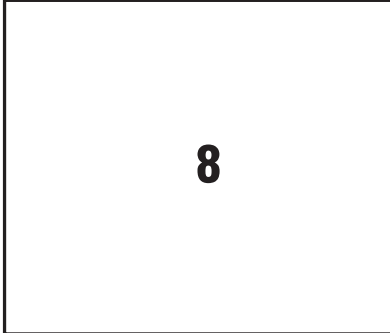

Moss, Seamon win LM Women's Pairs

The first-time partnership of Sylvia Moss of New York City and Janice Seamon of Miami captured the first-place honors in the Life Master Women's Pairs.

An enormous last round allowed the pair to narrowly edge out the second-place finishers, Linda Perlman of West Palm Beach FL and Hjordis Eythorsdottir of Hunstville AL.

Barbara Fellows and Marilyn Hemenway of Omaha NE were third.

This is the first win in an NABC event for Moss, vice president of personnel and administration for an investment banking firm.

Seamon, a bridge professional and teacher, has one previous win in the LM Women's Pairs, one of several major championships.

IBPA names Matt Clegg Personality of Year

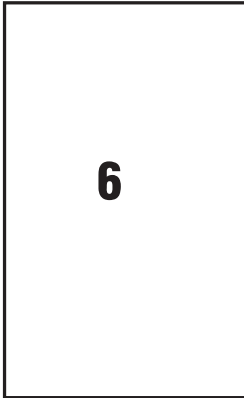
Matt Clegg, 33, who founded OKbridge -- bridge on the Internet -- has been named 1997 Bridge Personality of the Year by the International Bridge Press Association. Clegg's innovation has made it possible for players all over the world to play with far-away partners while sitting at their computer keyboard in their own homes.

OKbridge now has almost 10,000 subscribers from more than 70 nations. Some of the world's leading players use the service to practice with distant partners. OKbridge on the Internet is a godsend for the disabled and the house-bound.

OKbridge also attracts young players who prefer a computer keyboard to a bridge club.

The Fifth Chair Foundation has been created to encourage talented young players on OKbridge by

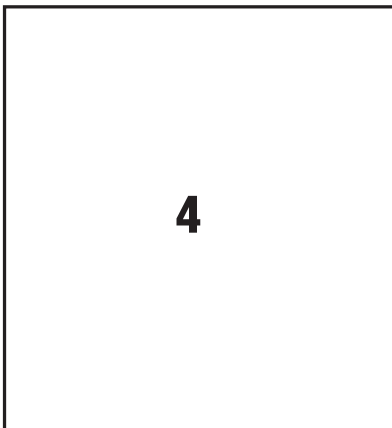

Huge final set propels LM Open winners

With a round to go in the Life Master Open Pairs, longtime partners Jeff Schuett and Kerry Smith stood third in the field. Two boards later, they found themselves in first place, about half a board ahead of second. They had scored nearly 95% on the final round.

The runners-up were Sigurdur Sverrisson and Adalsteinn Jorgensen of Reykjavik, Iceland. Jorgensen was a member of the team from Iceland which won the 1991 Bermuda Bowl in Yokohama, Japan.

Schuett and Smith recorded their first North American championship with the LM Open Pairs victory, although both have been close before.

Said Schuett, of Riverwoods IL, a Chicago suburb, "I've been in every top 10 position except first in lots of different events."

Day trip from Chicago thrills young player

Saturday was a very busy day for Jonathan Zimpler, arguably the most enthusiastic bridge player at the Fall NABC in St. Louis.

Jonathan and his mother Idyth, who doesn't play, arose at the crack of dawn in the Chicago suburb of Winnetka IL and caught a flight to St. Louis -- just so that 13-year-old Jonathan could play bridge for a day at an NABC.

Says Idyth: "I think he's hooked."

It all started two years ago when Jonathan's grandmother, Marcia Essenfeld -- "she's a Life Master," he says -- taught the youngster to play bridge.

"I learned in about 30 minutes," he says. "Well," he adds, "I learned the basics."

Three weeks later, Jonathan was playing duplicate in special tournaments for young players

The absolute top

This hand appeared in yesterday's edition, showing how Marinesa Letizia made 4♠. This time we have a report from Liz Kalb about how her partner, Joan Stein, got the absolute top on the board by making 3NT with an overtrick.

The opening diamond lead went to the jack and king, and Stein cashed two top hearts followed by a third heart to East's queen. She won the diamond return and cashed the ♥J. Of course these heart plays placed quite a discarding burden on West. She didn't want to give up all her good diamonds, so she pitched one club.

