Francis, Stone named to ACBL Hall of Fame

Henry Francis and Tobias Stone have been named to the ACBL Hall of Fame as recipients of the Blackwood and von Zedtwitz awards, respectively.

The announcement was made by Michael Becker, chairman of the ACBL Hall of Fame Committee.

The *von Zedtwitz award* is presented to individuals who have achieved prominence in the game of bridge and have an outstanding tournament record.

The *Blackwood award* is presented to individuals who have contributed to the game of bridge without necessarily being world class players.

Blackwood and von Zedtwitz award winners are considered full-fledged Hall of Fame members. Francis and Stone will be inducted into the Hall of Fame before the start of the 2003 Summer NABC in Long Beach CA.

Kaldem and Hoenig win 99er Pairs

A pair who met playing bridge on-line competed in their first tournament together here in Phoenix and yesterday won the National 99er Pairs.

Jeff Kaldem of Dallas and MaryBelle Hoenig of Lomita CA posted a two-session score of 220 to 202 for runners-up Robert Lambert and Jocelyn Krug. Only a half-point behind were Lynn Gissler and Virginia Carson. In fourth place, another half-point behind, were Larry Bamberger and Victoria Bamberger.

Like many bridge players, Kaldem and Hoenig learned to play bridge as youngsters, left the game for a time and have recently returned. Hoenig learned to play while in college but quit playing while she raised a family -- she and her husband have five children, all

Eddie Lazarus becomes Grand Life Master

Eddie Lazarus of Baltimore has won enough points at this tournament to become a Grand Life Master. He now has the necessary 10,000 masterpoints, and his necessary victory in an North American championship came in New York in 1968 when he won the four-session Men's Pairs. His partner was Kyle Larsen. He also had a second place in the Men's Board-a-Match Teams.

Lazarus, an engineering manager with the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, is a professional student -- he already has seven degrees and presently is studying for his eighth and ninth.

He has been a member of the National Appeals Committee for more than 30 years.

His favorite partner is his wife Diane (Tiger on OKbridge). She is a Diamond Life Master (more than 5000 masterpoints).

Their son Randy was a member of the U.S. Junior team a few years ago.



Nickell sextet takes big Reisinger lead

They're at it again. The team captained by Nick Nickell, which has been dominant in team bridge for many years, took a 3.5-board lead into today's semifinals of the Reisinger Board-a-Match Teams. Playing with Nickell are Richard Freeman, Paul Soloway, Bob Hamman, Jeff Meckstroth and Eric Rodwell.

All but Soloway were members of the team that won the Reisinger three straight years from 1993-1995. They also won the Spingold Knockout Teams six times in seven years, including four years in a row.

Richard Pavlicek, father and son, plus Rob Crawford and Don Jacob were second. Another board further back were Richard Schwartz, Mike Becker, Larry Cohen, David Berkowitz, Zia Mahmood and Michael Rosenberg.

Twenty-six teams qualified for today's two sessions of semifinals. A carryover formula will be applied to yesterday's scores. The final two sessions will be played tomorrow.

Popper team ahead In NA Swiss Teams

The team captained by Richard Popper will go into today's semifinals of the North American Swiss Teams with a small lead. Also on Popper's team are Lyle Poe, Earl Glickstein, Robert Bell and Jeffrey Goldsmith

In the qualifying they finished four points ahead of Robert Hoffman, Marc Jacobus, Geoff Hampson, Eric Greco and Gaylor Kasle. Seven points further back in third place were Louise Freed, Gene Freed, Derrell Childs, Nels Erickson, William Schreiber and Jeff Olson.

Fifty-two teams qualified for today's semifinals. The finals will be played tomorrow.

111 plus 111 results from triple squeezes

Larry Cohen and David Berkowitz had an interesting round during the first semifinal of the Blue Ribbon Pairs. Their score 111 on a 116 top on Board 11 and 111 again on Board 12, both as a result of executing triple squeezes against solid European opponents.

 It looks like a reasonable contract, don't you think?

