### Flight A

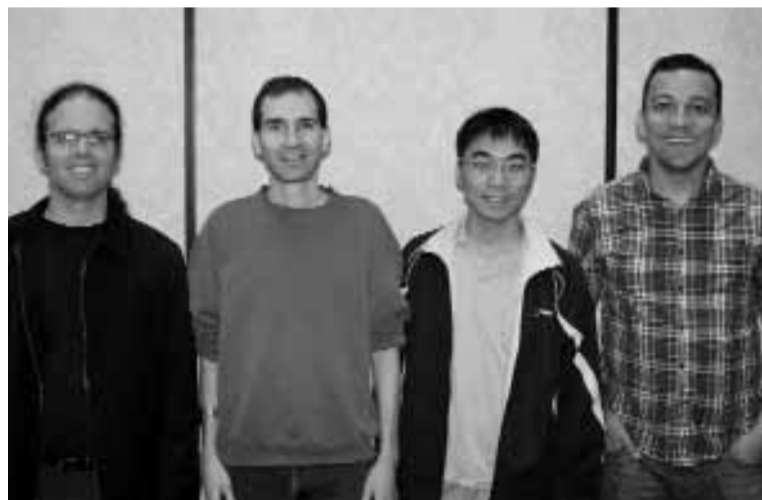

## Today is Mexico Day

Beautiful, sunny Mexico is the home of the spectacular Puerto Vallarta Regional and the Mexican Nationals at Ixtapan de la Sal, not to mention the terrific clubs throughout ACBL's southernmost member country with its famous hospitality.

Although Mexico is home to fewer than 300 ACBL members, it would be a mistake to judge their bridge skill by their numbers. On June 5, an ACBL pair from Mexico City turned in the best score in the annual Worldwide Bridge Contest, the first time a Mexican duo has captured the honor. Tita Abadi and Rosita Castaneda scored a hefty 73.83% game at the Aurora Bridge Club in Mexico City.

In mid-July, Mexico stunned Canada in a playoff for the right to play in the Bermuda Bowl in Sao Paulo, Brazil, in August. The Mexican team, captained by Gonzalo Herrera, was trailing by 48 IMPs with a set to play. They staged a huge rally to win the match.

Great players from Mexico include George Rosenkranz, a Hungarian émigré, who lived for many years in Mexico City and captured many North American titles. His wife Edith, a partner and teammate, also claimed her share of NABC wins. Miguel Reygadas is another top Mexican expert. Ask the typical tournament player to name a famous Mexican bridge player, however, and most will mention Guillermo Poplawsky, the well-known (international!) tournament director who lives in Mexico City and Cuernavaca.

# JUST FOR NEW PLAYERS

## Improving your game – part 1

When I arrived at the tournament, it was already close to game time, I had more than 200 masterpoints and was looking forward to earning more in the bracketed knockouts. Spotting my partner, I asked, "Did you get us teammates yet?"



A look of dismay came over her face. "I thought you were going to get them. I haven't asked anyone!" It was five minutes to game time. Off we rushed to the partnership desk, where we found two pairs available who refused to play with each other. One pair had more than 5000 masterpoints! The other pair had fewer than 50 points combined. It looked like a case of feast or famine . . . but there was a factor more important to me than their masterpoint totals.

I found out that the "feast" pair had no experience playing together, never having met before. The pair with fewer than 50 points had been steady partners for three months. I chose the steady partnership with fewer masterpoints. Two days later, we all had trophies and gold points for winning our knockout event!

Through no fault of their own, many players wind up with no partner (or teammates) for a certain day or event. That doesn't mean they aren't decent players. You can't estimate a potential partner's quality as a bridge player from masterpoints alone. Here are a few suggestions for successfully navigating through the partnership desk's choices:

1. Everyone should have a convention card

filled out for others to peruse. Try to find someone whose card closely resembles your own.

