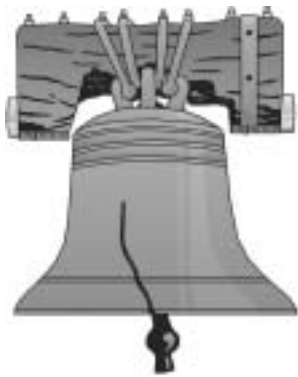

## Kirkhams victorious in Mixed Pairs

Jim and Corinne Kirkham won the NABC Mixed Pairs, but Jay Baum, the ACBL's chief executive officer, and his wife Kathy gave them quite a scare. All four were huddled around the scorer's desk while he posted the final round, and the scorer finally said, "It's the Kirkhams by about half a board."

It was the fourth NABC championship for Corinne and the third for Jim. They won the Silver Ribbon and the Senior Swiss as a partnership, but Corinne also has a Women's Pairs to her credit.

The Kirkhams were 34th going into the final session, but they agree that it felt good all night. "We didn't speak to each other between rounds," said Jim. "She went one way and I went another. It doesn't pay to talk about the hands while you're playing."

"I never want to speak to him during an event," said Corinne. "I'm happy that we finally won a

The new No. 1 seed is Pavlicek, Lee Rautenberg, Barnet Shenkin, Mike Kamil, Martin Fleisher and Bob Jones.

## Quilt memorial brings tears, stirs memories

Like so many Americans, Cheryl Redmond was stunned and horrified at the events of Sept. 11, 2001.

She, too, will never forget the day of infamy – and she is working to make sure no one ever forgets the names of those who died in the attacks in New York, Washington and Western Pennsylvania.

Redmond, who lives in Pittsburgh, is responsible for two of the five 9/11 memorial quilts on display on the fifth floor of the Marriott Hotel during the Spring NABC. Her quilts are part of a traveling exhibit that is making its way across the U.S.

One quilt includes the names of victims of the Sept. 11 attacks. The other is dedicated to the workers at the Pentagon who died that day.

It's a labor of love for Redmond, a retired piano teacher who took up bridge and sewing about 10 years ago.

The quilt project started the day of the terrorist attacks.

Redmond was in Flin Flon, a tiny mining town in northern Manitoba, visiting her mother. She and thousands of others were stranded until planes began to fly again. She did the basic design of the first quilt while waiting in Winnipeg to return home.

Redmond, a native of Canada, retains her citizen-

## En route to victory

The team captained by Richard Pavlicek took over the No.1 seed in the Vanderbilt yesterday by defeating the Jim Foster team that had eliminated the defending Vanderbilt champions captained by Reese Milner in the second round. Here is one of the boards where Pavlicek and Co. made a gain. Pavlicek was playing with Lee Rautenburg, Barnet Shenkin, Michael Kamil, Martin Fleisher and Bob Jones.

Allen Hawkins led a heart, and Fleisher, the declarer, won the jack with the queen. He led the ♣Q, ducked, but the second club went to East's ace. East tried the ♠J, won in dummy with the queen, and declarer called for a small diamond. Foster rose with the king and Fleisher ducked. Foster switched back to hearts, leading the 10, and Fleisher took his king.

When Fleisher now cashed his three good clubs, he caught East in a strip-squeeze. If Foster discarded down to two hearts, he could be endplayed into leading away from his diamonds. If he sluffed a diamond, declarer could win the ace and jack. Either way Fleisher had his game.

## Unusual encouragement

The analysis sheet for the second qualifying session of the Mixed Pairs said that "only a difficult defense beats 4♠. Brenda Jaffe and Martin Hirschman accomplished that feat.

Jaffe opened the ♥K and Hirschman followed with an encouraging 6. So Jaffe cashed a second heart and led a third, won by the queen in dummy as declarer pitched a club. Now declarer had to lose the ace of trumps and the ♦Q was offside, although she could still have prevailed with a backward finesse in diamonds.