With a correct guess in diamonds, it might even make. But we wouldn't be writing about it if 3♥ made. This hand became news when Cohen, North, and Berkowitz, South, set 3♥ FOUR tricks!

Cohen started with his singleton spade, won in dummy. Declarer saw the possibility of getting rid of a loser, so he continued with a second high spade – but

Larry ruffed. He carefully led back the ♣4, showing an odd number, so that Berkowitz would know whether or not to cash clubs. Berkowitz got the picture and won the king with ace and then cashed the ♣Q.

He switched to a spade, and declarer ruffed in with the king. He went after trumps by leading the queen, and Berkowitz took his ace and led another spade. Once again declarer ruffed high and cashed the ♥10.

Hoping that the remaining two hearts were split, he led another heart, Berkowitz winning with the 7. That left this four-card ending:

When Berkowitz now drew declarer's last trump, look at the fix the dummy was in. Declarer couldn't pitch a spade – South's 10 would set up. He couldn't discard a diamond – the defense could take two diamonds. And he couldn't sluff the club – that would make North's clubs good. Declarer finally had dummy pitch the ♦J, but when he led a diamond, Cohen went up with the ace and the defense took all the rest of the tricks except the ♣K. Down four for 111 points.

Berkowitz' 2NT was a bit on the conservative side, but Cohen had enough to carry on to game.

The opening lead was favorable – the ♦10, which went to the queen. Berkowitz proceeded to run off all six of his spades, putting tremendous pressure on West. He had to keep four hearts and two diamonds, so he was forced to ditch both of his clubs. His partner had given him a favorable signal in clubs so he felt a little better about the situation. But now Berkowitz's ♣10 came into play. He led the 10 to East's king, and that set up dummy's ♣Q for the 12th trick and 111 matchpoints..

Bart Bramley, who won the Blue Ribbon Pairs in partnership with Sidney Lazard, wants to set the record straight. He dropped by the Daily Bulletin office because of the article in yesterday's edition in which we told about the last two hands of the Blue Ribbon. It so happened that Bramley and Lazard, second at the time, were playing Chris Willenken and Glenn Milgrim. Bramley and Lazard scored heavily on these two boards to rocket into first place.

"The article made it appear that Chris and Glenn weren't playing all that well," said Bramley. "We made it tough for them last night, but they definitely had the edge on us on the other four hands we played against them. Yes, we played them each day of the event. Want to see how well they played against us? Take a look at this deal."

"Sidney got off to the best opening lead for our side," said Bramley, "and I won the first two tricks with my top diamonds. I studied for a while, trying to come up with the best switch. I finally led my singleton heart. Declarer ducked this as did Sidney, so dummy's jack won. Declarer took his two top spades and ruffed a spade, ruffed a diamond, ruffed a spade and cashed the top clubs.

"That left Sidney with just the king-10-8 of trumps. Glenn led a club and Sidney was forced to ruff. Then Sidney had to lead away from his trump king to give declarer his well-earned game."

New Life Masters

Tony Eckman started the year with only 40 masterpoints, but he did well during the year and needed only 33 more when he arrived in Phoenix. With help from his partner, Gayle Marsh, he reached his goal in the Compact Knockouts on Thursday.

Ken Mercusson and Vincent Zuccarelli of New York became Silver Life Masters (more than 1000 points) in a knockout event.. They were playing with Clare Curtis of Palm Springs CA and Marilyn Harper of Glendale AZ.'

Gabrielle Pani of Mountain View CA became a Life Master in the Wednesday Knockout Teams.

Ruby Campbell of Wichita KS needed 3.18 gold and she got 5.15 in the Bracketed Knockouts. Her partner was Dixie Adair of Rose Hill KS, and their teammates were Beverly Gochis and Helen Brown of Wichita.

Tom Trudeau of Martinez CA has made the grade as Life Master.

Gary Amundsen of Omaha NE finished third in yesterday's two-session Open Pairs, giving him more than enough points for his gold card. His partner was Mike Albert of Omaha.