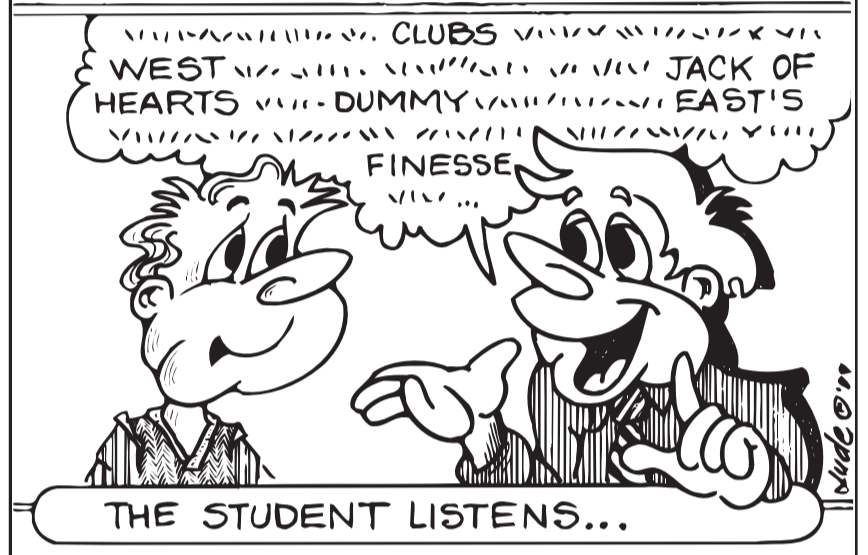
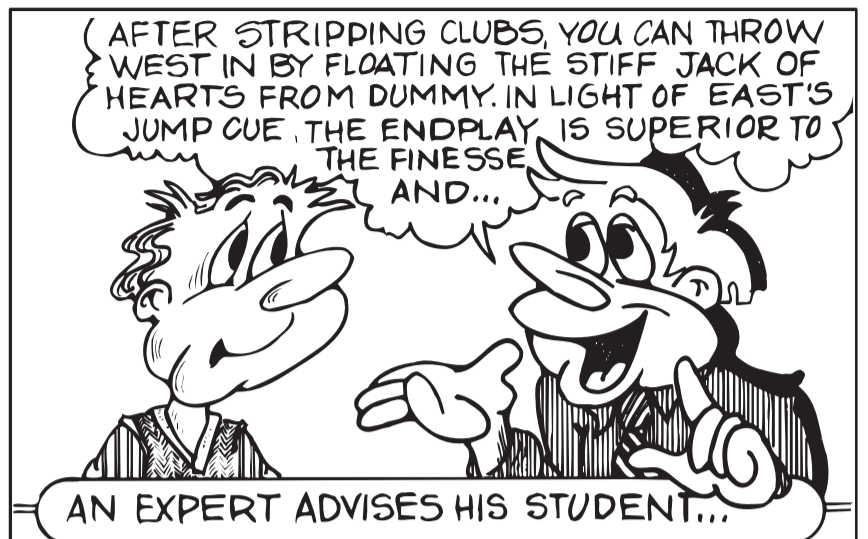
2. Don't exclude possible partners because of a wide disparity in your masterpoint level. I know some fine players who don't have many masterpoints.

3. You might have to kiss a few frogs before finding your prince. Once you do find a compatible partner, get his or her phone number or e-mail address just in case you find yourself in need of a partner again. They could also be future teammates in a team game!

4. If your local teacher or club director is nearby, maybe they can navigate you through all the possible partners available, steering you to one that they think you will do well with. I'm a bridge teacher and a matchmaker!

5. If you do poorly with your new partner, put on a brave, courteous face. Never offer criticism in front of the opponents, even if your new partner asks. "Can we talk about it later?" is my stock answer. Many times my opponents come up to me afterwards, complimenting my patience. I often wind up with many of these admirers as future partners.

One way to find future teammates is at the table! If a pair does well against you and your partner in a pairs game, consider asking them to be your teammates in the upcoming knockout



event. After all, you'd rather have them on your team than have to play against them again.

## Thinking bridge

**Opening lead:** ♥K.

**Bidding commentary:** After North cuebids the ♥A, South decides to give up on a grand slam as it is tough to discover if partner has both black queens.

**Defensive commentary:** In spite of the heart cuebid, West's powerful heart sequence warrants a heart lead.

**Play commentary:** With a certain club loser, South needs to find East with the ♠Q, so the ♠J is led from dummy at trick two.

**Defensive commentary #2:** As East in

second seat, do not cover the jack! When dummy has two equal honors, **cover the second equal, not the first.** Notice the difference. If the jack is covered, declarer wins, crosses back to the 10, sees West show out, and leads a low spade to the 8. You take zero spade tricks. If you duck the jack but cover the 10, declarer wins, partner

shows out, but declarer cannot get back to dummy to finesse you out of your ♠9 4. Success! You wind up with a spade and a club trick.

As second hand, when dummy has a number of equal honors, cover the **last** equal. This is an important defensive principle.