Reading the situation with absolute accuracy, Stein cashed the ♠A and pushed the jack through West when East dropped the 10. As a result she took 10 tricks -- four clubs, three hearts, two diamonds and a spade.

A new idea

Something new will be tried Sunday in connection with the Swiss Teams. A special IMP Pairs event will be staged in the evening for all those players who wish to drop out of the Swiss events after the first session.

If you play in the afternoon you will not have to pay an entry fee to play in the special game. New entries also will be accepted, but they of course will have to pay the usual entry fee.

The new game takes the place of the consolation events. It will be stratified.

Any team wishing to continue in the Swiss Teams may do so, no matter what their record is.

Duck soup

North-South had an unusual defensive problem on this deal from the first qualifying session of the Life Master Open Pairs.

Dlr: East ♠10 4
 Vul: Both ♥K Q 10 4

Where West rebid 1NT, the normal sequence of plays would lead to at least seven tricks. At our table, West rebid 2♦, which became the final contract. North led the ♣A and quickly switched to the ♥K, taken by West immediately expecting, of course, the suit to be 5-1.

Declarer then drew three rounds of trumps and played a spade to the 10, jack and king. East returned the ♥8 and West was so shocked by the sight of another heart with South that she ducked -- obviously, covering the ♥8 ensures the contract because the intermediates are good enough to build a trick. This was the ending (declarer had four tricks):

South must play a club, and the only sure way to defeat the contract is for North to duck. If North wins the ♠K and plays a spade, declarer sets up the suit and can get there with the ♣Q. If North wins the ♠K and exits with a club, declarer can play the ♠Q and discard a heart. South wins but has nothing left to play but spades.

If North ducks the second round of clubs, South still has an exit card in the third club when in with the ♠A.

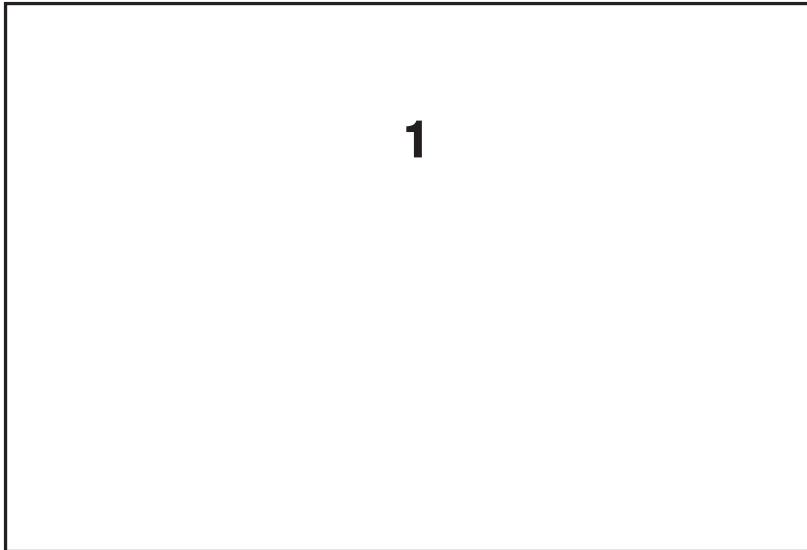

IBPA Sporting Award goes to Lynn Deas

Lynn Deas of the United States II Venice Cup team was presented with the Sporting Award for the courageous strength she has shown for the past year despite a crippling illness. Henry Francis, president of the sponsoring International Bridge Press Association, made the presentation during a press conference at the World Championships in Hammamet, Tunisia, in early November.

This was the first time this award, formerly called the John Simon Sportsmanship Award, has been presented since 1985. It is awarded only when the IBPA feels there is a truly worthwhile candidate.

Francis said the IBPA was unanimous in its selection of Deas. "Lynn has shown outstanding

courage and tremendous willpower by playing top-level bridge while confined to a wheelchair," said Francis. Deas is suffering from myasthenia gravis, an incurable debilitating disease. She is subject to frequent hospital stays. As a matter of fact, she was confined to a hospital in Hammamet for the first five days of the tournament.

Following is the tribute to Lynn that accompanied the award:

The world's top woman player, measured by WBF masterpoints, is the American star, Lynn Deas. In the past 10 years she has won four world titles: the Venice Cup in Jamaica in 1987, in Perth, Australia, in 1989, and in Yokohama, Japan, in 1991, and the Women's Team Olympiad in Rhodes, Greece, in 1996. She also has won countless North American championships.