Hirschman gave the high signal in hearts because he realized that a minor suit switch would be tragic, enabling declarer to make his game. This was worth 53 matchpoints on a 64 top.

## Methods a must

Simon Kantor dropped by to tell us about a deal where his bidding methods warned his partnership not to bid a slam that was bid by Italian stars Alfredo Versace and Lorenzo Lauria in their Vanderbilt match. "Methods make the difference," said Kantor. "Good methods can enable you to hold your own against the best."

His team — Danny and Jo Ann Sprung, Linda Lewis, Mark Itabashi and Jim Robison — did just that against the fourth-seeded George Jacobs squad. They gained 11 points on the slam and lost the match by only 14 IMPs. These were the North-South hands:

Jim Robison opened a Precision 2♦ showing no five-card major and no more than one diamond. Kantor relayed with 2NT, and Robison's 3♣ showed a minimum — 11 to a bad 13 HCP. Kantor's 3♦ relay got a 3♥ response showing precisely a 3-4-1-5 distribution. Kantor next bid 4♦, which ordered Robison to bid 4♥. Kantor then closed the auction with 4♠.

Kantor didn't consider slam because he knew his diamonds would cause a severe problem opposite a hand with a singleton diamond and only three trumps. His void opposite five clubs also was a negative.

### Use the Alert bar

Not everyone has perfect hearing, so when you are making an Alert or an Announcement, please tap or raise the blue Alert bar in the bid box in addition to saying "Alert" or making an Announcement such as "transfer."

## 6 teams in college championship

Six college teams have qualified to compete in the final of the North American College Bridge Team Championships, scheduled for the first week-end of the Summer NABC in Long Beach CA.

A two-session round-robin is scheduled Friday, Aug. 18, with semifinal and final sessions on Saturday, Aug. 19. The competition, reinstated last year, is sponsored by the ACBL Educational Foundation.

Zonal qualifying sessions were held at ACBL's online site Feb. 22. Fourteen teams entered and six qualified for an expense-paid trip.

## McDevitt spreads joy all around

Tuesday was a very special day for Steve McDevitt of Medford MA. He made people happy at the morning, afternoon and evening sessions.

In the morning he played with Lynette Koski of Pewaukee WI, a pickup partner. They won, and Lynette was overjoyed because the victory made her a Life Master.

McDevitt played with another pickup partner, Curt Merrill of Montclair NJ, in the afternoon knockouts. They won, and that gave Merrill all the gold points he needs to be an LM, although he still needs a few other points.

McDevitt lost his evening match, but that was a happy time, too. Victor Bonini of Lavallette NJ, a member of the team that beat McDevitt, became a Life Master by winning.

What about McDevitt – how's he doing in his hunt for a gold card? Fine – he has earned enough golds here to fulfill the gold point requirement. He still needs 70 more points of any color – “maybe in the summer,” he said.

## Never give up

On this deal from the third round of the Vanderbilt Knockout Teams, Ivar Stakgold found himself in a contract that looked virtually hopeless. He didn't give up, however, and eventually emerged with a vulnerable game swing. Stakgold and Dan Rotman opposed Jeff Meckstroth and Eric Rodwell.

Here are Stakgold's hand and dummy (hands rotated).

(1) Described as a heart raise too good for a preemptive raise but not as good as a limit raise.

Meckstroth led the ♦J and when dummy came down, Stakgold was surprised. There were lots of trumps but not much strength. That was irrelevant, however. The target was still 10 tricks.

Rodwell took the first two tricks with the ♦K and ♦A. He continued with the ♦10 and Meckstroth discarded as dummy ruffed.

What do you think of Stakgold's chances in 4♥? Is he likely to make it? What does he need?