## Bid Box Alerts and Announcements

When using bid boxes, ACBL suggests that players tap the Alert strip and say "Alert" at the same time.

When making an announcement, use the announcement word — such as "transfer" — and tap the Alert strip at the same time.

A player who Alerts or announces a bid should make sure his opponents are aware that an Alert or announcement has been made.

## Monitoring

At this and future North American Championships, ACBL will be monitoring NABC+ events with visible, real-time cameras. The images will be recorded and will be available for later official inspection and review.

By general monitoring of the session and participants' behavior, ACBL has another source of information that may be useful in determining facts and settling issues arising from some types of ethical and behavioral complaints or actions. Please summon a director if a problem occurs at the table.

This procedure is intended to assure everyone that the playing field is level and that misbehavior will not be tolerated.

## Bidding challenge

Normally when you have combined 31 high-card points and a play (of sorts) for a grand slam in clubs with 12 almost top tricks in notrump, you would think the field would have a chance to get to slam.

We scored 38 out of 78 matchpoints for missing slam but playing notrump.

The International Bridge Press Association is always on the lookout for good (and opposed to successful) bidding sequences. So how did you bid this slam?

On the next deal, the point does not have much to do with bridge *per se* — it is more of a philosophical dissertation (I was West).

I know that I'm the world's worst opening leader. I can live with that, but what irks me is when I find a terrible opening lead and I think I've found a good lead. My record is reaching trick 12 in 3NT before realizing that my eight-card suit (which I had not led) would have run on defense.

Here by contrast is the reverse side of the coin. It looks as if I had found a bad lead . . . and yet again I was wrong.

After the given auction, what is West to lead? Rightly or wrongly, I led my doubleton spade. Declarer scored the trick cheaply, but now he was worried about spade ruffs, so he simply drew trumps and claimed 11 tricks.

Note that on a club or heart lead, declarer can play to ruff two clubs in dummy and make 12 tricks. Minus 650 was good for 56 out of 78 matchpoints for us.

## Blockage overcome

As he was too strong for a direct leap to 4♠, North established a game force by bidding 2♦, asking you to further describe your hand. As you held a diamond stopper, the first duty was to bid notrump. When partner asked for key cards with 4NT, you showed two key cards plus the queen of trumps by bidding 5♠.

How do you plan to make all of the tricks when West leads the ♦K? What would be your plan if West led a trump?

### SOLUTION

The first move should be to make a plan based on counting your tricks. You have 11 top tricks: five clubs, four trump tricks and two aces. Two diamond ruffs will bring your total to 13, but there is the issue of avoiding having one of your club winners ruffed. Suppose the full deal is:

♠ A J 9 6 ♠ 5  
♥ A 10 7 4 2 ♥ K J 9 5  
♦ 3 ♦ 8 5 4 2  
♣ A K Q ♣ 7 6 4 2

♠ 7 4 3 2 ♠ K Q 10 8  
♥ 8 6 3 ♥ Q  
♦ K Q 10 9 6 ♦ A J 7  
♣ 5 ♣ J 10 9 8 3

You win the diamond lead and ruff a diamond with the ace of trumps and cross back to hand with a trump to the eight. After ruffing your remaining diamond with the jack of trumps, you must cash the ♣A. Next, you lead dummy's last trump to your king and draw West's last trump with the queen and 10 of trumps while discarding the ♣K and ♣Q from dummy. Now you can claim the contract as you will cash your four club winners followed by dummy's ♥A at trick 13.

Suppose West leads a trump, following the normal practice of leading against grand slams in a suit. Now you will need different plan. Instead of diamond ruffs, you will ruff two hearts in the South hand. At trick two, you will lead a heart to the ace and ruff a heart. Next you will cross to dummy with a club and ruff another heart. Then you will overtake your last trump with dummy's ace and draw West's remaining trumps with the jack and 9 while throwing the ♦J and ♦7 from hand. Next you cash the ♣K and ♣Q and cross to your hand with the ♦A. You will then show your opponents your ♣J 10, both of which will be winners.

## The power of the closed hand

On this deal from the second semifinal session of the von Zedtwitz Life Master Pairs, Eric Leong found himself in 5♦ (not such a bad idea if undoubled, not so hot if doubled!).

Dlr: West ♠ A 7 6  
 Vul: None ♥ K J 8 7 6  
 ♦ 7  
 ♣ A K 10 4

After he had overcalled 4♦ over North's 1♥ opener and I had raised to 5♦ immediately, Eric had to try to make nine tricks.