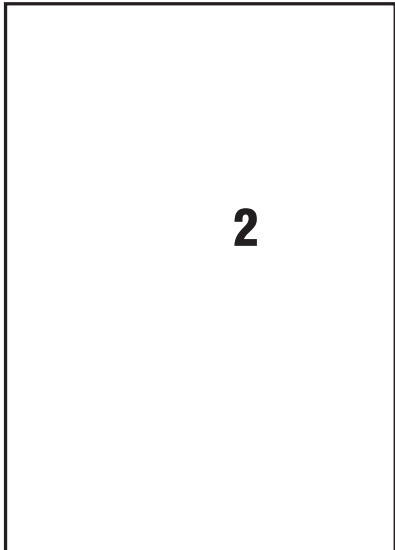
This has been accomplished in the face of a disabling health problem which has become progressively worse during her decade of success. For the past year she has been confined to a wheelchair. She plays bridge, with all her accustomed brilliance, in a horizontal position.

When she arrived in Hammamet, she was immediately hospitalized with pneumonia, a far more serious development for her than it would be for a person in normal health. She was unable to compete until the next-to-last day of the round-robin.

For her dignity and cheerfulness in the face of this heavy burden, the IBPA has named her as the recipient of its 1997 Sporting Award.

Elegance or Utility?

I had the choice of which opponent to squeeze on the following hand -- but one was a straightforward simple squeeze, the other was a complex and exciting criss-cross. Which would you play for?

Board 29 ♠ Q J 10 9 4 3 2
 Dlr: North ♥ 8 7 3
 Vul: Both ♦ 8 6
 ♣ 4

♠ A 8 7 ♠ K 5
 ♥ A Q 4 ♥ J 9 5
 ♦ A K 5 4 ♦ 9 3
 ♣ Q 10 3 ♣ K J 9 8 7 6

West North East South
 3♠ Pass Pass Pass

We reached a sensible spot by a less than sensible route. On the opening spade lead, I hopped with the ace and played the ♣Q which lost to the ace. Back came the ♦Q to the king, and I returned to hand with a club. I advanced the ♥J, hoping that it might get ducked. But it was covered, so I won and ran clubs to reach this position:

When the last club is led, I have to decide which defender to squeeze. If you want to make South the victim, pitch dummy's spade, cash the ♥Q, and come back to the ♠K to catch South in the red suits.

If North is the one you want to make suffer, you pitch dummy's diamond and cash the ♦K. This way North is caught in a criss-cross squeeze.

Since South started life with four hearts, he is a slight favorite to hold the ♥10, so sacrificing elegance for utility, I played to catch South. It wound up being a triumph for sacrificing elegance for utility.

Open Board-a-Match Teams compete for Mitchell trophy

The Open Board-a-Match Teams will begin competing today for the Victor Mitchell Trophy, which honors one of bridge's most colorful characters -- a champion player, philosopher and mentor to the stars.

"For more than 30 years," said Ron Andersen in 1994, "Vic has been the experts' mentor from coast to coast. His unknown contributions to the world of tournament bridge are far greater than those of better known people."

Mitchell, a Grand Life Master with more than 10,000 masterpoints, won five North American championships including the Spingold in 1956 and 1959, the Life Master Men's Pairs in 1962 and the Men's Teams in 1962 and 1963.

He represented the United States in international competition several times. His best finishes were second in the 1964 World Team Olympiad and runner-up in the World Mixed Teams, playing with his wife Jacqui, Sam and Tubby Stayman and Jimmy Cayne.

Mitchell didn't play much in his later years but he was usually on hand at NABCs to see his friends and give advice.

Mitchell claimed that he never played bridge for glory or prestige. "The people," he said, "are more important than the bridge. I've met some of the most fantastic people playing bridge. I've had a ball."

He was inducted into the Bridge Hall of Fame prior to the 1996 Spring NABC in Philadelphia.

The game

Jo Morse didn't want to lead hearts -- clearly West had a holding in that suit. A spade was out -- East had something there. She considered a diamond lead too unilateral, so that left clubs. She led the 7 -- this worked very well indeed. It was covered by the 9 and 10 and won with the king.

Declarer naturally tried the spade finesse, but Marty Schiff ducked in tempo. Next declarer led a heart, and Morse jumped in with her queen. She led the ♣6, covered by the jack and queen, and ducked by declarer. Declarer was forced to win the next club. And now he thought he had a lock -- four spades, three hearts, a diamond and two clubs.