If spades break 3-3, there are 10 tricks for the taking. If spades don't break, declarer's only chance was for West to hold the ♣K Q and the spade length. Not a great parlay, but Stakgold played for his only chance. Sure enough, on the run of the trumps, Meckstroth's hand was under pressure. Eventually, he threw a spade and Stakgold was home with 10 tricks. The full deal:

You can see that it was necessary for Rodwell to switch to a club at trick three, which would have given Stakgold no chance to make his contract.

## Section top policy

Tournament Chairman John Marks notes that when scores are determined across two or more sections, section top awards will be issued to the same number of places that there were sections. In other words, if an event is scored across three sections, the first three places in the section (North-South and East-West) will be entitled to section top prizes.

In stratified events, first place in Strats A and B will be entitled to section to prizes.

## Fire alarm causes brief break in game

Bridge play was interrupted for about 25 minutes Wednesday when a fire alarm on the fifth floor on the Marriott went off about 2:30 p.m.

The entire fifth floor and part of the fourth floor were evacuated, but players were allowed to return after it was determined that the alarm apparently was activated when someone bumped into one of the wall-mounted units. Philadelphia Fire Department personnel told tournament staff that the alarm was activated by accident.

## Deep Finesse to the rescue

This fascinating defensive problem materialized in our Round 2 Vanderbilt match.

Dlr: South ♠ Q 8 2  
Vul: Both ♥ J 7 6 4

This was the auction at both tables. On the ♥9 lead to the ace and heart continuation, declarer won the king and led the ♣10 to the jack and king. He led a diamond to the king, then cashed the ♣A and cut loose with a diamond, won by East's queen. At this point East must play a heart – most effective is the queen. Declarer does best to ruff with the 10. West overruffs with the jack and plays a diamond to his partner's ace to produce this ending:

The defense already has collected four tricks, so the ♥8 forces declarer to ruff with the ♠K or West scores both the ♠9 and the ♠A. West pitches his club loser, then ruffs the ♦4 with the 3 to score two more trump tricks for his side.

were two bridge hands and a bidding diagram on the blank side of the Truscott Card (used to assure that boards are delivered to the correct tables in knockout matches).

It took Rigal a moment, but he finally worked out that it was a defensive problem he had written down during last year's Vanderbilt – at the Spring NABC in Houston! Somehow, he had lost track of the slip, which turned up a year later in Philadelphia.

See if you can work out the correct defense. You are West holding this hand:

♠ A Q 8 4  
♥ 2  
♦ A 3  
♣ Q 10 8 6 5 4

This is the auction:

West	North	East	South

You lead a low club and dummy comes down with the following:

Partner plays the jack and declarer wins the king. The ♥Q is run to partner's king, and the ♠2 comes back to declarer's 9 and your ace. What is your next move? Do you try to give partner a club ruff – or play partner for three spades to the jack, in which case it's important to continue playing spades.

Decide on your plan before reading further.

At the table last year, Rigal tried to give his partner a club ruff, which was not successful. This was the full deal:

Rigal realized, too late, that if partner had started with a singleton club, he would have played a diamond to Rigal's ace, giving him no losing options. A club ruff would have been the only chance to defeat the contract.

## Local couple are 49er Pairs champs

Paul and Marilyn Weintraub, barely above average in the afternoon, put together a strong session in the evening to win the NABC 49er Pairs by less than half a board.

The married couple, from suburban Elkins Park, edged Barbara Albert, also of Elkins Park, and Judith Broder of Jenkintown. After a 134 on a 132 average in the afternoon, the winners came through with a 168.5 in the evening session – easily the best game of the night.

The Weintraubs have played bridge for some time but didn't become interested in duplicate until about a year ago. They were encouraged by their teacher, Bobbie Gomer, who dropped by the game to congratulate the top two pairs, all four of whom are her students.

“She encouraged us to try duplicate,” said Paul. He said he and his wife now prefer duplicate. “We like the fact that we can see how other people played the hands.”

The Weintraubs are financial advisers for AXA, the insurance giant. Most of their work is in the retirement benefits area.