On the lead of the ♥9, Leong went up with the ace and played a low spade from dummy. Should a defender fall for this? After all, declarer could be 1=1=8=3, in which case the defenders must cash out carefully. So North went up with the ♠A. The difference between two down and three down was significant.

In the Young 0-1500 Life Master Pairs, Rob Brady of Charlottesville VA made the same play in even more desperate circumstances. He was playing with Greg Humphreys, also of Charlottesville.

South led the ♥10 to dummy's ace, and Brady played a low spade from dummy at trick two. North rose with the ♠A, and given the bidding it seems like more of an error than in the previously described situation. North should know from the auction that South has some values – he obviously didn't pass the balancing double on a trump stack.

In any case, Brady earned a near-top for one down (he lost two spades and two clubs), the same score that Leong got one level higher.

## Ethical Oversight Committee ruling

On July 24, 2009, charges against ACBL members Terje Aa, Geir Helgemo and Jorgen Molberg were heard by the Ethical Oversight Committee. The charges were based upon the violation of the following ACBL grounds for discipline:

Improper conduct, a breach of ethics or improper behavior by an ACBL member for which another bridge organization has issued a discipline or sanction against said member. The section may be implemented by the ACBL Executive Committee under CDR.2.2.3 (f).

The players charge were previously disciplined by the Norwegian Bridge Federation.

The committee found the charged persons responsible and imposed a discipline of 90 days' suspension, effective immediately, to be followed by three years' probation.

In accordance with ACBL procedures, parties to the hearing have 30 days within which to appeal the decision.

## Meffley is Grand LM

Richard Meffley of Fresno CA arrived at the Summer NABC as a new Grand Life Master, a rank that requires 10,000 or more masterpoints and at least one win in a nationally ranked even with no upper masterpoint restrictions.

He went over 10,000 MPs playing in a Swiss teams at the Hollister Sectional in California. His partner was Steve Kanzee of Hayward CA. Their teammates were Nick Wiebe of Oakland CA and Jean Barry of Livermore CA.

Cell phones, audible pagers or any similar communication equipment may not be operated or operable in the playing area during a session of play at NABCs except for health-related equipment or by permission of the director-in-charge of the tournament or event.

**For NABC+ events, no electronic devices may be taken into the playing area. More information on the policy regarding NABC+ events is on this page.**

## ACBL bans electronic devices in national events

The ACBL Board of Directors approved a comprehensive ban on electronic devices for all national level events, but not regional or Intermediate Newcomer contests:

*Electronic devices, excluding health related equipment, capable of sending or receiving communication, including but not limited to, headphones, earphones, cellular phones and minicomputers: (1) shall not be allowed in the playing areas, adjacent hallways, restrooms or accessible break areas; and (2) shall not be used during a session.*

*These restrictions shall apply to all pairs, team members, captains, coaches, recorders and kibitzers and shall apply throughout any actual playing session or segment.*

*A violation of this policy shall result in a disciplinary penalty of one full board (or 12 IMPs at that form of scoring) for the first offense. A second offense shall result in disqualification from the event for the pair/team.*

*Kibitzers violating this policy shall be removed from the playing area for the remainder of the session.*

Participants in the following contests will be reminded not to approach the playing area with a personal electronic device in their possession, even if the device is turned off: all flights of the Grand National Teams, the von Zedtwitz, Bruce and Young Life Master Pairs, the Spingold Knockout Teams, both Mini-Spingolds, the Wagar Women's Knockout Teams, the Truscott/USPC Senior Swiss Teams, the Wernher Open Pairs, the NABC+ Fast Pairs, the Mixed Board-a-Match Teams, the Open Swiss Teams and the National 199er Pairs.

## Hard work

Playing in a 4-3 trump fit always seems to lead to a lot of hard work. This deal from the first semifinal session of the von Zedtwitz Life Master Pairs was no exception (hands rotated).

Even though it was difficult to play, the deal did produce an attractive ending to compensate.

I was South and was treated to a defense of two rounds of spades, then a deceptive but inaccurate shift to a low diamond (playing the ♦K and another diamond might have been more tiresome).

East won the ♦A and returned a diamond, which I ruffed. Spades appeared to be 6-3 and East had at least two diamonds, so it seemed too much to expect a trump break. I cashed the ♥K and went to the ♥J to run the diamonds. This was the ending:

As soon as West ruffed in he could do no better than to return a spade. I could ruff in hand and enter dummy with the ♣K to draw the last trump and claim. If West discarded all his clubs on the next three diamonds, I would still take two of the last three tricks for my contract.