Thank you, Gabriel

A few years ago, the legendary Brazilian star Gabriel Chagas introduced the bridge world to the ‘intra finesse’ via his Bols Bridge Tip. (Check it out in Sally Brock’s *Complete Book of Bols Bridge Tips*, available from Randy Baron.)

The intra finesse came in handy on this deal from the semifinals of the Blue Ribbon Pairs. My partner, Leonard Helman, and I were playing against David Berkowitz and Larry Cohen.

By avoiding a direct response of 2♠, North showed some values, so South made a game try. West led the ♣4, usually the sign of a decent holding in this scenario, and South won with the king.

Declarer’s first move was to play the ♥J. West won with the king and switched to the ♣8 which ran to declarer’s queen. Now came a low diamond, the plan being to finesse the 8.

West, however, went up with the ♦K and played a second club. East took the king with his ace and played the ♥5. Declarer played the ♥4 and West the ♥3, as dummy discarded a spade.

Declarer won the next heart with his queen, cashed the ♥A and went to dummy with a club to advance the ♦J, pinning West’s ♦10.

It's all in the timing

Joan Jackson and Norman Beck got to a 4♥ contract on this deal from the first semifinal session of the Blue Ribbon Pairs – and Beck had to find a way to make his contract.

West led the ♣K and Beck won dummy’s ace and ruffed a club. He led a low spade and West split his honors. It doesn’t help West to play low because Beck could play dummy’s ♠10.

Beck won dummy’s king and cashed the ♥A K. He played dummy’s last club and ruffed with the ♥9. West overruffed with the ♥10 and cashed the ♥Q.

Now West exited with a low spade. Beck played low from dummy and won his ♦9. He led a diamond to dummy’s queen, cashed the ♦A and exited with a diamond.

West was forced to win the ♦K and – down to the ♠Q 8 – lead a spade into dummy’s ♠A 10.

Plus 420 was worth 107.5 out of a possible 116 matchpoints.

Petra Hamman led a devious ♦2 against 4♥. Keith Garber went up with the ace, played the ♥J and a heart to the ace, learning the bad news in the process. Next he led a club to the king and a spade back, ducking Joan Jackson’s queen. Back came a diamond to Keith’s king. When he led another club, Petra went up with the ace. She shot back the ♦J, covered and ruffed. Now Joan had to lead a heart or declarer would crossruff in spades and clubs, eventually establishing the ♠K. So Joan played the ♥10 and Keith played his queen, catching West in an overtaking squeeze.

If she pitched a spade, Keith would win in hand and ruff a spade, establishing the king. If she sluffed a minor, it would immediately set up a winner in dummy, so declarer would overtake the queen with the king. Contract made!

Henry Francis

Henry has worn many hats during his tenure with ACBL: he has been a writer/editor, tournament director, president of the Professional Tournament Directors Association, president of the International Bridge Press Association – and a player.

He was editor of the *Bridge Bulletin* for 25 years and has been editor of ACBL Daily Bulletins for the last 30 years. Before that, he was a tournament director who earned the rank of Associate National Director. And before that:

Back in 1955, Henry was working as a sports copy editor at the *Boston Traveler*. "I was telling a friend about a hand my father had played the night before. My copyboy heard me and asked, 'Have you tried duplicate?' My response was: 'What's duplicate?' I went with the copyboy to the Boston Y and got hooked by winning my first time out."

He took up directing in 1958 because of heavy doctor bills and started working New England tournaments on the weekends to pay those bills.

His first real directing adventure came in 1964. "I was accused of murder by the partner of a player who died of a heart attack after I gave a ruling against him. There was no basis for the accusation, but Harry Goldwater heard about it and asked for me to be assigned to his tournaments. 'I want anyone who can give rulings like that,' he said.

"On my first assignment in New York, Harry said, 'Get me five appeals this session'. I got him six! One resulted in a suspension for cheating."

Henry and his family moved to Memphis in 1972. "I had worked for the Boston Herald-Traveler for 25 years but the paper ran into trouble with the FCC and was forced to close its TV station. That was enough to put the newspaper out of business as well.