Yes, that's right -- he tried a second spade finesse, and his mouth fell open when Schiff produced the queen! Schiff cashed his other club trick and led a diamond. Declarer actually ducked, but it would have done him no good to rise with the ace -- the communications were already broken. If he took the ace, he could go to the board with the ♥J and take two spades -- but then he would have no way to get back to his hand for the two good hearts. Down one for almost all the matchpoints.

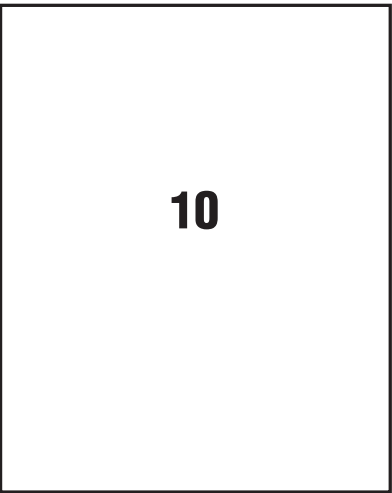
She was elected to the ACBL Board of Directors in 1985 and served as ACBL President in 1993.

Women's Board-a-Match Teams vie for Coffin Trophy

The Coffin Trophy is one of the oldest and most historic trophies in play in NABC competition. For years there was only one "National" Women's Team championship -- and that was a board-a-match event.

Donated by Charles Emmet Coffin in 1933, the trophy was contested at the "Winter Nationals" in the days when there were only two NABCs -- Summer and Winter. In 1963 the event was moved to the new Spring NABC where it was in play until the format was changed to knockout teams in 1976.

For the next decade, there was no national Women's Board-a-Match championship. Swiss teams had become popular and a Women's Swiss with NABC rating was established in the early Eighties. But board-a-match play for women was not dead -- it was just in hiatus for a few years.

The Coffin Trophy was revived at the Fall NABC in Atlanta in 1986 and new life was breathed into women's board-a-match play.

Many experts consider board-a-match the most exacting form of the game. Equal weight is accorded each deal and every trick is important when scoring is board-by-board.

Junior Corps adds six new members

Six new members were added to the ACBL's Junior Corps, the showcase group for the organization's best young players.

The names of the new members were announced Saturday during the reception for Junior players on the day designated to recognize ACBL's young members.

Joining the Junior Corps are Matt Shuman, Richardson TX; John Oakley, Austin TX; Sam Hirschman, Southfield MI; Roman Shapiro, Fair Lawn NJ; Sam Erlichman, Flushing NY, and Kent Mignocchi, Los Angeles.

Aileen Osofsky, chairman of the ACBL Goodwill Committee, presented Junior Corps pins to Hirschman, Shapiro and Mignocchi. The other new members did not make it to St. Louis. There are now 49 members of ACBL's Junior Corps.

Charlotte Blaiss, ACBL's Junior coordinator, announced that the ACBL Board of Directors has voted to continue the Junior bridge camps every other year.

Jonathan Steinberg, vice president of the ACBL Educational Foundation, announced that the foundation has agreed to make \$200 grants to each ACBL Junior who is accepted to the bridge camp which begins after the 1998 Summer NABC in Chicago.

Blaiss said she expects between 50 and 75 ACBL members to attend the bridge camp.

Steinberg said he hopes that the players who benefit from the grant and other Junior programs will repay the generosity by promoting bridge. "Write about your experiences, promote bridge, start clubs at your high schools and colleges," Steinberg urged the youngsters, "so the ACBL can have a great future."

Much of the Junior reception was taken up with a lively debate about the format for the trials to determine ACBL's representative to the next World Junior Bridge Championship, in 1999.

Dan Morse, chairman of the International Events Committee of the ACBL Board of Directors, attended the Junior reception to solicit input from the Junior players as to the format and scheduling of the trials.

Many of the Juniors expressed concern that a trials event might be scheduled in conflict with one or more of the major events at the Summer NABC, when the trials are usually held.

Chris Willenken said many, if not all, the Junior players want to take part in the Spingold Knockout Teams and are worried that they might miss out on the Junior trials if they are still in the Spingold when the team trials begin.

Tom Carmichael said it appeared that the ACBL wants the Juniors to train hard to prepare themselves to represent their country in international events. "Is there a better event to train in than the Spingold?" Carmichael said.

Morse also asked for opinions about the format for the trials, the options being team trials, pair trials, selection by a committee or some combination of the three.

In straw votes, the Junior rejected pair trials but seemed to favor sending two teams -- one the team trials winner, the other selected by a committee.

Morse said the International Events Committee - including Joan Gerard, Nudelman, Cecil Cook, Virgil Anderson and Joan Remy Moore -- will make a decision on the issue during the NABC.