# The perfect game

Baseball fans will be aware that last Thursday Chicago White Sox pitcher Mark Buehrle became only the eighteenth player in MLB history to record a perfect game.

Buehrle got a big assist from center fielder DeWayne Wise, who made a spectacular catch in the ninth inning, and then coolly closed out the game.

Many sports have some equivalent of the Perfect Game. For example, in snooker a maximum 147 break, or in Darts a nine dart 501. What might be the bridge equivalent? For sure no pair has ever come close to recording 100% in a Pairs Game. (My own personal best was around 88% recorded in the 1983 Charity Challenge Cup – but then I had the luck to be partnering multiple world champion Sally Brock at the time.) I guess holding your opponents to zero in a team game would come close, but perhaps it should be nothing to do with the scoring and simply relate to an outstanding piece of play.

Hoping for just such a moment, I settled down to watch two young stars from the Netherlands, Meike Wortel and Marion Michielsen, as the semifinal of the Life Master Pairs got under way.

When South bid 4♥, North looked wondrously at her amazing trump holding, but wisely resisted any temptation to go higher.

West led the ♣8, and declarer won in dummy, cashed the ♥A and followed it with the queen, West discarding the ♠2. Now declarer tried the clubs, discarding a spade on the third round and then ruffing a club before exiting with a diamond to West's ace. When West played a spade, East could win and exit with his remaining trump, leaving declarer with a spade loser. Plus 620.

However, North-South had won the bidding battle and they scored heavily on the board.

After the club lead, if declarer had been inclined to take a chance that hearts were originally 3-1, she could have made an overtrick by going back to clubs after just one round of trumps – but that would have been quite a view.

West led the ♦4, and declarer won in hand with the king and played a spade. West followed with the 6 and declarer put in the jack, East winning with the queen and returning a diamond. Declarer won in dummy perforce and played the ♠K, ruffing with a shrug when East followed with an unconcerned 2. Now she ruffed a diamond with the ♥J, ruffed another spade and played a club to the queen and king. East exited with a trump and declarer overtook her 9 with dummy's ace and played another trump. If trumps had been 3-2, she would have been making an overtrick, but when they proved to be 4-1, she had to go one down.

A lucky guess in spades would have seen declarer make 11 tricks in comfort, and as the play went declarer might have asked herself why East had not played a fourth spade rather than a trump after the club finesse lost. Then she could have allowed the ♥9 to win, cashed a club and ruffed a diamond for 10 tricks. As it was, minus 100 was virtually a zero.

7-2-2-2 is a notoriously awkward distribution and when South rebid 4♥, she appeared to have overreached. However, having four top losers is no guarantee of failure. West led the ♣8, and East won and cashed the ♦K, followed by the ace. West followed with the 7 and then the 10 (upside down count and attitude). Now East had to decide which minor to play. A diamond works when West has ♥Q or ♥Q-x, but how likely was that on the bidding? When East did play a third diamond, declarer simply ruffed high, drew trumps and could unblock the spades and reach dummy with the ♥7 to pitch her losing club on the ♠A.

Not too many points for East-West this time.

South's questionable jump to game is explained by the fact that she was under the impression that 3♥ was a slam try. East started off with two top clubs, and declarer ruffed and tried running the ♥7. West took the jack and switched to the ♦9. Declarer put up the ace and tried running the ♥Q. West won and returned a heart for East to ruff. That meant declarer had to go two down. Minus 100 was a very moderate result.

It is of passing interest that if East's hearts had been ♥J 2, for example, then in order to defeat the contract East would have to go up with the jack on the first round of the suit.

To my eyes, it seems odd that conventions such as North's 2♥ are allowed, while the Multi is not. (Okay, I confess I have just co-authored a book entitled *The Mysterious Multi*.) South led the ♥4 and North took the ace and returned the queen. South overtook that with the king and returned another heart. Declarer did well to discard a club from dummy and after ruffing in hand played a spade to the 9. Unlucky! North won with the jack and played another heart. Declarer ruffed in dummy and played the ♠K. South won and returned a spade, but declarer had the rest. Minus 100 proved to be a dreadful result for East-West.

My featured pair recorded almost exactly 55% leaving them well placed to qualify for the final, which they did.

## NABC Insider 4

**The Facts:** The director was called just after the play was concluded. West had placed on the table a convention card that did not belong to him or his partner. It indicated "upside down signals," which is not the method his partnership is playing.

