up with the ♣A and played a diamond to his ace. Kerri ruffed and played a club to Steve's jack. She pitched a heart when Steve cashed the ♠K, then ruffed the diamond return.

On the run of the trumps, Hampson came down to the ♥K J in dummy. When Kerri exited with a low heart, Hampson misguessed, putting up dummy's king.

The upshot is that declarer took one trick, finishing down eight for minus 400 – not a bad result considering that West is cold for 12 tricks in spades (North is squeezed in hearts and clubs on the run of the spades).

Getting to slam is no trivial matter, however, and North-South can bid up to 6♦ and go down only 300.

Plus 400, it turned out, was worth 19 of 25 matchpoints for the Sanborns.

Counting pays off

Who had the queen of trumps? Walter Fontaine hoped he could find out before he had to attack the trump suit on this deal from the Bracketed Knockouts.

Fontaine, playing in 4♠, got a club lead to his jack. He decided his first objective was to get rid of his diamond loser. So he led a heart to the queen and king, and East shot back another club. He would have been much better placed if he had tried the ♦K. Fontaine took his ♣A and led a second heart. West went up with the ace and led a third club. Fontaine pitched a diamond from dummy as East ruffed with the 6. Now came the switch to diamonds, and Fontaine took his ace. He crossed to the ♠K and got rid of his losing diamond on the ♥J as East followed with the 10.

Then he checked his counting. West had six clubs and it appeared very likely he had four hearts. He had followed to two diamonds as well, so his spade was a singleton. So Fontaine took the trump finesse and racked up his game.

Big winner, and he's not even here

Tournament Directors Bob and Betty Bratcher were in their hotel room Tuesday morning with the television tuned to ABC's "Live with Regis and Kelly."

Every day, the hosts select a postcard with someone's name on it. That person is called, and if he or she can answer a question about the previous day's show, the hosts spin a wheel to determine a prize.

On this particular day, hosts Regis Philbin and Kelly Ripa had the lucky winner on the phone.

Bob wasn't even in the same room as the television, but when he heard the start of the interview, he said, "Hey, that sounds like Steve Skinner."

How do you play it?

This deal from the second final session of the Board-a-Match Teams can be quite instructive.

Let's say that you arrive in 6♠. How do you play in IMPs, matchpoints and board-a-match?

In IMPs it is important to make your contract – overtricks are minor. Finessing the queen gains only once – when the king-10 are onside. So it isn't worth the chance that the singleton king is behind the ace-queen. You should go up with the ace. In this case it drops the king and you score up your slam.

Overtricks can make a big difference in matchpoints, so it seems that you should finesse. You probably will have a lot of the field with you even if you go down. But take a second look. How many pairs will get to the slam? A few but probably not many. So it's important to make your contract again. You forego the finesse and cash the ace – unless you really need a big board.

Then there's the board-a-match problem. If you think your opponents will get to slam, then finesing could win the board if the king-10 are onside. Your opponents probably will do the same thing, so you'll probably have a push. But again, if you think your opponents will stop short of slam, play it safe and cash that ace.

JUST FOR NEW PLAYERS



Smith stays in tune with new players

Priscilla Smith can still remember her days as an eager, inexperienced player, ruffing her partner's ace. "We knew less than nothing," she says.



Being able to relate to new players is one of Smith's strong points as a tournament director – and one reason why she keeps returning to run newcomer games at NABCs.

The Atlanta-based TD started out in Michigan, moving to the South in 1974 with the company she worked for – Scientific Games, which produced the scratch-off lottery tickets. Smith was vice president in charge of production.

One day in the fall of 1980, Smith's office manager saw a newspaper ad for an after-school program for learning bridge. They went and, before the lessons were finished, they were playing in a 99er game at a local club.

"I never played party bridge," Smith says. "There's too much talk and not enough action."

Five years after she got involved with duplicate, Smith recalls, she was recruited to run a newcomer game. At the time she was semi-retired. "I guess I looked like a likely candidate," she says.

She has worked with Edith McMullin, the creator of Easybridge! and now runs her own bridge club, Ruff 'n Sluff, on the north side of Atlanta.

"It's been pretty wild," she says, "but the new players have more interesting rulings, and when you come to their table they say thank you."

Smith is now running 13 sessions a week at her club and drawing energy from the new players she meets. "I'm remembering the joy and fun I had when I started," she says. "It's like seeing the game anew through their eyes."

Thinking Bridge #7

West leads the ♥A. This is a two-part question: (1) As West, what do you lead at trick two? (2) As South (declarer), how do you plan to take eight tricks?