The two have about 20 masterpoints and loads of enthusiasm for bridge. “Most of our friends are playing and competing now.”

As for the victory in the 49er Pairs, Marilyn said: “We've been doing it by the seat of our pants. Tonight, we did more logical thinking.”

Marilyn said she and her husband get along well at the table, “because he taught me. I don't think it works as well when the wife teaches the husband.”

Paul said the victory has whetted their appetite for more bridge, and they're likely to try out a few of the many tournaments in the area. They're already used to winning. Earlier in the week, they came in first overall in a newcomer game.

ship in that country. She became a U.S. citizen in 1993.

She wanted to do the quilt with the names of the victims of the New York City attacks “to do something to bring comfort to the families” of the dead.

She finished the first quilt on Jan. 7 of last year. It took so long because she had to wait as the list of those who died kept changing. The quilt – which Redmond calls the 9/11 Memorial Quilt – has 2930 names, listed alphabetically. It contains 16 photos and four blocks of embroidery. The crew and passengers of each of the four hijacked flights are listed in individual blocks. Those killed at the Pentagon are listed in a block, subdivided into Army, Navy and civilians.

There are separate blocks listing the members of the New York Fire Department, the New York Police Department and the New York Port Authority Police who died.

The names were applied using special copy paper, transferred by a heat press. The quilt can be washed, she says, without losing any of the names.

Redmond says her original plan was to send the quilt to New York City Mayor Rudy Giuliani, but she eventually made contact with Pennsylvania State Sen. Jane Orie, who put her in touch with U.S. Sen. Rick Santorum. Redmond says Santorum was very impressed and made arrangements for President Bush to see the quilt.

The quilt was first displayed at the Smithsonian Institution in March of 2002, the same month she completed the Pentagon quilt.

The quilts were brought to the NABC in Philadelphia partly on the suggestion of Jody Latham, associate editor of *The Bridge Bulletin*, who wrote a story about Redmond's work for the magazine.

Redmond says she has been gratified at the response to her work. “Most people are in awe,” she says. “They stand and look and start to cry. When they see the list, it makes it all that much more real.”

## 2 messages from the Wall of Fame

Quite a few players at this tournament have visited the Wall of Fame at the Bridge Club of Center City. Three walls are covered with photos and messages from outstanding bridge personalities around the world.

Eric Kokish's message was very interesting.

"If you're serious about wanting to improve your bridge, play with someone you enjoy and play against the best opposition you can find. Always go over the boards and always look for the truth with an open mind.

"Apropos of inspiration, I just received a note from one of the people who sends me bridge questions. He's 76, learned to play when he and three of his teenaged friends were hiding in a Swedish attic to escape the SS, got hooked on the game, and nearly beat out the famous Kock-Werner-Jannersten-

Wohlin team in the late Forties for the right to play in the Bermuda Bowl. Just some person no one would recognize, but someone for whom bridge has played a significant role in life. There's more to the story, but I was pretty moved by it as my father lost his wife and a brother to the Nazis."

Here is the message that accompanied Kerri Sanborn's photo.

"Bridge is a marvelous game, at which I've enjoyed tremendous success. It is even more important that I have people who want me to do well when I compete.

"As an up-and-coming player in my 20's, I had the unbelievable good fortune to partner with the undisputed King of Matchpoints, Barry Crane. We became a powerful force in pair games and Swiss Teams both.

"I was reaching for the stars in those days and would frequently become petulant or snippy when I got fixed by opponents who had done something which I considered to be bad bridge. Barry, however, took all these fixes in stride and would say to me that the opponents gave us so much more than they took away. Don't be so upset with them.

"I took this message to heart and decided that if nobody wanted me to win, what good was winning anyway? For the largest part of my bridge career, I have tried to be a lady at the table. This has given me the reward of having people happy for me when I win. That's worth a lot more than a bushel of masterpoints and makes the game so important in my life."
