Patty Johnson advances to National Director

"My work as a tournament director is a most rewarding experience" is the way Patty Johnson describes her occupation. "I'm part of a huge loving family."

Patty is the director who always has a happy smile, who makes everyone at her tournaments feel welcome and respected, who enjoys the atmosphere that surrounds working tournament directors. She is the director who handles operations at NABCs – she makes sure the scores are accurate and she makes sure all the scores get into the Daily Bulletin. "Life without Patty is almost unimaginable," said Henry Francis, Daily Bulletin editor.

And now Patty has achieved the pinnacle of tournament directing – she recently was promoted to the rank of National Director. She also became one of the ACBL's field supervisors with responsibility for the area covering Florida, George and South Carolina.

That makes two National Directors in the Johnson family – she recently celebrated her 20th wedding anniversary with her husband, Karl Johnson. For many years Karl was the chief director in the Midwest area, working out of Chicago. He and Patty have lived in Florida since he retired many years ago, and they're still very much in love. "It helped that we were friends first," said Patty. "Then came that day when we realized that we were more than friends."

What comes to Patty's mind when she reflects on her career? "Winning the Tom Weeks award was special. That showed that I had won the respect of my peers. Being appointed to the Goodwill Committee was an indication that I was doing the right things. And I love running my regionals. There's a special atmosphere that surrounds directors who are working together."

Patty's entrance into bridge and directing was different. Her first husband was a bridge player, and he encouraged her to take lessons. But he was sent to Vietnam, and Patty still was a rank novice. She continued to go to a couple of the clubs in her native Memphis –

Al Levy sets goals as 2003 president

When Alvin Levy takes over as president of the American Contract Bridge League in January, he plans to concentrate on five major items:

- Get bridge into middle and high schools.
- Keep the game in balance at all levels of play.
- Concentrate on promotion and sponsorship.
- Promote all forms of bridge
- Work toward a strong and successful world presence.

But before we get into all that, let's find out who Alvin Levy is. First of all, he prefers to be called Al. He was a scientist/engineer in the field of structural mechanics and material science. He retired in 1998 to play more golf and bridge and to concentrate more on bridge administration.

Over the past 20 years he has served on his Unit and District Boards in many capacities. He is serving his third term on the ACBL Board of Directors.

He started playing bridge in college after reading a book by Charles Goren. "For years Terence Reese was my favorite author and his books helped me discover the game."

Years ago he developed a strong interest in computer bridge. In fact, he was the organizer of the World Computer Bridge Championships which were staged for the first time in 1997. "The two finalists this year, Jack, from the Netherlands, the reigning world champion, and WBridge5, from France, this year's runner-up, played particularly well."

Here is what Levy had to say on various subjects pertinent to the ACBL.

"Here is how I see the present and future of tournament bridge in North America. Tournament bridge is currently healthy and exciting. Its success is due mainly to our unit- and district-level volunteers, who run organized bridge throughout North America (with the exception of the NABCs). It is remarkable that there are so many dedicated volunteers who give back to the game they love. It speaks highly of our game and what it has to offer. Helping and encouraging these volunteers should remain a priority of the ACBL.

Paul Cullen

Tournament director Paul Cullen of Portland OR suffered a heart attack about 11:30 a.m. yesterday in the lobby of the Hyatt Regency and died shortly afterward. He was 53.

Cullen had been scheduled to start a seven-day assignment at the NABC beginning yesterday.

Cullen's wife, Diane, said the couple had planned to renew their wedding vows at the year-end Reno regional. They had been married 27 years. "Paul was looking forward to renewing our vows," said Diane. "Instead, we'll have a celebration of his life."

Diane said she was especially concerned about the couple's two dogs: MacDuff, a Scottish terrier, and Jean-Paul, a Papillon "named after Paul. He called me from Memphis (site of special tournament director training) and said, 'How are my boys? I miss them.'"

Another passion was the Green Bay Packers football team. "He lived and breathed Green Bay," said TD Roger Putnam, who worked with Cullen in British Columbia, Washington and Oregon.

Matt Smith, field supervisor for Districts 18, 19 and 20, remembered Cullen as "a chubby guy, deaf as a post but he always had a smile.

"The best thing about Paul was that he always laughed – and he could laugh at himself. He was just a good, basically nice guy. He'd do whatever you wanted him to do. We'll miss him."

District 20 Director Bob Lix agreed. "It's a great loss to the ACBL directing staff. He will be sorely missed at tournaments in District 20."

TD John Ashton, a longtime friend, had known Cullen since he moved to Portland in the early Seventies and started directing at club games. "He loved his wife, Diane, the work he did as a TD, the bridge players and bridge – in about that order."