"ACBL was moving to Memphis and the Bulletin staff didn't want to move. Ralph Cohen had the idea of using me with my combination of editorial and bridge backgrounds. I accepted the job because of ACBL's promise that I would see the world by attending all the world championships."

From Memphis to France, China, the Canary Islands, Australia, Bali and points beyond – "It's a wonderful feeling to have friends all over the world," said Henry.

"I met my wife Dorothy at the local bridge club (in Memphis). The folks there made bets about how long we'd last. It's 25 years so far!"

As for the future, Henry officially retired about five years ago but he hasn't missed a North American Bridge Championship since. "Doing Daily Bulletins after 'retiring' gives me the opportunity to see and pass the time with lots of old friends."

of them now grown. She joined ACBL about three years ago "but I haven't played too much."

Kaldem learned to play bridge in high school and played rubber bridge in college but quit for about 30 years. "About two years ago," he said, "I got a computer and started playing on-line. That's how we met. We met in person in Dallas in March but this is our first tournament together."

Both players expressed praise for the I/N program here and for the I/N directing staff. "They seem to be having a good time," said Kaldem, "and they make sure everybody else has a good time."

New Life Master alert

ACBL President George Retek and his wife Mari want to meet anyone who becomes a Life Master at this tournament. They invite all new Life Masters to visit them in Suite 747 at the Hyatt Regency.

Attendance still good

Another good-sized crowd yesterday pushed the table count for this tournament to 10,797 – a figure already well above the original estimate for Phoenix. A grand total of 12,500 still is very much a possibility.

Tobias Stone

Most modern players have heard of the Roth-Stone bidding system – they know that its basic operating point is a solid opening bid. They may know a little about Al Roth – he's been in the headlines a few times in recent years, occasionally doing a panel show at North American championships.

But modernists don't know much about Tobias Stone. They don't realize that Stoney helped make bridge the game it is today.

For instance, Stone helped Roth introduce a convention that is so commonly used today that it doesn't even require an Alert – the negative double. Many of the basic features of the Roth-Stone system have been incorporated into the systems players use today. As co-author of *Bridge Is a Partnership Game*, he helped make players everywhere how important partnership cooperation is. He has authored other bridge books and he also was a regular columnist for *The Bridge World*.

When he married Jan back in the Fifties, he promised her that she would become a Life Master in record time. Seven months later Jan was a Life Master, that fastest to make the grade of anyone up to that time. That's back in the days when the masterpoint awards were much stingier than they are today.

Most players point with pride at any game in which they score 70%. Stone and partner Roth did the unimaginable. At the Deauville Invitational in France back in the Fifties – they piled up an 82% game.

When asked if he ever made mistakes playing bridge, Stoney always said no. He always made an "X" on his scorecard when his partner did something he considered to be a mistake. But if something he did failed to work, he wrote "eij" – error in judgment.

He was famous for making invitational slam bids. Watch out if you refuse the invitation and the slam makes! Watch out if you accept the invitation and the slam goes down! Stoney had a way with words!

Don Krauss remembers one time when Stoney was playing with George Rapee. With six boards to go, Rapee said, "We've got this game won, Stoney. Please – no more psyching." Stoney psyched on every one of the last six boards – but they still won.

What about his bridge playing? He was one of the best. He won two Spingolds, three Vanderbilts and two Chicagos (now called the Reisinger). He also had victories in the Life Master Pairs, the Master Individual, the Men's Board-a-Match Teams (2), the Mixed Board-a-Match Teams, the Men's Pairs and the Open Pairs. All of these triumphs came between 1942 and 1969. He also won the McKenney (now the Barry Crane Top 500) once and the Fishbein Trophy once.

At the world level, he placed second in the Bermuda Bowl in 1958 and third in the first World Team Olympiad in 1960..

Now he eliminates the hearts, cashes the ♠K and plays three rounds of diamonds, ruffing. His plan is to throw East in to give a ruff and discard or to lead away from the ♠K. This time you are unlucky – but next time?