**The Ruling:** Declarer's play was based upon misinformation for which West was responsible. Per Laws 47E2(b) and 12C1(e), the result was adjusted to 4♥ by South making six, E-W plus 480.

**The Appeal:** E-W appealed the ruling. East and South were present at the hearing.

East commented that there were many inconsistencies with what was on the card and the pre-Alerts provided. He argued that South, the declarer, should have or at least could have noticed what were evident discrepancies. If he had done so, he could have asked about the E-W

signals and determined that they actually played right-side-up count.

South said he was just focused on the part of the card pertaining to defensive carding. He noted that it was highly unlikely that E-W had given false count at trick two when he led a spade to the king. The subsequent ruff of the diamond with the club discard indicated two diamonds and three clubs. So, if he knew East also had only four spades, he would have finessed the ♥9 to make 12 tricks.

**The Decision:** There was unanimous agreement that the misinformation was solely E-W's responsibility. Based on the reasoning provided by the declarer, the committee's analysis, and the lack of a counter argument by the appellant, the committee concluded it was very likely that the declarer would have made 12 tricks if properly informed.

The director's adjustment of 4♥ by South making six, N-S plus 480 for both sides was also the committee's adjustment.

The committee found no basis for the appeal. There was no reasoned argument to suggest why the declarer wouldn't have taken 12 tricks if E-W had supplied the proper information. Therefore, the committee issued an appeal without merit warning (AWMW) to E-W.

## More Tournament Terminology

**Side Game Series:** a series of single-session pair games that pay red points. These series include at least three sessions and may have as many as six. You may play in as many sessions as you like, but only pairs who play in at least two sessions are eligible for overall gold points. Your best two sessions are used for determining overall winners.

**Flighted pairs:** When flighting is used, the field is divided by expertise or experience or both into several separate games. Flight A — “unlimited masterpoints” — will be open to all players while the remaining flights will be limited. Flight B might be 0—500 MPs or 0—1000 MPs while Flight C might be 0—300 or 0—500.

Each flight is scored individually, and masterpoint awards are made for each flight.

The masterpoint holdings of the players determine their flight. If one player is quite expert while his partner is new to the game, the pair must compete in Flight A.

In flighted events, you may play up but not down. That means you may play in Flight A or Flight B even if your masterpoint holding qualifies you for Flight C. Conversely, you may not play in Flight B or Flight C if you are a Flight A player.

**Stratified Pairs:** The idea is to compete against everyone but to be ranked only with your peers.

Each pair is assigned a stratum or “strat” based on the masterpoint holding of the partner with more masterpoints.

**Example:** A = 1000+ masterpoints; B = 300—1000; C = 0—300.

Thus, the most experienced players are placed in Strat A, intermediate players in Strat B and less experienced players in Strat C. Masterpoints are awarded for placings in all strats but gold points are awarded only in A and B.

The game proceeds normally — the difference comes when the scores are tabulated and ranked.

In a three-strat game, the scores are ranked three times. The first ranking is done as in a regular open game. These are the Strat A results.

If a B or C pair does well in this ranking, they receive full credit for that performance. It is not all that uncommon for a Strat C pair to place first overall, and they receive the full masterpoint award for that game.

**Note:** A pair is eligible for only one set of masterpoint awards and automatically receives the highest award.

The second ranking compares the scores of only the B and C pairs — the scores of the Strat A pairs are eliminated. Once again, if a C pair does well, they receive points for their finishing position in the Strat B results.

The third and final ranking compares the scores of only the C pairs — all the scores of the Strat A and B pairs are eliminated.

**Strati-flighted Pairs:** The top group plays in a game of their own — Flight A. The rest of the field is divided into strats and plays as in a regular stratified pairs.

There can even be stratification within Flight A. Flight A may be listed as 3000+ MPs while Flight X may be listed as 0—3000 MPs.

**Masterpoints:** the unit which measures bridge achievement in competition. Masterpoints are awarded at ACBL clubs and tournaments in amounts proportional to the size and classification of the event and the rating of the club or tournament.

- **Black points:** awarded at club games. Some special club games award red, gold or silver points.

- **Red points:** awarded for section placements at regional tournaments and NABCs. Also awarded at clubs for special events such as the qualifying rounds of the North American Open Pairs and the Grand National Teams.

- **Gold points:** awarded for section firsts and overall placing in regionally rated events that have no upper masterpoint restrictions.