West leads a high heart, hoping partner has a doubleton. Partner plays the ♥6. Is this the start of a high-low signal? In order to determine whether partner's spot card is an encouraging signal, look beneath the card.

In other words, determine if any lower cards are still at large. You have the 5 and 2, both lower cards, while dummy has the 4 and 3, also lower cards. Therefore, partner's 6 is not a signal but his lowest heart.

West shifts to a diamond at trick two and East cashes the ♦K-A and plays a third diamond to declarer's queen.

So here you are; you've lost three tricks and are sure to lose two more, the ♣A and the ♥K. You must find the ♠Q to make your contract. Any clues?

There are clues. Neither opponent could open the bidding or overcall. Passed hands are presumed to hold fewer than 12 high-card points. Remember that number.

What have you seen point-wise so far? West presumably has the ♥A K while East has shown the ♦A K. Each player has produced 7 HCP. What if

you know who had the ♣A?

Whichever defender wins the ♣A will have shown up with 11 HCP. He can't have the ♠Q and pass originally (or on subsequent rounds of bidding).

As it happens, West has the ♣A so you play East for the ♠Q. If East had turned up with the ♣A, you would play West for the ♠Q. Elementary, my dear Watson.

Point to remember: Assume a passed hand has fewer than 12 HCP. If a passed hand turns up with 10 HP, assume his partner has any missing queen, king or ace. If a passed hand turns up with 11 HCP, assume his partner has any missing jack, queen, king or ace.

One technique for digging out an important card (the ♠Q in this case) is to locate a relatively unimportant card (the ♣A). Knowing who has the unimportant card may be the key to locating the important card. It's called a discovery play.

Some tips for new duplicate players

Susan Freeman, who teaches bridge at the Miami Valley Bridge Center in Dayton OH, prepared these tips for her players who are new to duplicate:

- Count cards face down before sorting to make sure all hands have 13 cards.
- Recount after sorting to make sure no card is hidden.
- Decide your bid before you touch the bid box so you don't give extra information.
- Place bidding cards sequentially on the table so all bids can be seen and reviewed.
- Bid in tempo to avoid giving information, which may result in partner being banned from further bidding.
- Ask about opponent's bids only when it is your turn to bid.
- Direct questions to bidder's partner.
- For first lead, place your card face down on the table and ask your partner if there are any questions. This will avoid leading out of turn or being influenced by partner's question.
- Play each card in tempo to avoid giving extra information to your opponent or your partner.
- Call the Director of the game if there is any question about any part of the game and let him or her make any decisions or rulings. The directors are there to help.
- Arrive early when playing with a new partner to decide partnership agreements and fill out a convention card.
- Be sure your convention card is complete, available and visible during the game.

Vanderbilt Knockout Teams). He has dozens of books in print and he writes regularly for several bridge magazines.

The list of regular partners Kantar has had during his career reads like a who's who of bridge legends: Marshall Miles, Bob Hamman, Billy Eisenberg, Paul Soloway, Mike Lawrence and Alan Sontag.

"I've had some great partners," he says. "I needed them."

Nowadays, Kantar has a completely different focus. He's still into bridge big time, but instead of studying system notes and flying off to tournaments, he spends hours each day writing about bridge and adding to his web site (www.kantarbridge.com).

He doesn't play bridge as seriously, he says, in part because "I don't have the patience to play in two- and three-day events."

His last regular partner in the "serious" events was Sontag. "I found that I wasn't playing much between NABCs," Kantar says, "and I wasn't as sharp. I forgot the system at lot. It wasn't fair to Alan."

Kantar maintains an active life at home, playing paddle tennis five times a week, lecturing in various venues and going on cruises. He and Yvonne play in the famous Home Games regularly, and he spends a lot of time at the computer answering questions by e-mail.

Kantar says he gets a lot of inquiries about his book on Roman Key Card Blackwood, now in its fourth version. "I'm still not sure I've got it right," he says with typical modesty.

Yvonne bristles when Kantar denigrates his own game. "You're still as good as the other players," she protests.

He may not be playing at high levels any more, but Kantar hasn't abandoned bridge. "I read all the time," he says. "It's not like I've deserted the game." Kantar even reads bridge magazines in French and Italian – he studied languages at the University of Minnesota.

Kantar may have stopped competing in the Spingolds and Reisingers, but he still knows what's going on in the bridge world, and he can speak to changes in the game. "It's much more sophisticated," he says. "There's much less

guesswork in the bidding, but there's also more memory work, and much more preempting."

Kantar says it's doubtful he will ever return to the kind of play he once enjoyed, but his devotion to bridge has not diminished one iota. "I still love the game," he says.