Saturday was Martin Coppe Appreciation Day honoring a local player who has contributed generously to hospitality and entertainment at this tournament. Martin, a Silver Life Master, almost lost his life two years ago when he was seriously injured in a car-pedestrian accident near the Scottsdale Bridge Club.

Deutsch led a low club and Truscott won her ace and returned a club. Freilich won her king and ruffed a club. She led a low spade and Truscott played the ♠2 "very smoothly," reported Seamon-Molson.

Just as smoothly, Freilich played the ♠J. She cashed the ♠A and when the suit split 3-2, she claimed 11 tricks. Plus 450 was good for 20 out of a possible 25 matchpoints.

We bid to 4♥ and Bart (North) led a club to dummy's ace. My partner, Bobby Wolff, declared the contract as West. He led a heart to the 9 and king, and Bart shifted to a devious ♠8.

Bobby tried to run this round to his ♠10 but Bart's partner, Charles Urban, won his ♠J and returned a club to the jack, king and dummy's ♥4.

Bobby finessed in trumps, cashed the ♦A K and tried to ruff a club in dummy. Charles overruffed for his side's third trick and an 80% score.

Educational Foundation offers new scholarships

Plans are in the works for the Educational Foundation to administer a new scholarship program for Junior players. The program will go into effect on Jan. 1, 2003. \$50,000 already has been contributed to the foundation for this project. Jayne Thomas will act as liaison between the foundation and the contributions, and she will continue fund-raising efforts.

Any Junior players who teach at least six students for at least an eight-week course (16 hours) will be eligible for a \$500 scholarship payable to a school of their choice. Juniors who participate in this program must preregister with Charlotte Blaiss at the Education Department at ACBL.

The winners of Junior pair events that are a sub-event of the ACBL Instant Matchpoint Game will receive a scholarship payable to a school of their choice.

The winner of the NABC Caddy Competition will receive a scholarship payable to a school of their choice. The minimum is \$1000.

Eugene Kales, Don Mamula and Richard Anderson have been elected to the executive board of the foundation. DeWitt Hudson was added to the board to fill out the term of Barbara Vann, who resigned.

Dudley Brown was reelected president. Also reelected were Barbara Nist as vice president and Geoffrey Cross as treasurer. Kales was elected secretary.

As usual, my son Paul and I weren't quite on the same page for this auction. Paul thought his fourth suit 3♠ bid followed by 5♣ was agreeing clubs. I wasn't really thinking! Anyway, we were lucky to reach 6♦ rather than 6♣ -- lucky because we chose the trump suit that broke. It looked like an easy hand -- ruff two spades, draw trumps and claim. So Paul won the ♥A, ♠A, spade ruff, ♦A, heart ruff, spade ruff, club to the ace, ♦K. This left

He now led a club, prepared to claim if both followed or South ruffed. But South pitched a spade. So Paul won in dummy and led a heart. If North ruffed or pitched a club, Paul could claim. North pitched a spade and Paul ruffed. He led another club. Again, if South ruffed, the rest would be Paul's. South could not pitch the ♥K because then Paul could win the club and pitch his losing club on the ♥Q. North followed, of course, and Paul led the ♥Q. If North had the last trump, he could ruff while Paul pitched or pitch while Paul ruffed. And if South had the last trump, he also had the ♥K and would have to follow. +920 was worth 85 matchpoints on a 90 top..

Haig Tchamitch started with the ♠K, ducked, and continued with the queen to the ace. Declarer led the ♣K to Tchamitch's ace, and he continued with the ♠J, partner discarding a club as declarer ruffed. He led a heart to the jack, and was happy when the jack won -- Minken ducked! Declarer ruffed a spade and tried the heart finesse again. This time it lost! Minken switched to a diamond, won with the ace, and declarer was in deep dark trouble. He led a club, and Tchamitch was able to ruff in with the 8. He once again led a spade, and declarer resignedly ruffed in dummy with the ace. Minken ruffed the club return and the defense cashed two more diamonds for a 300-point set.

Since my partner, Bobby Wolff, was "clearly" marked with values after dummy's signoff in 3♠, I doubled for the spade lead. When dummy went down, I knew we were in trouble.

I ruffed the spade lead and decided I had to underlead in hearts to get another spade ruff. So with fear and trembling, I led a heart to partner's queen. Success? -- not exactly!

Declarer took a few minutes (just to wind me up a little more?) but eventually claimed the rest.

tions for sectionals and regionals. A challenge they face is how to run appealing tournaments that are financially successful in spite of rising costs and a slightly declining membership. The ACBL can help in a number of ways, including encouraging a good working relationship between the professional directing staff and the sponsoring organizations and finding ways of holding down the rising fees charged. All in all, tournament bridge is doing well in spite of these challenges. Of course, if we could increase membership and raise money through sponsorship, we could become a powerhouse.

“Sectional Tournaments at Clubs are growing and should be further promoted. This is a great idea and has helped many clubs and units prosper as well as adding excitement for the players.

“At our premiere tournaments, the three NABCs, we continue to have success. Once again, local volunteers as well as fund-raising by unit and district sponsoring organizations play a big role in the tournaments’ success. Not only do our members and many foreign players come to play by the thousands, but these tournaments are also the venue where bridge business takes place. One challenge at this level is to choose the right cities and the right locations within these cities. Since the ACBL relies on the revenue from NABCs, there is a lot riding on these decisions. In addition, at NABCs the ACBL should focus on the opportunity for good PR and major press coverage.

“It’s important to get bridge into middle schools and high schools. This will ensure the health of organized bridge in the years to come. The ACBL has a major program in place to get a foothold in schools. Also, there are a number of individuals and groups who have generated promotional and teaching material. I see in my own district potentially successful programs in large school districts very interested in using bridge as a tool to help their pupils think logically.

“This objective is not easy to achieve because schools and school districts operate independently. There can be, however, a domino effect if we have some early successes, and the potential payoff is tremendous.

“I plan to put together a blue ribbon panel to look into having local rules officially adopted for some club

play. This will allow club owners some latitude in running their club games. Club owners can best determine what their clientele want and what will make their regular club games thrive.

“At the other end of the spectrum, I would like to see the integrity of the North American championships preserved. This includes smaller fields qualifying for the finals and retention of some form of expert panel to resolve appeals.

“Promotion and sponsorship are very important. Making our game more popular will lead to greater membership and open the doors to more sponsorship. To that end, our CEO, Jay Baum, recently hired two top-notch people in the areas of marketing and promotion.

“As technology changes and Internet use becomes a way of life, there is increasing access to alternate forms of bridge playing, bridge teaching and bridge amusement. Bridge online and web sites enhance the experience of many bridge players and attract new members. Some enjoy taking part in an interactive bridge contest or watching the finals of a major championship event in real time. For others, just playing late at night with friends from around the world is exciting. Many players use computer-bridge programs to amuse themselves and to learn. Many authors now write interactive software that offers a new level of learning experience. All these forms of bridge should be promoted.

“It is important that bridge thrives all over the world and that the World Bridge Federation continues to hold championships. The more bridge is recognized as a worldwide game, the more it can be promoted and grow. I would like to see a good relationship between the ACBL and the WBF as well as among all national bridge organizations. Worldwide cooperation can go a long way in keeping our game in the limelight.”

Millikan had only 9 HCP, but he liked his shape and opened 1♥. After Boye Brogeland of Norway made a takeout double, Castellino not surprisingly leaped to 4♥. Tony Forrester of England wasn’t about to be shut out with his near opener – he bid the spade game. When Millikan pushed on to 5♥, Castellino realized the tremendous potential of his hand – surely partner had a void in spades – so he raised to six. So confident did he feel that he redoubled when Forrester ventured a double.

Castellino was able to set up his long spades, so his side chalked up an unusual score – plus 2070. That was easily enough for a win on the board – their opponents played in 5♥ doubled at the other table.

It takes two

Each player is required to have a convention card filled out legibly and on the table throughout a session. Both cards of a partnership must be identical and include the first and last names of each member of the partnership.

If a director determines that neither player has a substantially completed card, the partnership may play only Class A conventions and may use only standard carding. This restriction may be lifted only at the beginning of a subsequent round after convention cards have been properly prepared and approved by the director. Further, the partnership will receive a 1/6 board matchpoint penalty for each board played, commencing with the next round and continuing until the restriction is lifted. In IMP team games, penalties shall be at the discretion of the director.

If the director determines the partnership has at least one substantially completed convention card but has not fully complied with ACBL regulations, he or she may give warnings or assign such penalties as he or she deems appropriate under the circumstances.

In 3♠, the defense led two rounds of clubs. I ruffed and decided to scramble what I could from the wreckage. I led the ♥J and put in the king, then cashed the top hearts and diamonds, ruffed a heart and led the ♦A from hand. Remarkably, the defense is helpless to stop nine tricks.

When East ruffs low, you overruff, ruff a club, ruff a diamond with the ♠K and have nine tricks in the bag. A slight defensive error actually let me score plus 170 but even plus 140 would have been huge.

Enjoy the music while you munch on hot dogs, sauerkraut, chips and beer.



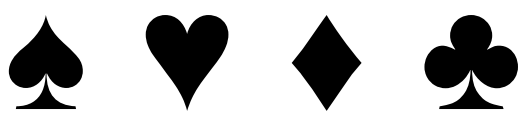
